2004-05: Completed in 37 games . . . Co-honoree of Ferris State's Blue Line Competitive Award . . . His four-points total was fifth best among Bulldog defensemen . . . All of his season's points came on assists with his first collegiate point coming at Bemidji State (10/23) and was a season-best +4 for the contest . . . Credited with a helper in home encounters against Bowling Green State (2/4) and Northern Michigan (2/26) . . . Assisted on the game winner in 5-2 triumph at Western Michigan (3/5) . . . Turned in a +3 plus/minus rating twice – versus Western Michigan (12/4) and at Wisconsin (1/1) in championship game of the Badger Hockey Showdown . . . Best month was February with two points (0-2-2) in six outings.

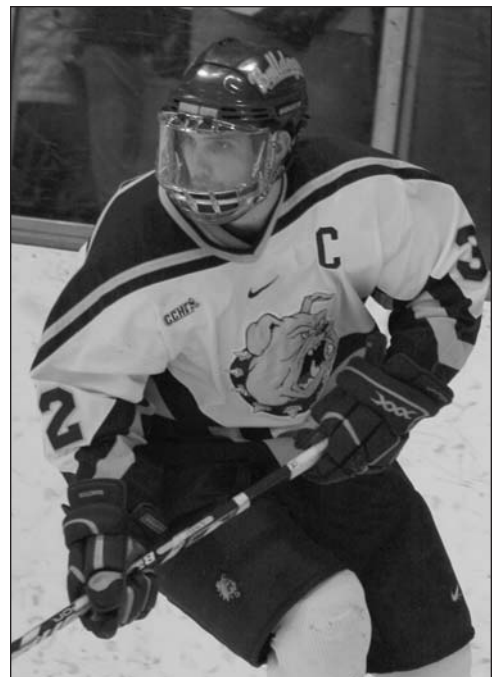
