GAMES 19-20 ▲ 2007-08 SEASON

THIS WEEKEND: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will officially begin the 2008 New Year as the Bulldogs entertain the University of Alaska Nanooks this weekend (Jan. 11-12) in a two-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) series at Big Rapids, Mich. The series represents the only regular-season meetings between the two teams for the 2007-08 season.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:05 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 5:05 p.m. (EST)/Ewigleben Ice Arena (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

THE BROADCAST: All of Ferris State's 2007-08 CCHA games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the action. The contests can be accessed live via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcasts icon at www.ferris.edu/sports. **VIDEO WEBCASTS:** A live video and audio webcast is available for all 2007-08 Ferris State home hockey games through B2Networks for a charge of \$6 per contest. Just click on the B2Networks icon which is located at www.ferris.edu/sports to access.

MEIJER FAMILY NIGHT: Both of this weekend's (Jan. 11-12) home contests are Meijer Family Hockey Night promotional games which feature four game tickets, four sodas and two bags of popcorn for \$32. Meijer Family Hockey Night coupons are available at the Big Rapids Meijer and can be redeemed at the FSU Athletics Ticket Office 24 hours prior to the game's start time. A Meijer Goodie Bag giveaway drawing will be held during each 2007-08 family hockey night game.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 9-8-1 overall and 6-6-0 in the CCHA to date. The Bulldogs claimed a 3-0 exhibition home win over the U.S. National Under-18 Team last Friday (Jan. 4) in Big Rapids. FSU, which captured the 2007 Toyota UConn Hockey Classic Championship title two weeks ago (Dec. 29-30), is among other teams receiving votes this week in all three national polls – *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV*, *Inside College Hockey.com (INCH)*, and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine*. Ferris State compiled a 14-22-3 overall record a season ago, which included a ninth-place 10-16-2 CCHA mark.

Alaska is presently 4-11-3 overall and 4-8-2 in the CCHA after splitting a two-game league series with Ohio State last weekend (Jan. 4-5) at OSU's Value City Arena in Columbus, Ohio. The Nanooks claimed a 4-2 victory over the Buckeyes in last Friday's (Jan. 4) opener before dropping a 5-2 decision in Saturday's (Jan. 5)

rematch. Alaska, which is 4-4-2 in its last 10 contests to date, is 2-7-1 in away encounters this season.

Alaska concluded the 2006-07 season at 11-22-6 overall with an 11th-place 7-16-5 CCHA mark.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 16th season, 248-294-52 (.461) – (19-19-2 vs. Alaska – 11-3-1 Home, 8-16-1 Away, 0-0-0 Neutral). Alaska – **Doc DelCastillo** (St. Cloud State, 1995), 1st season, 4-11-3 (.306) – (0-0-0 vs. Ferris State). DelCastillo spent the last five seasons (2002-07) as associate coach at Nebraska-Omaha.

About Alaska: Junior defenseman Tyler Eckford (6-11=17) and sophomore center Dion Knelsen (6-11=17) are among four Alaska skaters with double-figure points totals this season. Eckford is listed third among the national leaders in points per game (0.94 avg.) among defensemen. Freshman left wing Dustin Sather (5-10=15), who presently ranks tied for 11th nationally in points per game (0.88 avg.) among rookies, and junior center Adam Naglich (2-11=13) have also compiled double-digit points. In goal for the Nanooks are senior Wylie Rogers (4-6-3, 2.62 GAA, .914sv%) and junior Chad Johnson (0-5-0, 3.40 GAA, .892sv%).

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 16th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2006-08 campaign, Daniels ranked 16th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

• **30th Anniversary** - The 2007-08 season represents the 30th anniversary for the Ferris State men's ice hockey program competing at the NCAA Division I level. The Bulldogs registered a 10-24-0 overall record in the 1978-79 season which marked their NCAA Division I debut.

• **Tourney MVP** - Sophomore left wing **Blair Riley (Kamloops, British Columbia)** was named the Most Valuable Player at the 15th annual Toyota UConn Hockey Classic (12/29-30) in Storrs, Conn. Riley registered his first collegiate hat trick in the Bulldogs' 5-0 championship game win over host Connecticut with a three-goal output. All of Riley's six points (6-0=6) in 16 games this season have been on lamplighters. Joining Riley on the all-tourney team were freshman left wing **Mike Fillinger (Grand Ledge)**, junior goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe (Almonte, Ontario)**, and freshman center **Justin Menke (Shamrock, Saskatchewan)**.

• **January Series Openers** - Ferris State is 8-6-0 (.571) in series that start the New Year dating back to the 2000-01 season. The Bulldogs split a two-game league set against Alaska in the 2003-04 campaign (1/2-3/04), winning 7-5 in the opener before suffering a 4-0 loss in the series finale.

• **Move Pays Off** - Junior defenseman **Chris Zarb (Waterford)**, who played right wing in both games of the 2007 Toyota UConn Hockey Classic, picked up an assist apiece in victories over Brown (12/29) and Connecticut (12/30). Prior to his helper against Brown, Zarb had went scoreless in his last 10 appearances with his last points coming at Michigan last season (1/26) on a pair of assists. Zarb also netted a third-period marker in the Bulldogs' 3-0 home exhibition win over the U.S. National Under-18 Team last Friday (1/4).

• **Chupp's Month** - Sophomore center-right wing **Cody Chupp (Big Rapids)** registered a monthly career-high seven points (4-3=7) in eight January outings last season. Chupp, with a team-high 15 points (4-11=15) in 18 contests this campaign, needs eight more points to match his 23 points (8-15=23) in 37 games a season ago. The assistant captain posted seven points (3-4=7) in seven November encounters this season.

• **At Home This Season** - The Bulldogs are averaging 3.0 goals per game (24 total) in eight home outings to date this season while the opposition has scored an average of 2.5 goals (20 total) in that period. FSU is averaging 35.5 shots a game (284 total) to its opponent's 28.8 average (230 total). Ferris is operating at 15.4% efficiency (8-52) on the power play and 81.6% (40-49) in penalty killing.

• **Productive Combo** - Ferris State's top forward line of **Blair Riley, Justin Menke, and Cody Chupp** have combined for 22.7% (30-132) of the team's points production and 26.5% (13-49) of the goal-scoring output to date this season. In the last five games, the trio have combined for 14 points (4-10=14) with Chupp and Menke producing five points (all assists) apiece.

• **Rookie Finds Scoring Touch** - **Mike Fillinger** netted his first collegiate goal with the game-winning tally in the Bulldogs' 2-1 win over Brown (12/29) in a 2007 Toyota UConn Hockey Classic semifinal-round game. Fillinger then picked up an assist against Connecticut (12/30) in the tourney's title tilt which afforded him CCHA Rookie of the Week kudos for Jan. 2.

• **Match Game** - Sophomore center **Casey Haines (Indiana, Pa.)**, who has two points (1-1=2) in his last two outings, is one point shy from matching his five points (3-2=5) in 31 games last season. Haines has presently compiled four points (2-2=4) in 12 outings after tallying a goal at Connecticut (12/30).

- ◆ **BOB DANIELS vs. ALASKA** -- 19-19-2 overall (11-3-1 at home and 8-16-1 on the road).
