FERRIS STATE BEGINS CCHA PLAY THIS WEEKEND WITH TWO-GAME HOME SET

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will begin Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) play this weekend (Oct. 18-19) as the Bulldogs entertain the Bowling Green State University Falcons in a two-game series at Big Rapids, Mich.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday - 7:35 p.m. (EDT) & Saturday - 7:05 p.m. (EDT)/R.L. Ewigleben Ice (pronounced A-VAH-glave-in) Arena (2,493).

FSU TICKET INFORMATION: Tickets for all 2002-03 FSU home games are available by contacting the R.L. Ewigleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday - 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (EST) and Saturday (home games only) - 12 to 5 p.m.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State presently stands at 1-1 overall and is 0-0 in the CCHA after splitting a non-league series with 10th-ranked St. Cloud State last weekend (Oct. 11-12) at FSU's Ewigleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs dropped a 2-1 decision in last Friday's (Oct. 11) season opener but then bounced back to post a 6-3 victory in Saturday's (Oct. 12) rematch.

◆ Last season, Ferris State compiled a 15-20-1 overall record and placed ninth in the CCHA with a 12-15-1 league mark. FSU was 10-6-0 at home, 5-13-1 on the road, and 0-1-0 at neutral sites.

Bowling Green State is 1-3-0 overall and 0-2-0 in the CCHA following a pair of league losses to Western Michigan last weekend (Oct. 11-12). The Falcons, who have dropped three straight to date, suffered a 6-5 overtime defeat to WMU last Friday (Oct. 11) at the BGSU Ice Arena in Bowling Green, Ohio. Bowling Green State then came out on the short end of a 3-2 loss to the Broncos in Saturday's (Oct. 12) finale at WMU's Lawson Ice Arena in Kalamazoo, Mich.

◆ Bowling Green State concluded the 2001-02 campaign at 9-25-6 overall and 7-18-3 (11th place) in the CCHA. The Falcons were 4-13-2 on the road, 5-9-3 at home and 0-3-1 at neutral sites.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS: The sixth coach in the program's history, Daniels became FSU's winningest coach following a 7-0 regular-season finale (3/4/00) win at Western Michigan to

surpass the program's inaugural coach Rick Duffett (1975-82; 119-83-7). Daniels presently is first among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins (110) and CCHA Tourney victories (five).

THE COACHES: Ferris State - **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 11th season, 150-198-32 (.437) - (13-14-4 vs. Bowling Green State - Home 8-4-2, Away-5-10-2, Neutral-0-0-0).

Bowling Green State - Scott Paluch (Bowling Green State, 1991), 1st season, 1-3-0 (.250) - (0-0-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT BOWLING GREEN STATE: The Falcons, who lost four of their top scorers from a season ago are presently paced in scoring this season by sophomore forward Steve Brudzewski (3-2-5) and junior forward Mark Wires (3-1-4). Junior forward D'Arcy McConvey (0-1-1) is BGSU's top returning scorer from last year and finished second among the team's top point getters last winter. In goal, senior Tyler Masters (1-2-0, 3.00 GAA, .921sv%) has competed in three contests while sophomore Jordan Sigalet (0-1-0, 3.04 GAA, .889sv%) has one appearance in net.

BULLDOG BITES: This campaign marks the 25th anniversary season at the NCAA Division I level and the Ferris has compiled a 372-471-77 overall record (.446) since 1978-79 . . . The Bulldogs are 8-13-2 in CCHA openers (4-5-2 at home) dating back to 1979-90 and is 14-29-3 in CCHA series openers during that period. FSU is 7-16-3 at home in league-opening two-game sets . . . Sophomore goalie **Mike Brown's (Calgary, Alta.)** 39 saves versus St. Cloud State in last Friday's season opener represented a career high, topping his previous best of 38 saves at Michigan State (10/20/01). He has made 30 or more saves in a game seven times in 27 career appearances . . . Senior left wing **Chris Kunitz (Regina, Sask.)** needs four more goals to tie Randy Strong (1978-82) for ninth place among FSU's all-time goal-scoring leaders. Kunitz has recorded 65 goals in 112 career games and is also three points (65-32-97) shy of notching his 100th career point . . . Ferris' next four games are versus CCHA cluster opponents - Bowling Green State (10/18-19) and at Notre Dame (10/25-26). FSU went 4-8-0 against its cluster foes last season (Ohio State 2-2-0, Miami 1-3-0 and Michigan State 1-3-0).

ALL-AMERICA CANDIDATE: Chris Kunitz, who earned All-CCHA First-Team honors last season as a result of scoring a league-high 25 goals, is a candidate for 2002-03 All-America honors. A season ago, he totaled a career-high 38 points on a career-best 28 goals and 10 assists in 35 games. A two-time CCHA Offensive Player-of-the-Week selection last winter, Kunitz ranked fourth nationally in goals (0.80 gpg) and tied for fourth in game-winning goals (six).

BROWN RECEIVES HONOR: Mike Brown has been named this week's CCHA Defensive Player-of-the-Week for his performance vs. St. Cloud State. Brown, a 2001-02 CCHA All-Rookie Team honoree, blocked 74 of 79 shots for a .940 save percentage last weekend. He posted a personal career-high 39 saves in the series' opener and then turned aside 35 shots in Saturday's contest.
