FIRST-PLACE FERRIS STATE RETURNS TO THE ICE AGAINST MICHIGAN STATE

THIS WEEK: The nationally-ranked Ferris State University men's ice hockey team returns to the ice this weekend (Dec. 6-7) for a Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) home-and-home series against the Michigan State University Spartans. This Friday's (Dec. 6) contest will be held in Big Rapids, Mich., with Saturday's (Dec. 7) outing taking place in East Lansing, Mich. The series is the only regular-season meeting between the teams in 2002-03.

FSU TICKET INFORMATION: Tickets for all 2002-03 FSU home games are available by contacting the Ewigleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday - 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (EST) and Saturday (home games only) - 12 to 5 p.m.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State, which was idle this last weekend, improved to 11-3-0 overall and 9-1-0 in the CCHA two weeks ago (Nov. 22-23) with a league series sweep of Ohio State at FSU's Ewigleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. FSU won 4-2 and 2-1 in overtime against the Buckeyes. The Bulldogs presently rank ninth this week in the *U.S. College Hockey Online*, *Inside College Hockey.com* and *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* polls. FSU is 7-2-0 at home and 4-1-0 on the road this campaign.

● Ferris State was 15-20-1 overall and placed ninth in the CCHA at 12-15-1 a season ago.

Michigan State stands at 6-6-1 overall and is 3-4-0 in the CCHA following a 1-0-1 performance in last weekend's (Nov. 29-30) College Hockey Showcase series. The Spartans skated to a 5-5 overtime tie with Minnesota last Friday (Nov. 29) at UM's Mariucci Arena in Minneapolis, Minn. MSU then snapped its four-game (0-3-1) winless skid with a 2-1 overtime triumph over Wisconsin Saturday (Nov. 30) at UW's Kohl Center in Madison, Wis. The Spartans are 2-4-1 in away contests and 3-1-0 at home this season.

● Michigan State was 27-9-5 overall and 18-6-4 in the CCHA (second place) last season.

BOB DANIELS: The sixth head coach in the program's history, Daniels became FSU's win-

ningest coach following a 7-0 regular-season finale (3/4/00) win at Western Michigan to surpass the program's inaugural coach Rick Duffett (1975-82; 119-83-7). Daniels ranks first among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 117-150-29 (.444) league mark.

THE COACHES: Ferris State - Bob Daniels (Michigan State, 1982), 11th season, 160-200-32 (.449) - (7-22-5 vs. Michigan State - Home 1-8-4, Away 5-13-0, Neutral 1-1-1). **Michigan State - Rick Comley** (Lake Superior State, 1972), 1st season, 6-6-1 (.500); Career: 30th season, 603-481-72 (.553) - (35-13-2 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT MICHIGAN STATE: The Spartans have four double-digit point scorers with sophomore forward Jim Slater (5-7-12) leading the way. Senior defenseman Brad Fast (6-5-11) and John-Michael Liles (3-8-11) along with frosh forward David Booth (5-6-11) have cracked the double-figure scoring column this season. Sophomore Matt Magliaccio (5-3-1, 2.21 GAA, .925sv%) is the primary goaltender.

BULLDOG BITES: Sophomore goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)** is one win away from tying Marc Felicio (1987-91) and Glenn Raeburn (1985-87) for 10th place among Ferris' all-time winningest netminers. Brown owns a career 21-16-0 career mark in 39 games . . . FSU's 11-3-0 overall record represents its second best mark in the program's history following its first 14 games of a season. The 1979-80 squad registered a 12-2-0 mark overall . . . Ferris is operating at 23.3% (17-73) on the power play through 14 outings and has posted an 88.2% (60-68) rating in penalty-kill situations. Last season over the same period, the Bulldogs were 12.0% (10-83) in power-play chances and 85.4% (82-96) on the penalty kill . . . Excluding goalies, 17 players on the Bulldogs' 22-man roster have a plus rating led by senior left wing

Chris Kunitz (+17), sophomore right wing **Derek Nesbitt (+16)**, sophomore center **Jeff Legue (+15)** and junior defenseman **Simon Mangos (+15)** . . . **Chris Kunitz**, who has 121 career points (74-47-121) in 124 outings, is within two points of tying Graham Craig (1981-85) and Rob Collins (1998-02) for 17th place on FSU's all-time points leader list. Craig notched 123 points (57-66-123) in as many games while Collins recorded his career total (44-79-123) in 145 contests . . . The Bulldogs have scored 40.3% (25-62) of their goals in the third period and have outscored the opposition by 16 goals (25-9) in that stanza . . . Nine of FSU's 11 victories this season have been by at least three goals and the team's eight-game winning string earlier this season (10/12-11/8) all included contests in which the Bulldogs' margin of victory was by at least three goals . . . **Derek Nesbitt** is within three points of matching last season's output. The forward has 18 points (6-12-18) in 14 contests this campaign and compiled 21 points (9-12-21) in 36 outings a season ago . . . **Nesbitt** (3-4-7) and **Jeff Legue** (2-5-7) both have current five-game point streaks . . . **Mike Brown's** career 2.36 goals against average ranks second best in school history, trailing Phil Osaer's (1998-01) career 2.18 goals against average in 59 appearances . . . In its 11 wins this campaign, FSU is averaging 5.09 goals (56 total) per game while holding its opponents to 1.45 goals an outing (16). The Bulldogs are 22.9% (11-48) on the power play and are operating at 90.6% (48-53) efficiency in penalty-kill situations . . . Ferris' top forward line of **Chris Kunitz** (10-15-25), **Jeff Legue** (9-9-18) and **Derek Nesbitt** (6-12-18) has generated 39.1% (61-156) of the team's scoring output and 40.3% (25-62) of the squad's goals production . . . Senior defenseman **Troy Milam's (Lake Orion)** 16 career goals in 127 games currently ranks tied for 10th place with Randy Robertson (1985-89), Clark Davies (1986-90) and Jim Dube (1997-01) on FSU's career defenseman goal-scoring leaders chart.

ALL-AMERICA CANDIDATE: **Chris Kunitz**, who earned All-CCHA First-Team honors last season due in part to scoring a league-high 25 goals, is a 2002-03 All-America candidate. A season ago, he totaled a career-high 38 points on a career-best 28 goals and 10 assists in 35 games. A two-time CCHA Offensive
