FERRIS STATE TO PLAY IN CONNECTICUT CLASSIC OVER HOLIDAY BREAK

THIS WEEK: The nationally-ranked Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will be traveling to Storrs, Conn., this weekend (Dec. 29-30) to compete in the Connecticut (UConn) Classic. The Bulldogs will square off against the Alabama-Huntsville Chargers in Sunday's (Dec. 29) semifinal-round opener proceeded by host Connecticut taking on Findlay in the other semifinal contest. The consolation and championship games will be held Monday (Dec. 30).

FACEOFF/ARENA: Sunday – 2 p.m. (EST) & Monday – 2 or 5:15 p.m. (EST)/UConn Ice Arena (2,000).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State, which has been idle the last two-plus weeks, is 12-4-0 overall and 10-2-0 in the CCHA following a league home-and-home series split against Michigan State (Dec. 6-7). FSU suffered a 6-2 home loss to the Spartans in Friday's (Dec. 6) series opener at the Ewigleben (pronounced A-VAH-glave-in) Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. Ferris then posted a 5-3 triumph Saturday (Dec. 7) at MSU's Munn Ice Arena in East Lansing, Mich.

The Bulldogs are ranked among the top 10 in four national polls this week – eighth by *U.S. College Hockey Online*, ninth by both *Inside College Hockey.com* and *National Hockey League.com*, and 10th by *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine*. FSU is 7-3-0 at home and 5-1-0 on the road this campaign.

◆ Ferris State was 15-20-1 overall and placed ninth in the CCHA at 12-15-1 a season ago.

Alabama-Huntsville is 5-7-2 overall while registering a first-place 4-1-1 College Hockey America (CHA) mark. In its most recent action (Dec. 6-7), UAH went 1-0-1 against Sacred Heart (Conn.) in a non-league series at USC's Milford Ice Pavillion in Fairfield, Conn. The Chargers skated to a 3-3 overtime tie with the Pioneers in the opener (Dec. 6) before claiming a 6-2 victory in the finale (Dec. 7). UAH, which has a current five-game unbeaten streak (3-0-2), is 3-0-1 at home and 2-7-1 in away outings this season.

Connecticut has notched a 4-9-1 overall mark and is 3-6-1 (eighth-place tie) in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC). The Huskies earned a split in a pair of league home outings (Dec. 6-7) at the UConn Ice Arena in Storrs, Conn., winning 3-0 over Army (Dec. 6) before losing a 6-5 decision to American International (Mass.) (Dec. 7). UConn is 2-5-0 at home, 2-3-1 on the road and 0-1-0 at neutral sites this campaign.

Findlay stands at 7-6-1 overall and 1-2-1 (fifth place) in College Hockey America (CHA). The Oilers have a current four-game winning string as a result of sweeping a non-league series from Bentley (Dec. 6-7) at BC's John A. Ryan Skating Arena in Waltham, Mass. UF garnered a 7-2 triumph in the series' opener (Dec. 6) and then chalked up a 7-0

win in the rematch (Dec. 7). The Oilers sport a 2-3-1 home mark and are 5-3-0 on the road this season.

BOB DANIELS: The sixth head coach in the program's history, Daniels became FSU's winningest coach following a 7-0 regular-season finale (3/4/00) win at Western Michigan to surpass the program's inaugural coach Rick Duffett (1975-82; 119-83-7). Daniels ranks first among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with an 120-151-29 (.448) league mark.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 11th season, 161-201-32 (.449) – (0-0-0 vs. Alabama-Huntsville, 0-0-0 vs. Connecticut, 1-1-0 vs. Findlay); **Alabama-Huntsville** – **Doug Ross** (Bowling Green State, 1976), 21st season, 380-203-29 (.645); Career: 24th season, 436-238-31 (.640) – (0-2-0 vs. Ferris State); **Connecticut** – **Bruce Marshall** (Connecticut, 1985), 15th season, 218-168-36 (.559) – (0-0-0 vs. Ferris State); **Findlay** – **Craig Barnett** (Plattsburgh State, 1989), 8th season, 104-99-13 (.512) – (1-1-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT ALABAMA-HUNTSVILLE: Junior left wing Mike Funk (6-8–14) and senior center Jason Hawes (3-10–13) are among four Chargers with double-digit point totals. Freshman Scott Munroe (4-2-0, 3.42 GAA, .918sv%) and senior Mark Byrne (1-4-2, 4.51 GAA, .870sv%) are the primary goaltenders.

ABOUT CONNECTICUT: The Huskies are paced in scoring by senior forwards Kurt Kamienski (4-11–15), D.J. Miller (8-2–10) and Ron D'Angelo (5-3–8). Juniors Jason Carey (4-5-0, 3.65 GAA, .900sv%) and Artie Imbriano (0-4-1, 4.45 GAA, .842sv%) are the regulars in goal.

ABOUT FINDLAY: The Oilers have six skaters with double-figure points, led by junior center Nick Udovicic (7-13–20), senior right wing Jason Maxwell (7-10–17) and freshman center Andrew Radzak (9-4–13). Udovicic is third among the CHA's overall scoring leaders while Maxwell ranks sixth and Radzak is tied for ninth place. Senior netminder Jamie VandeSpyke (4-5-1, 3.24 GAA, .897sv%) has logged the most time with junior Kevin Fines (3-0-0, 1.00 GAA, .964sv%) serving in a backup capacity. Former FSU goaltender Mike Szkodzinski (1996-98) is an assistant on the UF coaching staff.

THE SERIES: Ferris State has a 2-0-0 all-time series lead over Alabama-Huntsville. The Bulldogs swept a home series against the Chargers in the 1985-86 (10/25-26) season, winning 7-2 and 13-3. FSU and Connecticut have yet to face one another. Ferris is 1-1-0 versus Findlay as the two teams split a two-game set in the 2000-01 season (12/15-16) at Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs skated to a 5-0 win in the opener before coming out on the short end of a 3-2 decision in the series' finale.

BULLDOG BITES: FSU's 10-2-0 league record represents its best ever through 12 games. Ferris posted an 8-3-1 CCHA mark in both the 1981-82 and 1998-99 seasons . . . The Bulldogs are five league points shy of matching last season's ninth-place 25-point league total (12-15-1 CCHA). FSU's 12 wins this campaign is three shy of equalling last season's 15 victories (15-20-1 overall) . . . Sophomore goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)** moved into a tie for 10th place with Marc Felicio (1987-91) and Glenn Raeburn (1985-87) on Ferris' career wins list. Brown sports a 22-17-0 overall record in 41 career appearances and his 12 wins this season already surpasses his victory total of 10 set last season . . . FSU's eight-member sophomore class has accounted for 39.1% (27-69) of the team's goal-scoring production this campaign . . . Senior left wing **Chris Kunitz (Regina, Sask.)** is tied for 17th place with Graham Craig (1981-85) and Rob Collins (1998-02) among the school's career scoring leaders with 123 points (75-48-123) in 126 games. He also assumed sole possession of seventh place in FSU all-time goal scoring following his sixth game-winning tally of the this season at Michigan State (12/7) and is one shy of tying

Paul Cook's (1979-83) sixth-place 76-career goal total . . . **Kunitz**, who has a school-record 16 career game-winning goals, snapped a seven-game non-goal scoring string at Michigan State. He began this season with 20 points (10-10-20) in his first eight games while scoring a goal in five of the Bulldogs' initial six outings . . . Sophomore center **Mike Kinnie (Shelby Township)** has established personal career-bests in points (15), goals (nine) and assists (six) in 16 contests this winter. He totaled nine points (5-4-9) in 25 outings a season ago . . . Sophomore left wing **Derek Nesbitt (Egmondville, Ont.)** is two points away from equalling last season's output (9-12-21) in 36 games. He has 19 points (6-13-19) in 16 contests this year . . . This season marks the first time in program history that FSU is first in the CCHA standings entering the holiday break. The previous best was in the 1998-99 season when the Bulldogs (8-3-2, 18 pts.) were tied for second place with Ohio State through games of Dec. 28. FSU had a league-best 17 points (8-3-1) thru Nov. 21.

TOURNAMENT NOTES: Ferris is 10-13-2 all-time in regular-season tourney contests and head coach Bob Daniels owns a 6-6-0 mark in such games. The Bulldogs went 0-2-0 at Minnesota's Dodge Mariucci Classic (12/28-29), losing a 3-2 decision to 2001-02 NCAA National Champion Minnesota in the semifinal round and then suffering a 6-3 setback to Western Michigan in the third-place contest. FSU has compiled a 13-6-0 all-time record against College Hockey America (CHA)-member schools.

ALL-AMERICA CANDIDATE: **Chris Kunitz**, who earned All-CCHA First-Team honors and scored a league-leading 25 goals last season, is a 2002-03 All-America candidate. Kunitz totaled a career-high 38 points on a career-best 28 goals and 10 assists in 35 games in the 2001-02 season. A two-time CCHA Offensive Player-of-the-Week selection last winter, Kunitz ranked fourth nationally in goals (0.80 gpg) and tied for fourth in game-winning goals (six).
