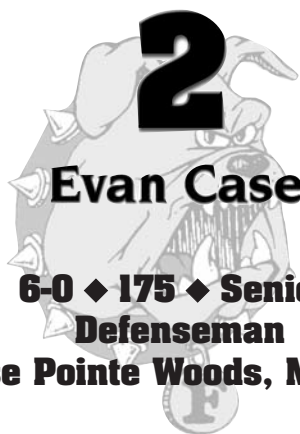

2008-09: One of team's more reliable "defensive" defenseman . . . A solid positional player . . . Has a lot of natural talent and a good sense for the game . . . Saw considerable ice time a season ago and should do likewise this campaign . . . Originally joined the program as a walk-on.

2007-08: Skated in all of team's 39 contests . . . Finished tied for 14th in team scoring with the fourth highest points total among FSU blueliners . . . Named the CCHA's Defenseman of the Week (12/3) with a three-point (2-1=3) series, which included two goals in series-opening 4-0 home win (11/30) . . . Compiled four points (2-2=4) in seven November outings for best month performance . . . Tied for the fifth highest plus/minus rating of +5 among the team's leaders . . . Racked up second-period three points (1-2=3) for season high . . . Recorded a plus rating in 16 contests.

2006-07: Earned both the program's Steve Banonis Most Improved Player and Plus/Minus Awards . . . Concluded the season with a team-leading +12 efficiency rating to go along with four points on a goal with three assists in 28 contests . . . Scored his first collegiate lamplighter in 6-2 decision against Ohio State (2/3) and concluded the game with a +2 efficiency rating . . . Initial career point was a helper vs. Nebraska Omaha (1/19) . . . Posted an assist and was +2 in 5-2 win at nationally number-one ranked Notre Dame (2/23) . . . Credited with an assist at Lake Superior State (3/4) in the deciding game of CCHA Tournament First-Round series . . . Compiled a plus efficiency rating in 12 outings . . . 75% (1-2=3) of his season's points total occurred in league encounters . . . Produced a personal best two points (1-1=2) in eight February appearances.

2005-06: Competed in four contests but didn't register a point . . . Earned a +1 rating vs. Army (10/15) at the Mutual of Omaha Stampede Tournament and at Mercyhurst (11/25) . . . Lone shot on goal came against Alaska Fairbanks (11/4) and was also assessed two penalties for four minutes in the CCHA encounter . . . Received ice time in both games of the non-league series at Mercyhurst (11/25-26).

HIGH SCHOOL/JUNIORS: Participated in the 2004-05 season with the Youngstown (Ohio) Phantoms of the North American Hockey League (NAHL) . . . Coached by Bob Mainhardt . . . Recorded 18 points on six goals and 12 assists in 46 games for the 2004-05 campaign . . . Scored six power-play goals, one short-handed marker and three game-winning tallies while accumulating 50 penalty minutes as Youngstown posted a 27-24-4 overall regular-season mark in 2004-05 . . . Helped lead the Phantoms to the semifinal round of the 2005 NAHL North Division Playoffs . . . A 2004 graduate of Grosse Pointe (Mich.) North High School . . . Earned all-state dream team second-team plaudits as a prepster . . . Coached by Scott Loch.

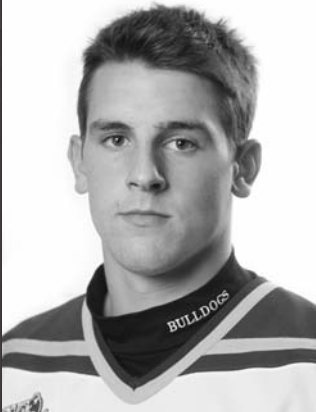

2008-09: A solid "defensive" defenseman . . . Should be a solid contributor on the blueline throughout the upcoming season and also is a proven offensive threat . . . A competitive, poised individual . . . Good one-on-one defender . . . Exceptionally-conditioned player . . . Plays a physical style of hockey but is rarely penalized . . . Makes excellent first passes . . . A powerful skater who can clear the puck via the pass or by skating out of the zone . . . Understands his role.

2007-08: Tied for 12th in team points and was third among defensemen . . . FSU Dean's Academic Award recipient . . . Placed tied for sixth on squad with two multiple-point game efforts - 1-1=2 against Wayne State (10/19) and 0-2=2 versus Notre Dame (10/27) . . . 2008-09: A post-season honors candidate . . . Team captain . . . One of the CCHA's top up-and-coming forwards . . . Has great hockey sense and is an excellent-conditioned athlete . . . An effective two-way player . . . Driven individual who loves to compete and possesses a strong desire to improve on a daily basis . . . Mature and highly-dedicated individual . . . Can play all forward positions and will be counted upon heavily in all game situations

2007-08: Recipient of Ferris' Lloyd Earl Trophy as squad's top points leader and Blue Line Competitive Award (teams top competitor) . . . 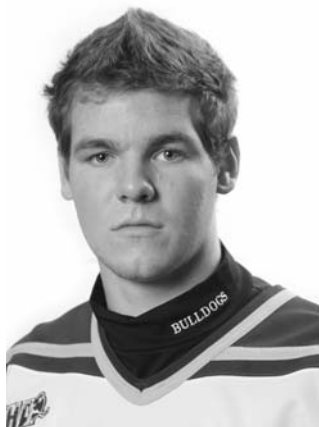

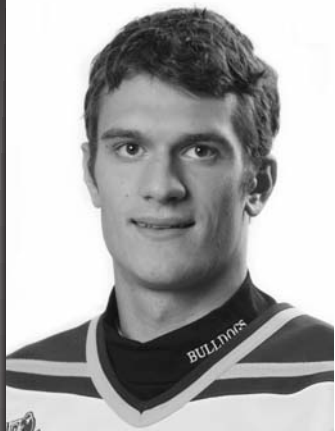

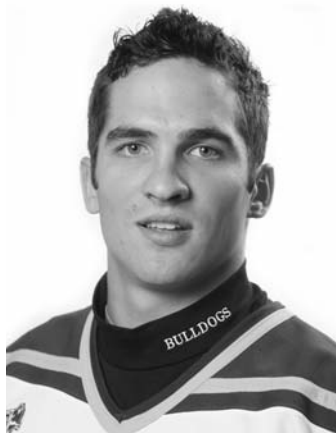
