FSU SKATES AGAINST LAKE SUPERIOR STATE ON THE ROAD THIS WEEK

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team returns to Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) play this weekend (Nov. 19-20) versus the Lake Superior State University Lakers in a two-game set at Sault Ste. Marie, Mich. The series marks the only regular-season meetings between the two teams in the 2004-05 season.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST) and Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Taffy Abel Arena (4,000).

FSU TICKET INFORMATION: Tickets for all 2004-05 FSU home games are available by contacting the Ewingleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (ET) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (ET).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State improved to 4-8-0 overall and remains 1-5-0 in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) with a non-league series sweep of Connecticut last weekend (Nov. 12-13) at FSU's Ewingleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich.

◆ A season ago, FSU was 15-20-3 overall with a 10th-place 10-17-1 mark in the CCHA. The Bulldogs were 10-6-2 at home, 4-14-1 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites in 2003-04.

Lake Superior State stands at 2-6-0 overall and 2-4-0 in the CCHA following a league series split with Alaska Fairbanks last weekend (Nov. 12-13) at LSSU's Taffy Abel Arena in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich. The Lakers, who are 1-2-0 at home, 1-3-0 on the road and 0-1-0 at neutral sites this season, are 2-2-0 in their last four outings after starting the campaign with a four-game losing string.

◆ Lake Superior State posted a 9-20-7 overall record last season, which included an 11th-place 7-16-5 league mark. The Lakers were 4-8-3 at home a season ago.

BOB DANIELS: The Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the 2002-03 American Hockey Coaches Association's (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored in 2002-03 as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)*. Daniels, who ranked 20th among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering the 2004-05 season, is FSU's all-time winningest coach. Daniels is also tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA victories with a 143-176-31

(.453) bench mark.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – Bob Daniels (Michigan State, 1982), 13th season, 199-235-36 (.462) – (13-20-3 vs. Lake Superior State – Away 6-9-1, Home 7-10-2, Neutral 0-1-0).

Lake Superior State – Frank Anzalone (SUNY-Buffalo, 1978), 12th season, 216-189-35 (.531) – (21-18-3 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT LAKE SUPERIOR STATE: Junior forward Mike Adamek (2-3-5) is presently the Lakers' top scorer. Junior forward Nathan Ward (4-0-4), junior forward Jon Booras (3-1-4), sophomore forward Jeff Rainville (2-2-4), sophomore forward Trent Campbell (1-3-4) and junior forward Steve McJannet (1-3-4) are all tied for second place. Sophomore Jeff Jakaitis (1-5-0, 2.58 GAA, .920sv%) has been LSSU's primary goaltender this campaign while senior Matt Violin (1-1-0, 2.28 GAA, .930sv%) has also received action in the net. Third-year assistant coach Tim Christian played at Ferris State (1991-95).

GAMES THIS WEEK

BULLDOG BITES: Head coach **Bob Daniels**, the all-time winningest coach at Ferris State, is one victory away from registering his 200th career win and owns a current 199-235-36 bench mark . . . Senior center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ontario)** has produced six points (3-3-6) during a current team season-high four-game point streak which includes a goal and three assists from last week's home series sweep of Connecticut . . . Sophomore defenseman **Joe Van Culin (Monticello, Minn.)** has totaled a career-high five points (1-4-5) in 12 contests this campaign after compiling three points (1-2-3) in 20 outings a season ago . . . The Bulldogs had eight different skaters score a goal and eight also notched multiple points in the Connecticut series led by **Legue** (1-3-4), senior right wing **Derek**

Nesbitt (1-2-3) and **Van Culin** (1-2-3) . . . Senior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alberta)**, who has 2,994 career saves in 113 games, is 50 away from tying Rob Hughston (1981-85) as FSU's all-time saves leaders. Hughston stopped 3,044 shots on goal in his career . . . **Jeff Legue's** three helpers against Connecticut moved him into 17th place on the Bulldogs' all-time assists list with 75. He surpassed Tom Rudrud (1979-83; 74 career assists) and is one of tying Chris Kunitz (1999-03; 76 career assists) for 16th place . . . Senior defenseman **Matt York (Woodhaven)** became Ferris' all-time leader in penalty minutes in Saturday's encounter with Connecticut after being whistled twice for four minutes. York has accumulated 347 minutes on 136 career penalties in 108 contests to surpass Tim Corkery's (1986-90) total of 345 minutes in 135 outings . . . Freshman defenseman **Jim Jorgensen (Sault Ste. Marie)** tallied his first collegiate point with a goal in last Friday's contest and also added an assist while frosh netminder **Derek MacIntyre (Stanwood)** earned his first college win with a 19-save game performance . . . Sophomore left wing **Matt Verdone (Summerstown, Ontario)** has produced six points (2-4-6) in 12 outings this year to match his numbers (1-5-6) of a season ago in 27 contests . . . **Derek Nesbitt** and sophomore right wing **Zac Pearson (White Lake)** both scored a shorthanded goal last Saturday versus Connecticut. The last time FSU recorded a pair of shorties in a game was in the 2003 NCAA West Regional final at Minnesota (3/29) when Kunitz and Nesbitt accounted for the shorties in a 7-4 setback . . . **Mike Brown** is 6-1-0 all-time against Lake Superior State with a 1.31 goals against average and a .948 saves percentage in seven career appearances . . . Sophomore left wing **Mark Bomersback's (Rochester, Alberta)** two goals last Saturday matched his previous career best set last season (1/2) in home outing versus Alaska Fairbanks.
