### FERRIS STATE HOSTS MICHIGAN STATE IN A TUESDAY CCHA CONTEST

**THIS WEEK:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team continues its Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) homestand this Tuesday (Nov. 8) as the Bulldogs host the nationally-ranked Michigan State University Spartans in Big Rapids, Mich.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Tuesday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Ewingleben Ice Arena (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

**BROADCAST INFORMATION:** All of Ferris State's 2005-06 league games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the play-by-play. Live internet stats will also be available by going to the official CCHA website at <http://ccha.collegesports.com> and then click on Games/Results section near the league standings.

**TICKET INFORMATION:** Tickets for all 2005-06 Ferris State Hockey home games is available by contacting the Ewingleben (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (ET) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (ET).

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State is currently 2-2-3 overall and 1-1-3 in the CCHA as a result of posting a 0-1-1 mark against nationally-ranked Alaska Fairbanks last weekend (Nov. 4-5) at FSU's Ewingleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids. The Bulldogs are 1-1-1 in home encounters this season to date.

◀ Last season, Ferris State finished 13-22-4 overall with a 10th place-tying 7-17-4 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 4-12-2 at home, 8-10-2 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites for the 2004-05 campaign.

**Michigan State** improved to 5-1-1 overall and 2-0-1 in the CCHA with a home league series sweep of Northern Michigan last weekend (Nov. 4-5) at MSU's Munn Ice Arena in East Lansing, Mich. The Spartans, who have a current three-game winning streak and are 1-1-1 on the road this campaign, recorded a 5-4 overtime win over the Wildcats in last Friday's (Nov. 4) series opener before notching a 5-0 shutout in Saturday's (Nov. 5) finale. MSU is presently ranked third by *Inside College Hockey* and sixth in the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine's* poll.

◀ Last season, Michigan State went 20-17-4 over-

all and placed sixth in the CCHA standings at 12-13-3.

**THE COACHES:** Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 14th season, 210-251-43 (.441) – (8-29-5 vs. Michigan State – 1-11-4 Home, 6-17-0 Away, 1-1-1 Neutral). Michigan State – **Rick Comley** (Lake Superior State, 1972), 4th season, 71-49-9 (.585); Career: 33rd season, 668-524-80 (.557) – (42-14-2 vs. Ferris State).

**ABOUT MICHIGAN STATE:** The Spartans feature two players with double-figure points total this season in sophomore forward Bryan Lerg (2-9-11) and junior forward-defenseman Tyler Howells (3-7-10). Lerg is listed tied for 19th place nationally this week in points per game (1.57 ppg). Junior forward Drew Miller (5-4-9) along with senior forward Colton Fretter (2-4-6), sophomore forward Jim McKenzie (2-4-6), and senior defenseman Corey Potter (1-5-6) are also among MSU's scoring leaders. Junior goaltender Dominic Vicari (4-1-1, 1.80 GAA, .909sv%) presently ranks 11th nationally in goals-against average. Michigan State is eighth among the national leaders in scoring offense (3.86 gpg.) and 11th in scoring defense (2.14 gpg.).

### GAMES THIS WEEK

#### TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 8

#### Michigan State at Ferris State\*, 7:05 p.m.

➤ **Nearing A Milestone** – Senior right wing **Greg Rallo (Gurnee, Ill.)**, who had three points (1-2-3) in the series against Alaska Fairbanks, is one point shy of recording his 75th career point. Rallo has 74 career points (30-44-74) in 119 contests to date.

➤ **His Month** – Junior left wing **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alberta)** has a combined 10 points (4-6-10) in November games over the last two seasons. He registered five points (1-4-5) in seven 2003-04 contests and had four points (2-2-4) in six outings a season ago. Bomersback snapped a four-game non-scoring streak with a lamplighter versus Alaska Fairbanks last Saturday.

➤ **Project Completed** – Ferris State recently completed its "Wall of Champions" lockerroom project, which showcases the Bulldogs' 2002-03 CCHA Championship title along with various regular-season tournament titles won in the program's history, most recently back-to-back (2004-05) Badger Hockey Showdown crowns. The FSU Blueline Club provided financial assistance to the project.

➤ **A November Analysis** – Ferris State is operating at 14.8% (8-54) efficiency on its power-play opportunities and is at 75.9% (44-58) in penalty-kill situations in its last eight November appearances dating back to last season. The Bulldogs have averaged 3.00 goals per game (24 total) while the opposition is averaging 3.63 goals (29 total) during that span.

➤ **All Tied Up** – Ferris State recorded its third tie in seven games this campaign after skating to a 3-3 overtime deadlock against Alaska Fairbanks last Saturday. The last time FSU participated in as many extra-session contests this early in a season was in 2000-01 when the Bulldogs played in three consecutive overtime encounters (0-1-2) in their first five games. Ferris State, which competed in eight extra-session games in that particular season, finished the 2000-01 campaign at 13-20-5 overall and 9-15-4 in the CCHA.

➤ **Home Cookin'** – **Greg Rallo** is the Bulldogs' top points leader at home this season with three points (1-2-3) in as many contests. He has accumulated 36 career points (14-22-36) in 56 home appearances which accounts for 48.6% of his total scoring production. Sophomore right wing **Matt Stefanishon (Daysland, Alberta)** has scored 54.2% of his 24 career points (15-9-24) at home. He has 13 career points (9-4-13) in 19 home outings, including 11 points (7-4-11) in 15 games last year.

➤ **Touted Performer In Net** – Freshman goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe (Almont, Ontario)**, who was the CCHA's Rookie of the Week (10/24), was rated as the eighth-best incoming freshmen goaltender by *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) for this season. O'Keefe is 1-1-1 with a 2.92 goals-against average (nine goals allowed) and a .910 save percentage (91 saves) in his last three outings after generating a 1-0-2 mark with a 2.21 goals-against average (seven allowed) and an .889 save percentage (56 saves) in his initial three appearances this campaign.

➤ **Impressive Frosh Class** – Ferris State's incoming freshmen class for the 2005-06 season is ranked 10th best among the nation's top 15 recruiting classes according to *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) 2005 Recruiting Rankings. Besides O'Keefe, freshman right wing **Dan Riedel (Rochester Hills)** was listed seventh on INCH's Top 20 Incoming Forward Rankings while frosh defenseman **Chris Zarb (Waterford)** landed into 11th place on the top 15 incoming defensemen chart.

## HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 14th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2005-06 campaign, Daniels ranked 19th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.
