### BULLDOGS PLAY AT HOME THIS WEEKEND AGAINST LAKE SUPERIOR STATE

**THIS WEEK:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team is home this weekend (Jan. 20-21) for the first time since early December 2005 as the Bulldogs face the nationally-ranked Lake Superior State Lakers in a two-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) series at Big Rapids, Mich.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Ewingleben Ice Arena (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

**BROADCAST INFORMATION:** All of Ferris State's 2005-06 CCHA games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the action. The contests can be accessed live via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcasts icon at [www.ferris.edu/sports](http://www.ferris.edu/sports). Live internet stats are available by going to the official CCHA website at <http://ccha.collegesports.com> and click on Games/Results section near the CCHA standings.

**TICKET INFORMATION:** Tickets for all 2005-06 Ferris State Hockey home games is available by contacting the Ewingleben (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (ET) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (ET).

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State improved to 10-8-5 overall and 5-6-4 in CCHA play as a result of a 6-5 league win over Bowling Green State Monday (Jan. 16) at the BGSU Ice Arena in Bowling Green, Ohio. FSU is among 12 teams receiving votes in this week's *U.S. College Hockey Online/College Sports Television (CSTV)* poll.

➤ Last season, Ferris State was 13-22-4 overall with a 10th place-tying 7-17-4 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 4-12-2 at home, 8-10-2 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites.

Lake Superior State is 12-6-4 overall and 8-6-2 in the CCHA to date after sweeping a league home series (6-1 and 4-0) against Western Michigan two weeks ago (Jan. 6-7) at LSSU's Taffy Abel Arena in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich. LSSU is currently ranked 11th by *Inside College Hockey* this week while being listed 14th in both the *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* polls.

➤ Lake Superior State posted a 9-22-7 overall record for the 2004-05 season, which included a ninth-place 8-14-6 league mark. The Lakers were 5-8-4 at home a season ago.

**Lake Superior State – Jim Roque** (Lake Superior State, 1987), 1st season, 12-6-4 (.636) – (0-0-2 vs. Ferris State).

**ABOUT LAKE SUPERIOR STATE:** The Lakers, who have five skaters with double-figure points totals, are paced in scoring by junior forward Trent Campbell (8-9-17) and freshman forward Troy Schwab (5-10-15). Schwab is listed 18th among the national leaders in points per game (0.75 ppg.) for rookies. Senior forward Nathan Ward (4-10-14) along with junior forward Dominic Osman (7-4-11) and junior forward Jeff Rainville (4-7-11) are the top scoring leaders for LSSU. Junior goaltender Jeff Jakaitis (11-6-4, 1.88 GAA, .924sv%), who ranks seventh nationally in goals-against average and 14th in save percentage, has received mention on CSTV's Hobey Baker "watch" list. LSSU ranks fourth on the national leaders chart in scoring defense (1.91 gpg.). Fourth-year Lakers' assistant coach Tim Christian played collegiately at Ferris State (1991-95).

### GAMES THIS WEEK

#### MONDAY, JANUARY 16

Ferris State 6, at Bowling Green State 5\*

➤ **Almost There** – Ferris State's 14 league points in 15 CCHA games this season is only four shy of equalling the team's 18 league points total (7-17-4 record) for the 2004-05 campaign.

➤ **Hat Trick** – Freshman center **Dan Riedel's (Rochester Hills)** three goals at Bowling Green State Monday (1/16) represented the second such performance by a FSU skater this season. Junior left wing

**Matt Verdone (Summerstown, Ontario)** was the first to do so this season after tallying four lamplighters in a 5-2 victory over Army in the consolation game (10/15) of the Mutual of Omaha Maverick Stampede Tournament at Omaha, Neb.

➤ **Power Play Production** – Ferris State's four power-play goals (eight attempts) at Bowling Green State Monday (1/16) not only marked a team single-game best this season but is the most since the 2002-03 season when the Bulldogs scored four goals in 10 power-play opportunities against Nebraska-Omaha (2/28). FSU also converted four such lamplighters on eight attempts versus Wayne State (11/9/02).

➤ **Better Than Last Year** – Ferris State has scored 33 goals in 174 power-play chances (18.9%) in its initial 23 outings this season. Last year, the Bulldogs were 19-of-153 in power plays (12.4%) in that span.

➤ **Season Best** – Junior right wing **Zac Pearson's (White Lake)** 17 points (4-13-17) in 23 games this season is a career high, bettering his 16 points (7-9-16) in 39 encounters last season. Pearson, who was a tri winner of the team's Steve Banonis Memorial Award as the Bulldogs' Most Improved Player, recorded three assists in the Bowling Green State contest (1/16). He also registered three helpers versus Army earlier this season (10/15).

➤ **Closing In On 100** – Senior right wing **Greg Rallo (Gurnee, Ill.)** is five points shy of recording his 100th career point. Rallo has presently totaled 95 career points (41-54-95) in 135 contests. He needs 25 more points to move into a 23rd-place tie with Dean Cowling (1985-89; 120 career pts.) on the school's all-time scoring leaders list.

➤ **Top Goal Scorers** – FSU's top two goal-scoring leaders this season, **Greg Rallo** (12 goals) and **Matt Verdone** (11 goals) have accounted for 30.3% (23-76) of the squad's output to date. Verdone's 11 lamplighters this campaign already is a career season best, eclipsing his seven markers in 39 contests for the 2004-05 season.

➤ **Tough State** – The Bulldogs have or will play five teams currently ranked among the top 15 teams in the nation. FSU skated to a 3-3 overtime tie with second-ranked Boston College at the Wells Fargo Denver Cup (12/30) and also knocked off two-time defending national champion Denver, 3-2, in the third-place game of the Wells Fargo Denver Cup (12/31). Others on the list include Miami, Michigan, New Hampshire, and Lake Superior State. Ferris' only loss to a nationally-ranked team was a 4-2 season-opening setback to New Hampshire (10/14) at the Mutual of Omaha Maverick Stampede Tourney.

➤ **Close Calls** – Seven of Ferris State's last eight outings have been decided by two goals or less and the Bulldogs sport a 3-3-1 record in those encounters.

➤ **Busy Netminder** – Freshman goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe (Almont, Ontario)** turned in his sixth 30 or more save performance of the season at Bowling Green State (1/16) with a season-high 35 saves effort. O'Keefe went four straight games (11/4-11) with at least 30 stops, including 34 against Alaska Fairbanks (11/4).

## HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 14th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2005-06 campaign, Daniels ranked 19th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.
