

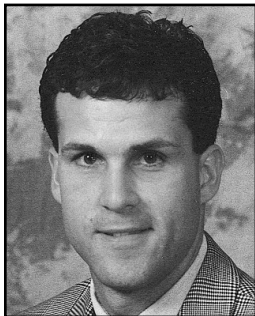
ASSISTANT COACHES

DREW FAMULAK ASSISTANT COACH

(Wisconsin-Stevens Point, 1990)

Drew Famulak enters his 10th season as an assistant hockey coach at Ferris State University.

Famulak serves as Ferris State's head recruiter and through his efforts, the Bulldogs have landed some of the program's top recruiting classes in the last six years. Success has accompanied Famulak on every hockey level, both as a player and coach.



As a collegiate, Famulak played right wing for Lake Superior State University's 1988 NCAA championship

team and for a pair of NCAA Division III champions at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point. His coaching experience in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association includes two years at Miami University (1990-92), where he helped recruit the freshmen class for the RedHawks' 1993 CCHA championship team.

Famulak has an impressive background in fund-raising, scouting, and recruiting at the junior hockey level. In 1992-93, he served as head coach and general manager for the Yorkton Terriers of the Saskatchewan Junior Hockey League. At Yorkton, he coached the Terriers to a second-place finish while five players earned scholarships to NCAA Division I programs.

During his two years at Miami (Ohio) University, Famulak refined his coaching skills and made an impact in the areas of on-ice instruction, recruiting, and video-tape analysis. Famulak was

the bench coach for defensemen at Miami and served as the program's academic advisor. He earned a master's degree in sports organization from Miami in August of 1993.

Famulak played his junior hockey for the Melville Millionaires of the SJHL and totalled 69 points (31 goals and 38 assists) during the 1984-85 season. He lettered for two years at Lake Superior State (1986-88) before completing his college playing career at Wisconsin-Stevens Point (1988-90).

Famulak, 35, received a bachelor's degree in business administration-management in 1990 from Wisconsin-Stevens Point. He's a member of the American Hockey Coaches Association. Famulak and his wife, Cheryl, are parents of two children – Ian (2) and Emma, who was born Aug. 22, 2002. The family resides in Comstock Park, Mich.

DEREK LALONDE ASSISTANT COACH

(SUNY Cortland State, 1995)

Derek Lalonde begins his first season in an assistant coaching capacity at Ferris State and will work primarily with the goaltenders and defensemen.



A native of Brasher Falls, N.Y., Lalonde arrives at FSU after serving the last two seasons (2000-02) as an assistant men's ice hockey coach at Hamilton College in Clinton, N.Y. While at Hamilton, his primary

responsibilities included being the Continentals' recruiting coordinator, scheduling, managing practices, supervising training programs and video analysis. Lalonde was Hamilton's junior varsity head coach and served as director of the program's summer hockey school. Previous to his coaching stint at

Hamilton, Lalonde held the same position title at Lebanon Valley College in Annville, Pa., from August 1998 through July 2000. He assisted with the establishment of the NCAA Division II-III's men's ice hockey program from its inception and in the 1998-99 season, the team registered an 19-6-1 record in the program's first year of existence. The Flying Dutchmen also captured the Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) Northeast Championship and qualified for the NCAA Division III National Tournament in the program's third year of existence. From 1995-98, Lalonde was a graduate assistant coach at the Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts in North Adams, Mass. He also coached at a Prospects Camp for 16-year olds in Mississauga, Ontario while being a member of the selection committee for the Empire State Games and the New York State Select 16/17-year old group.

As a collegian, Lalonde was a four-year member (1990-95) of SUNY Cortland State University's men's ice hockey team. He was the recipient of the team's Red Letter Award in

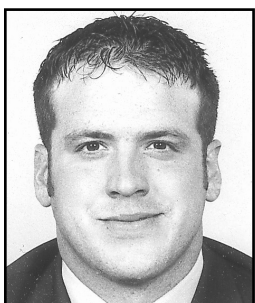
recognition of being selected the Red Dragons' Most Valuable Player during his senior season in 1994-95 and concluded his career as the program's holder of four goaltending records. Lalonde graduated in 1995 from SUNY Cortland State with a bachelor of science degree in education and went on to earn a master's degree in Higher Education Administration from Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts in 1998.

Lalonde, a 1990 graduate of St. Lawrence Central High School in Brasher Falls, N.Y., was a standout athlete in hockey, football and baseball. A two-time team Most Valuable Player and first-team All-Northern Athletic Conference goaltender in hockey, Lalonde was an all-league second-team pick at quarterback in football and earned first-team all-conference kudos in baseball as a senior.

The son of Donna and Jack Lalonde, Derek is a member of the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) and resides in Mecosta, Mich. An avid runner, Lalonde (30) competed in the 1997 Boston Marathon.

TIM BLASHILL VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH

The Ferris State hockey staff is solidified with the return of volunteer assistant



coach Tim Blashill, the younger brother of current Miami (Ohio) assistant coach Jeff Blashill, for the third straight season.

Blashill, whose duties include both on-and off-ice activities, serves as

the video and statistician coordinator for the Ferris State hockey program. This season will also mark his first as the coordinator for the Big Rapids (Mich.) Youth Hockey Association.

The Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., native arrived to Ferris State following a four-year (1996-2000) collegiate playing career at Fredonia (N.Y.) State. In his career, the Blue Devil defenseman registered two points (assists) along with 80 penalties for 211 minutes in 59 outings. He notched an assist apiece in the 1996-97 and 1997-98 seasons.

Prior to attending Fredonia State, Blashill played in the junior hockey ranks for the

Indianapolis (Ind.) Ice of the North American Hockey League (NAHL) during the 1994-95 campaign. Following that season, Blashill played the 1995-96 campaign with the Sault Ste. Marie (Mich.) Indians of the NAHL.

A 1994 graduate of Sault Area High School in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., Blashill competed in ice hockey, football and baseball. He received Most Valuable Defenseman accolades in hockey during his senior season.

Blashill, 26, is presently pursuing a bachelor's degree in history at FSU.
