2005-06: Talented offensive playmaker . . . A smart, heady player . . . Has the ability to emerge as one of the CCHA's better offensive players . . . Sets up teammates well in scoring chances . . . Will receive extensive ice time both in power-play and penalty-kill situations . . . Quiet leader on the squad . . . Should once again center one of the Bulldogs' top lines . . . Has a good grasp of the game's concepts.

2004-05: Saw action in all 39 games and his 23 points ranked third highest on the squad . . . Placed fourth on team with four multi-point game performances . . . Notched two points (1-1-2) at Bemidji State (10/23), (2-0-2) against Connecticut (11/13), (0-2-2) at Western Michigan (12/3), and (1-1-2) versus Western Michigan (12/4) . . . Tallied the game winner at Bemidji State (10/23) . . . Was fourth in team power-play points with 11 total (4-7-11) . . . Registered at least a point in 19 contests and accumulated five points (1-4-5) in a three-game period (11/20-12/4) . . .

Began season scoring in five of first six outings and totaled six points (1-5-6) in that span . . . 14 (60.9%) of his season's points were in the CCHA . . . Notched a point in seven outings (3-4-7) of a 10-game stretch (1/1-2/4).

2003-04: Skated in 37 of team's 38 contests and had at least a point in 14 games . . . Tabbed FSU's Rookie of the Year after pacing Bulldog freshmen in scoring . . . Placed tied for seventh among team's points leaders . . . His four multi-point games tied for the sixth best on the squad . . . Scored twice against Alaska Fairbanks (1/2) . . . Tallied a game-tying goal at Bowling Green State (12/6) with three seconds left in regulation . . . Recorded a combined 11-point total (5-6-11) in an 11-game period . . . Scored five goals in six-game span (11/29-1/2) . . . Picked up two assists on as many occasions – at Nebraska-Omaha (1/7) and against Western Michigan (1/30).

HIGH SCHOOL/JUNIOR: 2002-03 RBC Financial Group Canadian Junior 'A' Player of the Year . . . Four-year (1999-03) member of the Alberta Junior Hockey League's Canmore (Alberta) Eagles . . . Coached by Bob Miller . . . AJHL's all-time leading scorer with 396 career points (143-253-396) in 250 contests for Canmore/Bow Valley . . . AJHL's MVP and was the league's scoring champion in 2002-03 . . . Registered 46 goals and a league-best 68 assists for 114 points in 64 2003-03 contests as the Eagles went 45-16-3 overall . . . A '02-03 first-team AJHL pick and top scorer at the AJHL All-Star Game Skills Competition . . . Tied a league mark with his third consecutive 100-point season in '02-03 . . . 2001-02 team MVP and received the team's Players Choice Award . . . Racked up a team-high 107 points (43-64-107) in 62 2001-02 outings while being named a tri-recipient of the Eagles' Source For Sports Player of the Year Award . . . Chosen Bow Valley's 1999-00 Rookie of the Year with 69 points (18-51-69).
