THIS WEEKEND: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will visit Omaha, Neb., this weekend (Nov. 16 & 18) for a two-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) series versus the University of Nebraska Omaha Mavericks.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 8:05 p.m. (EST) & Sunday – 3:05 p.m. (EST)/Qwest Center Omaha (14,700).

THE BROADCAST: All of Ferris State's 2007-08 CCHA games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the action. The contests can be accessed live via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcasts icon at www.ferris.edu/sports. **VIDEO WEBCASTS:** A live video and audio webcast is available for all 2007-08 Ferris State home hockey games through B2Networks for a charge of \$6 per contest. Just click on the B2Networks icon which is located at www.ferris.edu/sports to access.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 4-5-1 overall and 3-3-0 in the CCHA after suffering a pair of league losses to Bowling Green State State last weekend (11/9-10) at FSU's Ewigleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. FSU sports a 2-2-0 road ledger and is 2-3-1 at home this season to date.

☛ Ferris State compiled a 14-22-3 overall record a season ago, which included a ninth place 10-16-2 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 9-8-1 at home, 5-14-1 on the road, and 0-0-1 at neutral sites for the 2006-07 campaign.

Nebraska Omaha improved to 3-4-0 overall and 2-4-0 in the CCHA to date following a league series sweep of Ohio State last weekend (11/8-9) at OSU's Value City Arena in Columbus, Ohio. The Mavericks snapped a four-game losing string with a 5-2 win over the Buckeyes last Thursday (11/8) and then claimed a 5-2 victory in Friday's (11/9) series finale. UNO is 1-2-0 at home and 2-2-0 on the road this campaign.

☛ A season ago, Nebraska Omaha posted an 18-16-8 overall record while placing fifth in the CCHA at 13-11-4.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 16th season, 243-291-52 (.459) – (6-12-2 vs. Nebraska Omaha – 4-6-2 Home, 2-6-0 Away). **Nebraska-Omaha** – **Mike Kemp** (Gustavus Adolphus, 1975), 11th season, 165-191-45 (.468) (12-6-2 vs. Ferris State). Kemp, who was named the 2004-05 CCHA

Coach of the Year, has been the only head coach in the program's 11-year history. He was a finalist for both the CCHA Coach of the Year and the Spencer Penrose Trophy for National Coach of the Year honors in 1999-00. He was a finalist for national coaching honors in three of first eight seasons at UNO. In 2005-06, he directed the Mavericks to their first-ever NCAA Tourney berth.

ABOUT NEBRASKA OMAHA: Senior forward Bryan Marshall leads the Mavericks in scoring with 11 points (1-10=11) in seven games this season. The 2007-08 team captain is tied for seventh among the national leaders in points (1.57 ppg.) and leads the nation in assists (1.43 apg.) Senior forwards Nick Lawrence (6-1=7) and Brandon Scero (3-4=7) are also among the team's points leaders. Lawrence is presently tied for third nationally in goals per game (1.00 gpg.). Junior goaltender Jerad Kaufman (3-2-0, 2.41 GAA, .897sv%) has started all five games played in while sophomore Jeremie Dupont (0-2-0, 6.04 GAA, .733sv%) has started in two outings. This campaign Nationally, UNO ranks tied for eighth place in scoring offense (3.43 gpg.) but is tied for 52nd place in scoring defense (3.71 gpg.). The Mavericks rank third nationally in penalty minutes (23.6 avg.).

GAMES THIS WEEK

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 15

• **30th Anniversary** – The 2007-08 season represents the 30th anniversary for the Ferris State men's ice hockey program competing at the NCAA Division I level. The Bulldogs registered a 10-24-0 overall record in the 1978-79 season which marked their NCAA Division I debut.

• **The Nominee** – Senior defenseman **Adam Welch (Hastings, Minn.)** has been nominated for the Lowe's Senior CLASS (Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying In School) Award. The award, which was first created in 2001, is designed to honor the attributes of seniors who remain committed to their university and elect to pursue the many rewards that a senior season can bring. Welch is a three-year team captain and only the fourth skater in FSU history to serve in that capacity for more than two seasons.

• **Goal Scorer** – Junior right wing **Justin Lewandowski (Naperville, Ill.)** continued his goal scoring by tallying for the third time in his last four outings. Lewandowski tallied a lamplighter in both games against Bowling Green State last weekend (11/9-10). His four goals (4-0=4) in nine contests this season represents a career single-season high, bettering his two goal output in 25 2005-06 season games.

Lewandowski, who's older brother Phil Lewandowski played at Ferris State (1999-03) and was a member of the Bulldogs' 2002-03 CCHA Regular-Season Championship team, is one point shy of matching his career single-season best five points (1-4=5) set last season in 17 contests.

• **Another Productive Start** – Junior left wing **Brendan Connolly (Canmore, Alberta)** has compiled a team-leading seven points (3-4=7) in the Bulldogs' first 10 games this campaign while notching at least a point in five of those contests. Connolly had six points (2-4=6) a season ago following the team's initial 10 outings.

• **A Season's Comparison** – Ferris State has registered 26 goals in its first 10 games this season compared to 27 last season after the Bulldogs' initial 10 contests. Ferris has totaled 311 shots on goal this campaign to date compared to 350 a season ago. Defensively, the Bulldogs have allowed 24 lamplighters (2.38 goals-against average) this campaign after giving up 33 markers (3.27 goals-against average) last season.

• **Shooting Display** – The Bulldogs have outshot their opponent in five of the team's 10 games to date this campaign and are averaging 31.1 shots a contest (311 total) to the opponent's 27.7 average (277 total). Ferris is presently 2-2-1 this season when outshooting the opposition.

• **Mighty Mitch** – Junior goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe (Almonte, Ontario)** needs 64 more saves to move into a tie with current Miami (Ohio) assistant coach Jeff Blashill (1994-98; 1,666 career saves) on Ferris State's all-time saves leaders list. O'Keefe, who was named the CCHA's Goaltender of the Week earlier this season (10/29), has accumulated 1,602 career saves in 67 appearances. The 2005-06 FSU Rookie of the Year is only the ninth Bulldog netminder to record at least 1,600 career saves.

• **Points Producer** – Sophomore center **Aaron Lewicki (Livonia)** has produced a point in six of the Bulldogs' 10 contests this season to date and has racked up six points (1-5=6) in that span. Lewicki's 10 career markers (10-11=21) in 42 contests represents 47.6% of his career points production. He tied for sixth place among the 2006-07 scoring leaders with 15 points (9-6=15) in 32 games and was second among FSU freshmen.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 16th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2006-08 campaign, Daniels ranked 16th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.
