FERRIS RETURNS TO THE ICE FOR WELLS FARGO DENVER CUP

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will be competing in the 14th annual Wells Fargo Denver Cup this weekend (Dec. 30-31) in Denver, Colo. FSU battles the Boston College Eagles in Friday's (Dec. 30) semifinal-round opener while the Princeton Tigers skate against the host Denver Pioneers in the second semifinal contest. The tournament's third-place and championship games will be conducted Saturday (Dec. 31).

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 6:07 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 6:07 or 9:07 p.m. (EST)/Magness Ice Arena (6,026). **BROADCAST INFORMATION:** No radio broadcast is scheduled for the Wells Fargo Denver Cup games. Both Saturday's (Dec. 31) third-place and championship tournament contests will be televised live on FSN Rocky Mountain (DirecTV channel 645).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 8-6-4 overall and 4-4-4 in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) to date this season. The Bulldogs are 2-3-0 in their last five outings and 6-4-0 in the last 10 appearances. FSU is ranked 20th in the *Inside College Hockey* poll and is among teams receiving votes in the *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* poll. Last season, Ferris State was 13-22-4 overall with a 10th place-tying 7-17-4 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 4-12-2 at home, 8-10-2 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites.

Boston College, which is 9-4-1 overall and 8-2-1 in the Hockey East Association, currently ranks fourth nationally by both *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine*. The Eagles are listed eighth in the *Inside College Hockey* poll. BC swept a home-and-home series against Massachusetts (Dec. 9-10).

Denver, the two-time defending national champions, is 11-7-2 overall and 8-4-2 in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA). The Pioneers posted a pair of league wins at Minnesota-Duluth (Dec. 16-17) and have won six of their last seven. UD, which is ranked as high as 11th by *Inside College Hockey*, has won the last five Denver Cup championships.

Princeton is 4-10-0 overall and 2-8-0 in the ECAC. The Tigers, who are 2-3-0 in their last five games, split a non-league home series with Alabama-Huntsville in their most recent action (Dec. 16-17) at the Hobey Baker Rink in Princeton, N.J. Princeton finished third in the 1993 Denver Cup.

Princeton – Guy Gadowsky (Colorado College, 1989), 2nd season, 12-30-3 (.300); Career: 7th season, 80-119-25 (.413).

ABOUT BOSTON COLLEGE: The Eagles are led in scoring by senior forward Chris Collins (12-9-21) and sophomore forward Dan Bertram (5-10-15). Junior forward Brian Boyle (4-10-14) and freshman forward Nathan Gerbe (6-4-10) also have double figure points. Sophomore Cory Schneider (9-4-1, 2.28 GAA, .911sv%) has been BC's only goaltender this season. The Eagles are 11th among the national leaders in scoring defense (2.36 gpg.) while Schneider ranks 16th nationally in goals-against average.

ABOUT DENVER: Sophomore forward Paul Stastny (5-23-28), the 2004-05 WCHA Rookie of the Year, and junior defenseman Matt Carle (8-19-27), a 2004-05 unanimous first-team All-America selection, are among six Pioneers in double-figure points. Sophomore Ryan Dingle (14-8-22), senior forward Gabe Gauthier (8-13-21), a 2004-05 second-team All-America honoree, and freshman defenseman Chris Butler (6-8-14) are other top points leaders. Junior goaltender Glenn Fisher (5-3-2, 2.37 GAA, .911sv%) has shared netminding duties with sophomore Peter Mannino (6-4-0, 2.42 GAA, .909sv%). DU is tied for 13th place nationally in scoring defense (2.50 gpg.)

ABOUT PRINCETON: Junior forward Grant Goeckner-Zoeller (6-4-10) is the lone skater with a double-digit point total for the Tigers. Freshman forward Brett Wilson (5-4-9) and junior defenseman Kevin Westgarth (2-7-9) are also among the team's leading scorers. Senior Eric Leroux (2-6-0, 2.42 GAA, .922sv%) along with junior B.J. Sklapsky (2-2-0, 3.01 GAA, .911sv%) and freshman Thomas Sychterz (0-2-0, 3.47 GAA, .875sv%) are the goaltenders. Leroux ranks 14th nationally in save percentage.

THE SERIES: Ferris State is 0-1-0 in its all-time series against Boston College as a result of suffering a 9-6 loss to the Eagles at the Minnesota-Duluth Holiday Classic (12/28/83). The Bulldogs have never played against Denver or Princeton.

☛ **Senior Shining**— Senior right wing **Greg Rallo (Gurnee, Ill.)** has compiled 17 points (9-8-17) in his last 10 contests, which includes six multi-point game efforts. Rallo, who needs seven more points (10-12-22) to match his career high of 29 points (15-14-29) set in his 2002-03 freshman campaign, has accumulated 91 career points (39-52-91) in 130 contests. Rallo is 11 goals shy of moving into a 20th-place tie with Tom Rudrud (1979-83) and Ed Turner (1976-80) among the school's all-time goal-scoring leaders. Rudrud tallied 50 markers in 141 career outings while Turner competed in 84 games.

☛ **So Far, So Good** — Ferris State's 12 league points in 12 CCHA games this season is six shy of matching its entire 18 points league total (7-17-4 record) for the 2004-05 campaign.

☛ **Scoring Leaders** — The Bulldogs' top three points leaders this season — **Greg Rallo** (10-12-22), junior left wing-center **Mark Bomersback** (7-10-17), and freshman center **Dan Riedel** (3-13-16) have combined to produce 34.2% (55-161) of the squad's points output and 31.7% (20-63) of the team's goal-scoring production. Riedel, who was named the seventh-best incoming freshman forward by *Inside College Hockey (INCH)*, will miss this weekend's tournament due to illness.

☛ **Top Tourney Performers** — Junior left wing **Matt Verdone** (4-0-4) and junior right wing **Zac Pearson** (0-4-4) are the Bulldogs' top points leaders in regular-season tournament outings this season while freshman goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe** is 1-0-0 with a 2.00 goals-against average and a .846 save percentage. Pearson has a team-high eight career points (2-6-8) in six regular-season tourney appearances and Verdone's six points (4-2-6) in five games ranks second best on the team. Verdone was the Bulldogs' lone selection on the 2005 Mutual of Omaha Maverick Stampede All-Tournament Team.

☛ **Ferris State At The Denver Cup** — The Bulldogs have appeared once before at the Wells Fargo Denver Cup, garnering third-place honors with a 3-2 win over Air Force (12/30/00) after falling 4-2 to Providence in the tourney's opener (12/29).

☛ **Regular-Season Tournaments** — Ferris State is 16-15-2 all-time (.515) in regular-season tournaments to date with head coach **Bob Daniels** sporting a 12-8-0 mark in tourney play. The Bulldogs began this season (10/14-15) competing in the Mutual of Omaha Maverick Stampede in Omaha, Neb. FSU dropped a 4-2 to New Hampshire in the tourney's opener (10/14) before recording a 5-2 triumph over Army (10/15) to claim third-place honors.

☛ **Two-Time Holiday Tourney Champions** — The Bulldogs became the first visiting team to win the Badger Hockey Showdown title in back-to-back years (2004-05) after posting a 5-3 victory over host Wisconsin last season (1/1/05). Ferris skated to a 3-1 triumph over the host Badgers in the 2004 championship contest. FSU claimed the 1999 Silverado Shootout (12/27-28) in Duluth, Minn., with victories over Boston University (4-3) and Northeastern (4-0). The Bulldogs were the Mariucci Classic champions in 1993 (1/2-3) as a result of a 6-4 win over host Minnesota and a 4-1 decision against St. Lawrence.

☛ **Impressive Frosh Class** — Ferris State's freshmen class prior to the 2005-06 season was ranked 10th best among the nation's top 15 recruiting classes by *Inside College Hockey*. **Mitch O'Keefe** was tabbed eighth nationally for the top incoming rookie goaltenders by *INCH*.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 14th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2005-06 campaign, Daniels ranked 19th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.
