FERRIS STATE TIES FOR SECOND BEST START IN PROGRAM'S HISTORY

THIS WEEK: The nationally-ranked Ferris State University men's ice hockey team, which is presently tied for the second best start in the program's history, entertains the Wayne State University Warriors this weekend (Nov. 8-9) in a non-league series at Big Rapids, Mich.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State, which is ranked 12th in the *U.S. College Hockey Online, USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and *Inside College Hockey.com* polls, extended its winning streak to seven straight while improving to 7-1-0 overall and 6-0-0 in the CCHA after posting a CCHA league road series sweep of Alaska Fairbanks last weekend (Nov. 1-2) at UAF's Carlson Center in Fairbanks, Alaska. The Bulldogs notched a 5-0 victory in last Friday's opener and then tallied a 5-1 triumph in Saturday's rematch with the Nanooks. Ferris State is 3-1-0 at home and 4-0-0 in away outings this campaign.

◆ Last season, Ferris State had a 15-20-1 overall record and placed ninth in the CCHA at 12-15-1. FSU was 10-6-0 at home, 5-13-1 on the road, and 0-1-0 at neutral sites.

Wayne State is presently 2-2-0 overall and 0-0-0 in College Hockey America (CHA) following a pair of non-league losses last weekend (Nov. 1-2), which snapped the Warriors' 14-game unbeaten streak (13-0-1). WSU suffered an 8-3 setback to Vermont last Friday (Nov. 1) at UV's Gutterson Fieldhouse in Burlington, Vt. The Warriors then dropped a 5-3 decision to Dartmouth last Saturday (Nov. 2) at DC's Thompson Arena in Hanover, N.H.

◆ Wayne State registered a 21-11-4 overall record last season, including a first-place 15-2-3 mark in the CHA. The Warriors also captured the College Hockey America Tournament title for the second straight season.

BOB DANIELS: The sixth head coach in the program's history, Daniels became FSU's winningest coach following a 7-0 regular-season finale (3/4/00) win at Western Michigan to surpass the program's inaugural coach Rick Duffett (1975-82; 119-83-7). Daniels ranks first among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 116-149-29 (.444) league mark.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – Bob Daniels (Michigan State, 1982), 11th season, 156-198-32 (.446) – (2-0-0 vs. Wayne State – Away 2-0-0). **Wayne State – Bill Wilkinson** (St. Lawrence, 1970), 4th season, 53-43-9 (.548); Career– 21st season, 366-344-62 (.514) – (42-19-5 vs. Ferris State). Wilkinson, who presently ranks tied for 30th among NCAA Division I all-time winningest coaches, served as head coach at Western Michigan for 17 years (1982-99).

ABOUT WAYNE STATE: Senior forward Jack Redwood (4-2-6), senior forward Maxim Starchenko (4-1-5) and sophomore forward John Grubb (1-3-4) are the Warriors' top point leaders this season. In goal is senior goaltender and 2001-02 CHA Player of the Year David Guerrero (2-1-0, 3.67 GAA, .861sv%) and the backup is junior Marc Carlson (0-1-0, 5.00 GAA, .839sv%), who was sidelined all of last season.

BULLDOG BITES: Ferris State's 7-1-0 start this campaign is tied for the school's second-best all-time mark. FSU won seven of its first eight contests in 1983-84, which included a season-opening three-game win streak. The 1983-84 squad finished 18-20-3 overall and tied for sixth place in the CCHA at 13-15-2 . . . Senior left wing **Chris Kunitz (Regina, Sask.)** is currently tied for seventh place with Peter Lowden (1983-87) on FSU's career goal-scoring leaders chart and is two tallies shy of matching Paul Cook's (1979-83) sixth-place 76-career goal total. Kunitz has 74 goals in 118 games while Lowden registered his career total in 158 contests . . . The Bulldogs' seven-game winning string also includes their first four-

game road win streak in conference play since the 1990-91 season. Ferris reeled off five straight away from home that season beating Michigan, Notre Dame, Michigan State and Illinois-Chicago (twice) in a stretch from Nov. 3-Dec. 8 . . . FSU successfully killed off all 13 Alaska Fairbanks (UAF) power-play opportunities in last weekend's series sweep and have allowed just three power-play goals in 29 attempts (89.6%) during their seven-game win streak . . . FSU is 12-5-0 all-time against College Hockey America (CHA) teams and compiled a 3-1-0 mark versus the CHA last season. The Bulldogs are 6-4-0 at home all-time versus CHA opponents . . . Ferris is averaging 5.7 goals per game (40 total) and 38.0 shots (266) during their winning span while holding the opposition to averages of 1.3 goals (nine total) and 30.3 shots (212), respectively . . . The last time FSU swept a road series at UAF was 1999-00 (2/11-12/00) - winning 3-2 and 2-1 . . . Freshman left wing **Jamie Dunlap (Nepean, Ont.)** has tallied a point in two games this season both of which have been multiple points, which includes a two-goal output at UAF last Friday.

ALL-AMERICA CANDIDATE: **Chris Kunitz**, who earned All-CCHA First-Team honors last season as a result of scoring a league-high 25 goals, is a 2002-03 All-America candidate. A season ago, he totaled a career-high 38 points on a career-best 28 goals and 10 assists in 35 games. A two-time CCHA Offensive Player-of-the-Week selection last winter, Kunitz ranked fourth nationally in goals (0.80 gpg) and tied for fourth in game-winning goals (six).

BROWN MAKES CCHA HISTORY: Sophomore goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)** became the first player in CCHA history to capture a weekly award for four consecutive weeks as a result of being selected this week's CCHA Defensive Player of the Week for the fourth time this season. Brown, who joined Nebraska-Omaha goaltender Dan Ellis (2001-02) as the only two CCHA players to win an award three straight weeks, stopped 47-of-48 shots for a .955 save percentage in the Alaska Fairbanks series. He achieved his third career shutout in last Friday's 5-0 with 21 saves and then garnered 26 saves while allowing just one goal in Saturday's rematch.
