### FERRIS STATE HOSTS OHIO STATE IN CCHA PLAYOFF'S FIRST ROUND

**THIS WEEK:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team begins Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Playoff First-Round action this weekend (March 3-5) against the Ohio State University Buckeyes in a best-of-three series at Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs are seeded seventh while the Buckeyes are the 10th seed.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday, Saturday & Sunday (if necessary) - 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Robert L.

Ewigleben (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) Ice Arena (2,493).

**TELEVISION BROADCAST:** This Friday's (March 3) game will be televised live on FSN Detroit and FSN Ohio. Calling the action will be Matt Shepard with Fred Pletsch serving as the analyst and Shireen Saski the rinkside reporter.

**RADIO BROADCAST:** All of Ferris State's 2005-06 CCHA Playoff games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the action. The contests can be accessed live via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcasts icon at [www.ferris.edu/sports](http://www.ferris.edu/sports).

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State is currently 15-13-8 overall and 10-11-7 in the CCHA after registering a 4-3 overtime regular-season finale victory versus nationally-ranked Michigan last Saturday (Feb. 25) in CCHA action at UM's Yost Ice Arena in Ann Arbor, Mich. Ferris State, which is 7-7-4 in its last 18 outings to date, is among other teams receiving votes in this week's (Feb. 27) *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* poll.

● Last season, Ferris State was 13-22-4 overall with a 10th place-tying 7-17-4 CCHA mark.

**Ohio State** finished the regular season at 15-17-5 overall and 11-14-3 in the CCHA as a result of suffering a pair of league losses to Northern Michigan last weekend (Feb. 24-25) at NMU's Berry Events Center in Marquette, Mich. The Buckeyes dropped a 4-1 decision to the Wildcats in last Friday's (Feb. 24) series opener and then were dealt a 4-2 loss in Saturday's (Feb. 25) finale. Ohio State also was among other teams receiving votes in this week's (Feb. 27) *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* poll. The Buckeyes, who are 6-10-0 on the road this season, are 2-6-1 in their last nine outings to date.

● A season ago, Ohio State compiled a 27-10-4 overall mark with a second-place 21-5-2 CCHA record. OSU qualified for the NCAA Tournament for the third consecutive season.

**THE COACHES:** Ferris State - **Bob Daniels**

(Michigan State, 1982), 14th season, 223-262-48 (.463) - (16-26-2 vs. Ohio State - 11-9-2 Home, 5-16-1 Away, and 0-1-0 Neutral). **Ohio State - John Markell** (Bowling Green State, 1979), 11th season, 215-190-37 (.528) - (23-13-2 vs. Ferris State).

**ABOUT OHIO STATE:** Sophomore forward Tom Fritsche (11-19-30), a 2004-05 CCHA All-Rookie selection, is tops among 13 skaters in double-figure points this season. Junior forward Andrew Schembri (12-11-23) along with junior defenseman Sean Collins (7-9-16), a 2004-05 All-CCHA Honorable Mention pick, and sophomore forward Domenic Maiani (5-13-18) are other top points leaders for the Buckeyes as are junior forward Mathieu Beaudoin (8-8-16) and senior forward Rod Pelley (7-7-14), a 2004-05 All-CCHA Second-Team honoree. Senior goaltender Dave Caruso (13-16-5, 2.16 GAA, .914sv%) ranks 12th nationally this week in goals-against-average. Ohio State is listed 10th among the nation's top scoring defenses (2.35 gpg).

- ♦ **Better Than Before** – Ferris State's 15 victories to date this season (15-13-8 overall) surpasses the team's win total from all of last season (13-22-4 overall).
- ♦ **Fit To Be Tied** – The Bulldogs' eight ties this campaign represents a school single-season record, eclipsing the previous Bulldog mark set by the 1991-92 squad which finished 13-18-7 overall with a sixth-place 11-15-6 CCHA record under former head coach Bob Mancini.
- ♦ **Close Encounters** – 17 of Ferris State's last 21 contests have been decided by two goals or less as the Bulldogs are 7-6-4 (.529) in those contests. Nine of the last 15 outings have been determined by a single goal or less, which includes the last five games to date (1-2-2 record).
- ♦ **Consistent Skater** – Junior left wing **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alberta)** has notched at least a point in eight of his last 12 contests while accumulating 11 points (6-5-11) during that span. Bomersback's 30 points (15-15-30) in 36 outings this season is a career best, surpassing his 23 points (7-16-23) in 39 games for the 2004-05 campaign.
- ♦ **Clutch Performer** – Junior right wing **Zac Pearson (White Lake)** has been a key Ferris performer in overtime contests over the last two seasons. Pearson accounted for the game winner in a 1-0 overtime win at Ohio State last season (3/12) in CCHA Playoff action to force a series' deciding third game and notched the game-winning tally in overtime at Michigan this last Saturday (2/25) to secure a home-ice first-round play-off berth for the Bulldogs. Pearson was a tri-recipient of FSU's Most Improved Player Award last season.
- ♦ **Shooting Display** – The Bulldogs have outshot their opponents in nine of the last 10 contests, including the past two games to date. Ferris is averaging 32.7 shots on goal (327 total) to the opposition's 25.9 shots on net (259 total) during that 10-game period.
- ♦ **Let's Be Frank** – Redshirt freshman center **Matt Frank (Billings, Mont.)** snapped a 20-game non-goal streak with a third-period lamplighter at Michigan last Saturday (2/25). Prior to that goal, the last time Frank recorded a marker was at Nebraska-Omaha earlier this season (12/2).
- ♦ **Back To Full Strength** – Junior defenseman **Jeremy Scherlinck (Grosse Pointe)** has compiled four points (1-3-4) in his last five outings to date. He recorded three points (2-1-3) in his first 21 contests this season and went 14 games (12/10-2/10) without a point until an assist at Notre Dame (2/11). Scherlinck, a 2002-03 CCHA All-Rookie Honorable Mention selection, missed the 2004-05 season due to a back injury and was sidelined 10 games this season with a shoulder injury suffered in the season opener against New Hampshire (10/14) at the Mutual of Omaha Maverick Stampede Tourney in Omaha, Neb. He has been nominated for the CCHA's Terry Flanagan Memorial Award which is presented to a league player who has overcome adversity through perseverance and determination.
- ♦ **Rallo Inching Up FSU Record Book** – Senior center **Greg Rallo (Gurnee, Ill.)** currently ranks tied for 29th place with Ed Turner (50-56-106; 1976-79) in Ferris State's record book with 106 career points (45-61-106) in 148 contests. The assistant captain is four points shy of tying Rod Taylor (77-33-110; 1987-90) for 28th place. Rallo's 45 career lamplighters is 26th highest on the Bulldogs' all-time goal-scoring list. He's one marker away from tying Jeff Jestadt (46 goals; 1988-92) for 25th place and needs three more goals to move into a 24th-place tie with Joel Irwin (48 goals; 1995-98). Rallo's seven game-winning goals presently ties him with six others for 16th place on Ferris' career leaders list.
- ♦ **Best For Last** – **Greg Rallo** is midst his best season ever in a Ferris State uniform with a career single-season best 37 points (16-21-37) in 36 games. He posted a previous high 29 points (15-14-29) as a freshman in 2002-03 en route to receiving FSU's Rookie of the Year honors.

## HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 14th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2005-06 campaign, Daniels ranked 19th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

• **CCHA Playoff History** – Ferris is 14-43-3 (.258) all-time in CCHA Playoff action, which includes a 12-37-3 record (.259) in first-round competition. The Bulldogs are 6-0-0 at home, 6-39-0 on the road, and 2-4-0 at neutral sites. Ferris State is 2-7-2 all-time versus Ohio State in the CCHA Playoffs and took the Buckeyes to a deciding third game in last season's (3/11-13) first-round series at OSU's Value City Arena in Columbus, Ohio. Ohio State posted a 4-2 victory in game one (3/11) before the Bulldogs tied the series at 1-1 on junior right wing Zac Pearson's overtime goal at 1:09 into the extra session in a 1-0 Ferris victory in game two (3/12). The Buckeyes won the series in the decisive third game (3/13) by overcoming a 4-2 deficit midway through the third period with two unanswered lamp-lighters. The game winner came at 4:40 into overtime off the stick of John Dingle.

• **Playoff Hosts** – The last time Ferris hosted a CCHA Playoff First-Round series was back in the 2002-03 season (3/14-15) when the Bulldogs swept Lake Superior State in two games by a pair of 6-1 scores.

• **At Home This Season** – Ferris State is averaging 3.00 goals per home contest this season (48 total) to its opponent's 2.50 markers (40 total) in 16 home encounters to date. The Bulldogs are operating at 20.0% (22-110) on the power play and 85.6% (77-90) in penalty-kill efficiency. FSU has outscored the opposition 31-28 (+3 goals) in the opening two periods and has a 17-12 goals advantage in the third period. Ferris has outshot the opposition by 99 shots on goal (567-468) this campaign at home.

• **Top Three Scorers** – Ferris State's top three points leaders this season, **Greg Rallo** (16-21-37), **Mark Bomersback** (15-15-30) and **Dan Riedel** (8-19-27) have combined for 33.2% (94-283) of the squad's points production and 35.5% (39-110) of its goal-scoring output.

• **A Year Ago** – **Greg Rallo** (0-7-7) is the Bulldogs' top returning points producer in March outings for the 2004-05 campaign. The assistant captain had six points (4-2-6) in nine 2002-03 contests.

• **Silver Anniversary** – Ferris' national anthem singer **Rachel Schumann** was presented with a plaque prior to last Friday's (2/24) game against Michigan recognizing her 25 years of service singing the anthem at Bulldog home hockey games. Dr. Schumann, a professor at FSU, has produced two musical CDs and is the president of the Mecosta County Council for the Arts.

• **Top March Scorers** – **Greg Rallo** (6-10-16, 18 GP) and **Jeremy Scherlinck** (0-5-5, 13 GP) are Ferris State's current leading scorers in all-time March games.

• **Historic Season** – Ferris State's 31-10-1 overall record in the 2002-03 campaign represented the best mark ever in the program's history at the NCAA-I level. The 1979-80 squad under Rick Duffett compiled a 26-11-1 overall record (11-9-0 CCHA), which marked the Bulldogs' first season as a CCHA member. FSU was the nation's first team to reach the 30-win plateau and participated in the NCAA Championship Tournament for the first-time ever, losing 7-4 in the West Regional Final to 2002-03 National Champion Minnesota in Minneapolis, Minn. Ferris also claimed its first-ever CCHA Regular-Season Championship title in 2002-03 with a first-place 22-5-1 league record (45 league points).

• **Season Comparison** – In its initial 36 games this season, Ferris is averaging 3.06 (110 goals) per game to the opposition's 2.89 (104 goals). A season ago in the same span, the Bulldogs averaged 2.97 (107 goals) compared to the opponent's 3.39 (122 goals). FSU is at 18.3% (46-252) efficiency on the power play this season and was at 14.4% (33-229) last season. Ferris is operating at 84.9% (186-219) in penalty-kill situations after posting an 82.4% (206-255) rating a season ago. The Bulldogs have been assessed 648 minutes in penalties compared to 801 last season for 153 minute differential.
