FSU OPENS CCHA PLAY THIS WEEKEND AT LAKE SUPERIOR STATE

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team begins Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) action this weekend (Oct. 21-22) versus the Lake Superior State University Lakers in a two-game series at Sault Ste. Marie, Mich.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EDT) and Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EDT)/Taffy Abel Arena (4,000).

BROADCAST INFORMATION: All of Ferris State's 2005-06 league games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the play-by-play. Those contests can also be accessed live via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcasts icon at www.ferris.edu/sports. Live internet stats will also be available by going to the official CCHA website at <http://ccha.collegesports.com> and then click on Games/Results section near the league standings.

FSU TICKET INFORMATION: Tickets for all 2005-06 Ferris State Hockey home games is available by contacting the Ewigleben (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (ET) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (ET).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 1-1-0 overall and 0-0-0 in the CCHA this season following a season-opening split at the Mutual of Omaha Maverick Stampede Tournament last weekend (Oct. 14-15) at the Qwest Center Omaha in Omaha, Neb. The Bulldogs dropped a 4-2 decision to nationally-ranked New Hampshire in last Friday's (Oct. 14) tourney opener before posting a 5-2 triumph over Army in Saturday's (Oct. 15) consolation game.

• Last season, Ferris State finished 13-22-4 overall with a 10th place-tying 7-17-4 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 4-12-2 at home, 8-10-2 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites for the 2004-05 campaign.

Lake Superior State sports a 1-0-1 overall mark and is 0-0-0 in the CCHA to date. The Lakers skated to a 2-2 non-league overtime tie against nationally 16th-ranked Colgate in last Friday's (Oct. 14) season opener at LSSU's Taffy Abel Arena. LSSU then registered a 3-2 decision over the Red Raiders in Saturday's (Oct.

15) series finale.

• Lake Superior State posted a 9-22-7 overall record last season, which included a ninth-place 8-14-6 league mark. The Lakers were 5-8-4 at home a season ago.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 14th season, 209-250-40 (.459) – (13-21-4 vs. Lake Superior State – Away 6-10-2, Home 7-10-2, Neutral 0-1-0).
Lake Superior State – **Jim Roque** (Lake Superior State, 1987), 1st season, 1-0-1 (.750) – (0-0-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT LAKE SUPERIOR STATE: Junior forward Dominic Osman (1-1-2) along with junior forward Derek R. Smith (1-1-2), freshman defenseman Marty Gurnoe (0-2-2) and freshman forward Troy Schwab (0-2-2) are the top scoring leaders for the Lakers. Junior goaltender Jeff Jakaitis (1-0-1, 1.92 GAA, .900sv%) has appeared in both LSSU contests this season to date. Fourth-year Lakers' assistant coach Tim Christian played collegiately at Ferris State (1991-95).

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and



the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 14th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts,

Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2005-06 campaign, Daniels ranked 19th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

➤ **Four Score** – Junior left wing **Matt Verdone (Summertown, Ontario)** was the Bulldogs' lone selection on the Mutual of Omaha Maverick Stampede All-Tournament Team as he recorded his first career hat trick with a four-goal performance in last Saturday's 5-2 win over Army in the tourney's consolation game. The last time a Ferris State skater scored four times in a contest was on Feb. 19, 1994 when Doug Smith did so in a 6-1 win over Ohio State.

➤ **Career Best** – Junior right wing **Zac Pearson's (White Lake)** three assists in the Army contest represents a personal career best, bettering his previous high of one helper set on 16 previous occasions.

➤ **Memorable Win** – Freshman goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe (Almont, Ontario)** needed to make just 11 saves against Army in recording his first collegiate victory. O'Keefe was ranked eighth by *Inside College Hockey* among its top freshmen newcomers this season.

➤ **Productive Line** – The Bulldogs' forward line of **Verdone, Pearson** and freshman center **Brendan Connolly (Canmore, Alberta)** accounted for four goals and five assists in the win over Army. Connolly contributed with two assists as the trio had nine of Ferris' 14 points in the contest.

➤ **Helping Out** – Senior defenseman **Andrew Winnik (Mississauga, Ontario)**, who didn't register an assist in 34 contests last season, picked up one against Army which represented his first helper since Jan. 17, 2004 against Miami.

➤ **Match Game** – **Matt Verdone's** four points in two games this campaign already matches his October output of a season ago in which he compiled four points (1-3-4) in eight outings.

➤ **Back Home** – Sophomore goaltender **Derek MacIntyre (Stanwood)** and sophomore defenseman **Jim Jorgensen (Sault Ste. Marie)** both played for the Soo Indians under coach Joe Shawhan in the junior ranks. MacIntyre posted a sparkling 31-3-2 record in net during his final season (2003-04) with the Indians while Jorgensen compiled 31 points (8-23-31) in that particular campaign.

➤ **Welcome Back** – Ferris State returns 18 letterwinners from last season's squad, including eight of its top 11 points leaders. The Bulldogs also welcome back 51.8% (59-114) of their goal production and 56.6% (159-281) of their points production.

➤ **Impressive Frosh Class** – Ferris State's incoming freshmen class for the 2005-06 season is ranked 10th best among the nation's top 15 recruiting classes according to *Inside College Hockey.com's* (INCH) 2005 Recruiting Rankings. Besides O'Keefe, freshman right wing **Dan Riedel (Rochester Hills)** was listed seventh on INCH's Top 20 Incoming Forward Rankings while frosh defenseman **Chris Zarb (Waterford)** landed into 11th place on the top 15 incoming defensemen chart.

INCH compiled its rankings with extensive input from college and junior coaches, as well as professional scouts. Participants were asked to evaluate recruits based on their projected impact at the collegiate level, not on their professional hockey prospects.

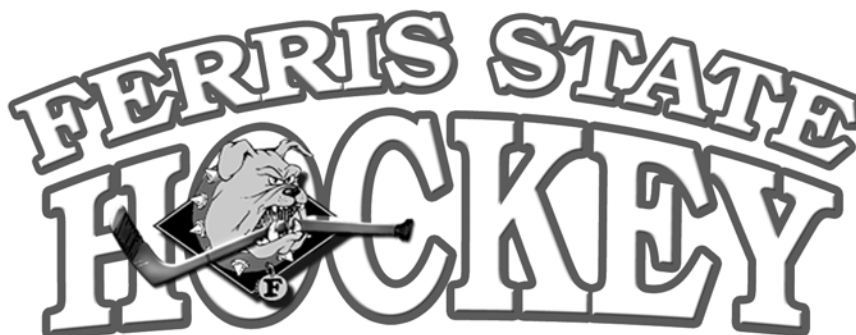
SERIES NOTES
