FERRIS BATTLES MICHIGAN STATE IN CCHA HOME-AND-HOME SERIES THIS WEEK

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will square off against the Michigan State University Spartans this weekend (Oct. 31-Nov. 1) in a Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) home-and-home series. This Friday's (Oct. 31) contest will be held at East Lansing, Mich., with Saturday's (Nov. 1) rematch taking place in Big Rapids, Mich. The series marks the only regular-season meeting between the teams in 2003-04.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 8:05 p.m. (EST)/Munn Ice Arena (6,470); Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/R.L. Ewigleben (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 2-4-0 overall and 1-3-0 in the CCHA after suffering a pair of league losses to Alaska Fairbanks last weekend (Oct. 24-25) at UAF's Carlson Center in Fairbanks, Alaska. The Bulldogs were dealt a 4-2 loss in last Friday's (Oct. 24) opener and dropped a 4-1 decision to the Nanooks in Saturday's (Oct. 25) rematch. The Bulldogs along with Michigan State are listed among those teams receiving votes this week in both the *U.S. College Hockey Online* and *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* polls.

☛ A season ago, Ferris State registered its most successful season in the program's 25-year NCAA-I history with a school-record 31-10-1 overall mark. The Bulldogs claimed their first-ever CCHA Championship title with a first-place 22-5-1 league record. FSU also made its initial NCAA-I Championship Tournament appearance and earned the distinction of being the nation's first team to attain 30 wins in a season.

Michigan State improved to 3-3-0 overall and 2-2-0 in the CCHA with a home-and-home league series sweep of Western Michigan last weekend (Oct. 24-25). The Spartans skated to a 4-2 win over the Broncos last Friday (Oct. 24) at MSU's Munn Ice Arena in East Lansing, Mich. Michigan State then handed Western a 7-3 defeat in Saturday's (Oct. 25) rematch at WMU's Lawson Ice Arena in Kalamazoo, Mich. ☛ Michigan State was 23-14-2 overall and 17-10-1 (fourth place) in the CCHA last season.

BOB DANIELS: The 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored as

the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* last season. Daniels, who ranked 23rd among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering this campaign, is the all-time winningest coach in FSU history. Daniels is tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 133-157-30 (.463) league mark.

ABOUT MICHIGAN STATE: The Spartans are led by junior forward and 2002-03 CCHA First-Team selection Jim Slater (7-4-11), who is this week's CCHA Offensive Player of the Week after going 2-3-5 last weekend. Junior forward Mike Lalonde (4-4-8), freshman defenseman A.J. Thelen (2-5-7) and frosh forward Tommy Goebel (2-4-6) are other leading scorers. Junior Matt Magliacchio (2-1-0, 3.67 GAA, .880sv%) and frosh Dominic Vicari (1-2-0, 3.69 GAA, .820sv%) have split time in goal.

BULLDOG BITES: Ferris State's top two points scorers, sophomore right wing **Greg Rallo** (2-4-6) and senior center **Brett Smith** (3-2-5) have combined for 28.9% of the team's total points production and 31.3% (5-16) of the squad's goal-scoring output this season to date . . . Junior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)** remains a win away from becoming the all-time winningest netminder in FSU history. Brown is 42-27-1 in 72 career appearances and is currently tied with Rob Hughston (1981-85), who compiled a 42-53-7 record in 117 career contests. The 2002-03 first-team AHCA All-American and All-CCHA First-Team performer moved into fifth place among the school's all-time

saves leaders with 70 total in last weekend's Alaska Fairbanks series. Brown, who has 1,924 career saves, surpassed Marc Felicio (1987-91; 1,876 career saves) and needs 241 more to tie Craig Lisko (1990-94; 2,165 career saves) for fourth place on the charts . . . The Bulldogs are two-for-27 (7.4%) on the power play through the first six games of this campaign. Ferris converted eight-of-30 (26.7%) extra-skater chances in its initial six outings a season ago. In penalty killing, FSU is operating at 86.7% (26-30) this season compared to 83.3% (20-24) a season ago . . . Junior defenseman **Matt York (Woodhaven)** is one point shy from notching his 50th career point and is 10-39-49 in 76 career contests . . . The last time Ferris lost two consecutive games in a row was in 2001-02 season when the Bulldogs finished the year with a three-game losing string (3/2-9). FSU suffered a 2-0 loss at Michigan State in the regular-season finale and then was swept at Alaska Fairbanks, 6-3 and 2-1, in CCHA Tournament First-Round play . . . Junior center **Mike Kinnie (Shelby Township)** was the Bulldogs' top points getter in last season's two-game series against Michigan State with three points (2-1-3) . . . **Brett Smith's** three goals this season exceeds his two-goal total from his 37-game freshman campaign and is one shy of equaling his four goals during his 36-game sophomore year. He tallied a personal career-best eight markers in 42 outings last season . . . FSU has been outscored 20-16 in its first six games this campaign after outscoring its opponents 31 to 10 last season.
