### FERRIS STATE RESUMES CCHA PLAY THIS WEEKEND HOSTING NOTRE DAME

**THIS WEEK:** The nationally-ranked Ferris State University men's ice hockey team resumes Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) action this weekend (Jan. 10-11) as the Bulldogs entertain the University of Notre Dame Fighting Irish in a two-game series at Big Rapids, Mich. The contests represent the second regular-season series between the two teams for the 2002-03 campaign.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/R.L. Ewigleben (pronounced A-VAH-glave-in) Ice Arena (2,493).

**FSU TICKET INFORMATION:** Tickets for all 2002-03 FSU home games are available by contacting the Ewigleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (EST) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m.

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State extended its winning streak to three and is 15-5-0 overall (10-2-0 CCHA) following a non-league series sweep against Niagara last weekend (Jan. 3-4) at NU's Dwyer Arena in Niagara University, N.Y. The Bulldogs skated to a 7-1 triumph in the opener and then dealt the Purple Eagles an 8-1 setback in the series' finale in what marked the first-ever meetings between the teams. FSU currently ranks 11th in the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll, 12th by *U.S. College Hockey Online* and 13th by *Inside College Hockey.com*. Ferris is 7-3-0 at home, 8-1-0 on the road and 0-1-0 at neutral sites this season.

☛ Last season, Ferris State had a 15-20-1 overall record and placed ninth in the CCHA at 12-15-1. FSU was 10-6-0 at home, 5-13-1 on the road, and 0-1-0 at neutral sites.

**Notre Dame** is 9-8-3 overall and 7-7-0 in the CCHA after its league series split with Nebraska-Omaha last weekend (Jan. 3-4) at the Omaha Civic Auditorium in Omaha, Neb. The Fighting Irish posted a 5-3 victory in the series' opening contest before suffering a 5-3 setback to the Mavericks in Saturday's rematch. ND, which sports a 4-2-1 record in its last seven outings, is 5-5-1 on the road, 4-3-1 at home and 0-0-1 at neutral sites this campaign.

☛ Notre Dame finished the 2001-02 campaign

at 16-17-5 overall and 12-12-4 (7th-place tie) in the CCHA. The Irish were 6-8-2 at home, 10-8-3 on the road and 0-1-0 at neutral sites.

**BOB DANIELS:** The sixth head coach in the program's history, Daniels became FSU's winningest coach following a 7-0 regular-season finale (3/4/00) win at Western Michigan to surpass the program's inaugural coach Rick Duffett (1975-82; 119-83-7). Daniels ranks first among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 120-151-29 (.448) league mark.

**THE COACHES:** Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 11th season, 164-202-32 (.452) – (19-10-3 vs. Notre Dame – Home 5-4-0, Away 12-6-3, Neutral 2-0-0). **Notre Dame** – **Dave Poulin** (Notre Dame, 1982), 8th season, 106-146-37 (.431) – (6-14-3 vs. Ferris State).

**ABOUT NOTRE DAME:** The Irish's top points leaders this season are junior forward Rob Globke (17-10-27), senior forward Connor Dunlop (11-18-19) and sophomore forward Yan Stastny (11-6-17). Sophomore Morgan Cey (8-7-3, 3.09 GAA, .907sv%) has appeared in 18 contests this campaign.

### GAMES THIS WEEK

Tuesday, January 7

**BULLDOG BITES:** Ferris State's 15 victories this season matches its overall win total of 2001-02 (15-20-1) and the Bulldogs (10-2-0 CCHA) are two wins shy from matching last year's CCHA win total (12-15-1) . . . FSU's overall record ties for the best mark in the program's history after the opening 20 games. The 1979-80 squad posted the same record and proceeded to win its next five (20-5-0 overall) . . . Senior left wing **Chris Kunitz (Regina, Sask.)**, who has 78 goals in 130 career games, needs four more goals to tie Jim Baker (1978-82) for fourth place on FSU's all-time goal scoring list. He also ranks 12th in career scoring with 134 points (78-56-134) . . . Junior center **Brett Smith (Guelph, Ont.)** has compiled a season-high nine points (4-5-9) in 20 outings this season, which exceeds his previous season best of six points (2-4-6) in 37 games last season . . . Sophomore center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ont.)** extended his team season-high point string to 11 games (7-10-17) and has registered at least a point in 17 of 20 contests played, including nine multi-point efforts . . . **Chris Kunitz**, who leads the CCHA in overall scoring with 14-24-38 in 20 games, has equalled the number of points (28-10-38) he posted a season ago . . . Frosh defenseman **Steve Later (Winnipeg, Man.)** has been declared academically ineligible and won't be returning to the program. He had two points (1-1-2) in 13 contests this year . . . Sophomore goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)** ranks ninth in FSU career wins with a 25-18-0 mark in 45 games and is two victories shy of tying Jeff Blashill (1994-98) for eighth place. Brown's 15 wins this year ties Dave Swierpel (1975-76) and Rob Hughston (1983-84) for the program's second best single-season victory total . . . FSU is tied for 10th with Minnesota and Dartmouth in the latest *U.S. College Hockey Online's* PairWise Rankings . . . **Kunitz** and **Brown** have been named to the *Detroit Free Press's* First-Half All-CCHA Team.

**ALL-AMERICA CANDIDATE:** **Chris Kunitz**, an All-CCHA First-Teamer last season as a result of scoring a league-high 25 goals, is a 2002-03 Hobey Baker Memorial Award and All-America candidate. A season ago, he totaled a 38 points on a career-best 28 goals and 10 assists in 35 games. **MANGOS NAMED CCHA PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Junior defenseman **Simon Mangos (Caledon, Ont.)** has been named this week's CCHA Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Bulldogs' series sweep at Niagara last weekend (1/3-4). In the two games, Mangos recorded a +5 efficiency rating and scored a goal apiece in both outings while extending his current point string to a career-high four games. He accounted for the final goal in Friday's encounter and notched the game-winner on Saturday. The weekly league honor represents Ferris' seventh of this season and the first of Mangos' career.
