### FERRIS STATE HOSTS OHIO STATE IN KEY CCHA MATCHUP THIS WEEKEND

**THIS WEEK:** A battle of nationally-ranked teams will take place this weekend (Nov. 22-23) as the Ferris State University men's ice hockey team entertains the Ohio State University Buckeyes in a two-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) series at Big Rapids, Mich. The two-game set represents the only regular-season meetings between the two teams for the 2002-03 campaign.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/R.L. Ewigleben (pronounced A-VAH-glave-in) Ice Arena (2,493).

**FSU TICKET INFORMATION:** Tickets for all 2002-03 FSU home games are available by contacting the Ewigleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (EST) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m.

**THE RECORDS: Ferris State** is currently 9-3-0 overall and 7-1-0 in the CCHA following a league home-and-home series split with Western Michigan last weekend (Nov. 15-16). Ferris registered a 6-3 victory over the Broncos last Friday (Nov. 15) at FSU's Ewigleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. Western returned the favor with a 4-1 home triumph Saturday (Nov. 16) at WMU's Lawson Ice Arena in Kalamazoo, Mich. The Bulldogs are ranked 12th for the third consecutive week by the *U.S. College Hockey Online*. FSU is tied for 12th place in *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll and is listed 14th in the *Inside College Hockey.com* poll. FSU is 5-2-0 at home and 4-1-0 on the road to date.

☛ Last season, Ferris State finished 15-20-1 overall and placed ninth in the CCHA at 12-15-1. FSU was 10-6-0 at home, 5-13-1 on the road, and 0-1-0 at neutral sites.

**Ohio State** improved to 8-2-1 overall and 5-0-1 in the CCHA after a two-game sweep of Michigan State last weekend (Nov. 15-16) at OSU's Value City Arena in Columbus, Ohio. The Buckeyes claimed a 5-2 win last Friday (Nov. 15) before skating to a 4-1 triumph Saturday (Nov. 16) while extending their current winning streak to five straight. OSU is ranked 10th this week by *Inside College Hockey.com*, 13th by *U.S. College Hockey Online* poll and is listed 14th in the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll. The 5-0-1 CCHA mark is the best since 1983-84

when the Buckeyes were 6-0-0.

☛ Ohio State registered a 20-16-4 overall mark a season ago while notching a seventh-place tying 12-12-4 CCHA record.

**BOB DANIELS:** The sixth head coach in the program's history, Daniels became FSU's winningest coach following a 7-0 regular-season finale (3/4/00) win at Western Michigan to surpass the program's inaugural coach Rick Duffett (1975-82; 119-83-7). Daniels ranks first among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 117-150-29 (.444) league mark.

**THE COACHES: Ferris State – Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 11th season, 158-200-32 (.446) – (11-19-2 vs. Ohio State – Home 8-6-2, Away 3-12-0, Neutral 0-1-0). **Ohio State – John Markell** (Bowling Green State, 1979), 8th season, 130-135-24 (.491) – (16-8-1 vs. Ferris State).

**ABOUT OHIO STATE:** Junior forward Scott May (3-12-15) is tops among six double-figure point getters for the Buckeyes. Freshman forward Dan Knapp (6-7-13) along with junior forward Paul Caponigri (4-8-12) and frosh forward Ryan Kesler (3-9-12) are other leading scorers. Junior Mike Betz (6-2-1, 2.43 GAA, .906sv%) and redshirt frosh Dave Caruso (2-0-0, 2.00 GAA, .922sv%) are the goaltenders.

... In its nine victories this season, FSU has outscored the opposition 50-13 and is averaging 5.6 goals a game to its opponent's 1.4 average for a +4.1 goal differential. The Bulldogs' power-play unit is operating at 29.4% (10-34) efficiency while the team is at 90.0% (36-40) in penalty-kill situations ... Sophomore center **Mike Kinnie's (Shelby)** penalty shot (unsuccessful) in the second period at Western Michigan was the first by a Bulldog since Jason Basile scored in a 6-3 home win over Bowling Green State last season (2/9) ... Sophomore goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)** will be featured in the Faces in the Crowd section of the Nov. 21 issue of *Sports Illustrated*. Brown is being recognized for being the first player in CCHA history to win a weekly award (Defensive Player of the Week) four consecutive weeks ... In seven home appearances this campaign, Ferris is averaging 5.1 goal an outing (36 total) while the opposition has scored at a 2.3 goals a game clip (16). **Chris Kunitz (5-7-12)** and sophomore center **Jeff Legue (5-5-10)** are the team's leading scorers in home outings this season. FSU is averaging 40.9 shots per game (286) at home to date ... **Mike Brown** has totaled 10 30-plus save game performances in his career, including five this year. The netminder's three highest save efforts have occurred this season with one being a career-high 40 saves at Notre Dame (10/26) ... Ferris plays seven of its next eight CCHA games at home.

**ALL-AMERICA CANDIDATE: Chris Kunitz**, who earned All-CCHA First-Team honors last season as a result of scoring a league-high 25 goals, is a 2002-03 All-America candidate. A season ago, he totaled a career-high 38 points on a career-best 28 goals and 10 assists in 35 games. A two-time CCHA Offensive Player-of-the-Week selection last winter, Kunitz ranked fourth nationally in goals (0.80 gpg) and tied for fourth in game-winning goals (six).

The 2002-03 season marks the third year of the Perani Cup Three Stars, which is awarded following the conclusion of each CCHA regular-season game. Players from each school earn points throughout the season each time they are named a "star of the game" (5 points for 1st star, 3 points for 2nd star, and 1 point for 3rd star).
