FERRIS STATE RETURNS TO THE ICE THIS WEEKEND HOSTING NEBRASKA-OMAHA

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team, which was idle last weekend, returns to the ice this weekend (Nov. 21-22) as the Bulldogs entertain the University of Nebraska-Omaha Mavericks in a Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) two-game series at Big Rapids, Mich.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/R.L. Ewigleben (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

FERRIS STATE TICKET INFORMATION: Tickets for 2003-04 regular-season home games are available by contacting the FSU Athletics Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (EST) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 3-7-0 overall and 2-6-0 in the CCHA following a home-and-home series split with nationally-ranked Michigan two weeks ago (Nov. 7-8). Ferris skated to a 6-5 overtime victory over the Wolverines in the series opener (Nov. 7) at FSU's Ewigleben Ice Arena. Michigan claimed a 3-2 triumph in the rematch (Nov. 8) at UM's Yost Ice Arena in Ann Arbor, Mich.

☛ A season ago, Ferris State registered its most successful season in the program's 25-year NCAA-I history with a school-record 31-10-1 overall mark. The Bulldogs claimed their first-ever CCHA Championship title with a first-place 22-5-1 league record. FSU also made its initial NCAA-I Championship Tournament appearance and earned the distinction of being the nation's first team to attain 30 wins in a season.

Nebraska-Omaha is 2-7-1 overall and 2-5-1 in the CCHA after gaining a CCHA home series split against Northern Michigan last weekend (Nov. 14-15) at UNO's Qwest Center Omaha in Omaha, Neb. The Mavericks garnered a 2-1 victory over the Wildcats last Friday (Nov. 14) before suffering a 4-2 loss in Saturday's (Nov. 15) contest. UNO, which is 2-2-0 in its last four games, is 0-3-1 on the road and 2-4-0 at home this season.

☛ A season ago, Nebraska-Omaha posted a 13-22-5 overall mark with a 10th-place 9-17-2 CCHA record.

BOB DANIELS: The 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I National

Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* last season. Daniels, who ranked 23rd among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering this campaign, is the all-time winningest coach in FSU history. Daniels is tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 134-160-30 (.459) league mark.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 12th season, 183-214-33 (.464) – (3-6-1 vs. Nebraska-Omaha – Home 2-3-1, Away 1-3-0). **Nebraska-Omaha** – **Mike Kemp** (Gustavus Adolphus, 1975), 7th season, 99-121-23 (.455) – (6-3-1 vs. Ferris State). Kemp is one win away from notching his 100th career victory.

ABOUT NEBRASKA-OMAHA: Freshman forward Scott Parse (6-2-8) and senior defenseman Mike Gabinet (2-6-8) are the Mavericks' top scorers. Frosh forward Kaleb Betts (1-5-6) along with senior forward Andrew Wong (1-5-6) are other leading UNO point getters. A trio of netminders – senior Brian Haaland (0-2-1, 3.13 GAA, .888sv%), freshman Chris Holt (1-4-0, 3.70 GAA, .890sv%), and frosh Kris Tebbs (1-1-0, 1.92 GAA, .926sv%) have all received action.

BULLDOG BITES: Ferris State has scored five power-play goals in its last three games after getting just two in its initial seven outings this season. The Bulldogs are operating at 33.3% (5-15) in the last three contests and were 06.3% (2-32) in the previous seven encounters . . . Junior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)** became FSU's all-time winningest netminder in the 6-5 overtime win over Michigan (Nov. 7) and has compiled a 43-30-1 career mark in 76 appearances to date. Brown surpassed Rob Hughston (1981-85; 42-53-7) to claim the top honor . . . Ferris State's five second-period goals in the series opener versus Michigan was three shy of tying the school mark for most second-period lamp-lighters which was established against Illinois-Chicago (2/6/78). The five goals

was four away from matching a school-best nine first-period markers against Northeastern Illinois (12/22/76) . . . Senior center **Brett Smith's (Guelph, Ont.)** four goals this campaign in 10 outings already matches his second-best season goal-scoring output set in 2001-02 when he netted four in 36 contests. Smith set a career-high with eight goals in 42 outings a season ago . . . FSU plays its next four contests at home and will have played six of its seven November games at Big Rapids. The Bulldogs started out this campaign playing six of their seven October encounters on the road . . . Ferris' top four scorers this season - sophomore right wing **Greg Rallo (3-6-9)**, junior left wing **Derek Nesbitt (1-7-8)**, **Brett Smith (4-3-7)** and junior center **Jeff Legue (3-4-7)** have generated 49.2% (31-63) of the team's points output along with 42.3% (11-26) of its goal scoring . . . Jeff Legue is nine points away from recording his 100th career point. Legue, a 2002-03 All-CCHA Second Team selection, has 91 points (33-58-91) in 88 career contests and is averaging 1.03 points a game during his career . . . Senior defenseman **Simon Mangos (Caledon, Ont.)**, a 2002-03 All-CCHA Second Team pick, hasn't registered a point in FSU's first 10 games this season. As a freshman in 2000-01, he went 12 contests (12/29-2/10) without a point . . . **Mangos** and junior center **Mike Kinnie (Shelby Township)** both have matching goal and assist totals in their careers. Mangos is 18-18-36 in 125 career outings while Kinnie is 22-22-44 in 76 career contests . . . Junior defenseman **Matt York's (Woodhaven)** 235 career penalty minutes (92 penalties) currently ranks 12th among Ferris' all-time leaders and needs 16 more penalty minutes to tie Rod Schluter (1984-89) for 11th place. To date, York is seventh among FSU defensemen in that category.
