### FERRIS STATE TO DEFEND ITS BADGER HOCKEY SHOWDOWN TITLE

**THIS WEEK:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will have an opportunity to defend its Badger Hockey Showdown championship title as the Bulldogs will be participating in the 16th annual event this weekend (Dec. 31-Jan. 1) at Madison, Wis. FSU will take on the Clarkson Golden Knights in Friday's (Dec. 31) semifinal-round opener while the Yale Bulldogs skate against the nationally-ranked and host Wisconsin Badgers in the second semifinal contest. The third-place and championship games will be held Saturday (Jan. 1).

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday – 5:07 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 5:07 or 8:07 p.m. (EST)/Kohl Center (15,237).

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State is presently 6-10-2 overall and 3-7-2 in the CCHA. The Bulldogs are 4-2-2 in their last eight contests to date.

◆ A season ago, FSU was 15-20-3 overall with a 10th-place 10-17-1 mark in the CCHA. The Bulldogs were 10-6-2 at home, 4-14-1 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites in 2003-04.

Clarkson is 4-11-2 overall with an 11th-place 1-5-1 record in the Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC). In their most recent action (Dec. 10-11), the Golden Knights went 1-0-1 in a non-league home series against Ohio State at CU's Cheel Arena in Potsdam, N.Y. CU skated to a 3-3 overtime deadlock in the initial game before claiming a 3-1 victory. The Golden Knights are 1-5-1 in their last seven appearances.

Wisconsin, which is presently ranked fourth in all three national polls, stands at 13-5-0 overall with a first-place 10-4-0 mark in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA). The Badgers, who are 8-2-0 in their last 10 outings, split a league series versus Minnesota-State Mankato in their most recent action (Dec. 10-11) at MSU's Midwest Wireless Civic Center in Mankato, Minn. UW suffered a 4-3 overtime setback in the series opener before recording a 3-2 decision over the Mavericks in the finale.

Yale is 1-11-0 overall and 1-9-0 (11th place) in the ECAC. The Bulldogs dropped a pair of league road contests to Cornell and Colgate in their most recent action (Dec. 3-4). Yale was dealt a 6-2 loss by Cornell at CU's Lynah Rink in Ithaca, N.Y., and then fell 4-1 to Colgate at CU's Starr Rink in Hamilton, N.Y. The Bulldogs' lone triumph was a 7-1 league home decision over Princeton (11/27).

**BOB DANIELS:** The Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the 2002-03 American Hockey Coaches Association's (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored in 2002-03 as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)*. Daniels, who ranked 20th among active NCAA-I coaches in

overall victories entering the 2004-05 season, is FSU's all-time winningest coach. Daniels is tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA victories with a 145-178-33 (.454) mark. Daniels picked up his 200th career win this campaign with a 6-2 home victory over Western Michigan (12/4).

**THE COACHES:** Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 13th season, 201-237-38 (.462) – (1-1-0 vs. Clarkson; 1-0-0 vs. Wisconsin; 0-0-0 vs. Yale). **Clarkson – George Roll** (Bowling Green State, 1986), 2nd season, 22-29-7 (.439); Career: 9th season, 141-103-23 (.571) – (0-0-0 vs. Ferris State); **Wisconsin – Mike Eaves** (Wisconsin, 1978), 3rd season, 48-41-12 (.535) – (0-1-0 vs. Ferris State); **Yale – Tim Taylor** (Harvard, 1963), 27th season, 323-399-50 (.451) – (0-0-0 vs. Ferris State).

**ABOUT CLARKSON:** The Golden Knights are led by senior left wing Ben Walter (7-8-15) and senior right wing Chris Blight (4-11-15). Senior left wing Mac Faulkner (7-7-14) and sophomore right wing Brodie Rutherglen (4-6-10) also have double figure points. In goal, junior Dustin Traylen (2-7-1, 2.68 GAA, .907sv%) is the regular while sophomore Kyle McNulty (0-3-1, 3.24 GAA, .885sv%) and freshman David Leggio (2-1-0, 4.30 GAA, .877sv%) have received limited action.

**ABOUT WISCONSIN:** Sophomore forward Robbie Earl (10-14-24), a 2003-04 All-WCHA Rookie Team pick, leads nine Badgers in double-digit points. Freshman forward Joe Pavelski (7-14-21), sophomore forward Ross Carlson (9-8-17) and sophomore center Jake Dowell (9-6-15) are other top points leaders. Senior goaltender Brend Bruckler (10-4-0, 2.41 GAA, .914sv%) was both a first-team All-America and first-team All-WCHA selection last season. UW has won nine Badger Hockey Showdown titles to date.

**ABOUT YALE:** The Bulldogs have two skaters with double-digit point totals in sophomore forward Brad Mills (3-9-12) and junior forward Jeff Hristovski (3-7-10). Junior Josh Gartner (0-8-0, 4.91 GAA, .878sv%) along with sophomore Matt Modelski (1-2-0, 4.77 GAA, .877sv%) and senior Peter Cohen (0-1-0, 5.40 GAA, .769sv%) are the goaltenders.

**THE SERIES:** Ferris State and Clarkson are tied at 1-1-0 iwith each team prevailing on its home ice. CU won 5-4 in the 1998-99 season (12/12) and then dropped a 3-2 decision to Ferris State the following campaign (11/27). The Bulldogs are 1-2-0 against Wisconsin, dropping a pair of road contests (8-2 and 4-2) in the 1980-81 season (11/7-8/80) before winning last year's (12/28) Badger Hockey Showdown by a 3-1 margin. FSU and Yale have yet to skate against one another.

**BULLDOG BITES:** Senior center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ontario)** has compiled 17 career points (10-7-17) in as many December games while senior right wing **Derek Nesbitt's (Egmondville, Ontario)** 15 points (7-8-15) in 17 outings is second highest on the team . . . **Nesbitt (3-4-7)** and sophomore left wing **Mark Bomersback (3-4-7)** are the Bulldogs' leading scorers in six non-league outings this campaign. Nesbitt has a current five-game point streak (3-4-7) in those non-league encounters . . . The Bulldogs have either outshot or tied the opposition in shots on goal the last eight contests to date. FSU has a 316-210 shot advantage and is averaging 39.5 shots on net during that eight-game span . . . Two of sophomore left wing **Matt Verdone's (Summerstown, Ontario)** career-high three goals this

season have been game winners, including the game-winning lamplighter in a 2-1 triumph at Miami (12/11) . . . Senior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alberta)** became the school's all-time leader in career games played by a goaltender at Miami (12/10) by appearing in his 118th career contest. Brown surpassed Rob Hughston's (1981-85) 117th-game career total. Brown is FSU's career leader in victories (59), saves (3,084), shutouts (nine) and minutes played (6,767) . . . **Derek Nesbitt** ranks 19th among Ferris' all-time assists leaders with 70 helpers in 134 career games and is four away from tying Tom Rudrud (1979-83) for 18th place. Rudrud compiled 74 assists in 141 career outings . . . **Jeff Legue** is two points shy of tying Murray Winnicki (1985-89) for 14th place on FSU's all-time points leaders list. Legue has 130 career points (54-76-130) in 131 contests while Winnicki had a 132-career point total (36-96-132) in 109 outings.

**BULLDOGS GARNER LEAGUE HONORS:** Freshman goaltender **Derek MacIntyre (Stanwood)** and freshman defenseman **Adam Welch (Hastings, Minn.)** were recognized as the CCHA's Goaltender and Rookie of the Week, respectively, for Dec. 13. MacIntyre turned aside a career-high 34 shots in the Bulldogs' 2-1 win at Miami (Ohio) for their first conference road victory of the season. Welch posted a +4 plus/minus rating in the Miami series and scored his first collegiate goal while serving as part of a penalty-killing unit which successfully killed all 10 RedHawk power-play chances.

**TOURNAMENT NOTES:** Ferris State is 13-14-2 all-time in regular-season tourney contests to date with head coach Bob Daniels sporting a 9-7-0 record in tournament play. A season ago, the Bulldogs captured their first tourney championship since 1999 with a 3-1 triumph over Wisconsin to win the 15th annual Badger Hockey Showdown. The victory ended the nation's longest undefeated streak as Wisconsin went 15 games (11-0-4) without a loss prior to the championship contest. FSU advanced to the championship game after besting Massachusetts-Lowell, 7-4, in the tourney's opening round. Ferris State goaltender **Mike Brown** was selected
