BULLDOGS VISIT MIAMI (OHIO) IN CCHA ROAD CLASH THIS WEEK

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team visits the Miami (Ohio) University RedHawks this weekend (Dec. 10-11) in a Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) two-game series at Oxford, Ohio. The series will mark the first of two regular-season two-game sets between the teams for the 2004-05 campaign.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday & Saturday – 7:35 p.m. (EST)/Goggin Ice Arena (2,200).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is presently 5-10-1 overall and 2-7-1 in the CCHA. The Bulldogs are 3-2-1 in their last six appearances to date.

● A season ago, FSU was 15-20-3 overall with a 10th-place 10-17-1 mark in the CCHA. The Bulldogs were 10-6-2 at home, 4-14-1 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites in 2003-04.

Miami (Ohio) improved to 7-8-1 overall and is 3-6-1 in the CCHA following a non-league series sweep of Robert Morris last weekend (Dec. 3-4) at MU's Goggin Ice Arena in Oxford, Ohio. The RedHawks, who are 3-1-1 in their last five contests, claimed an 8-1 victory in last Friday's (Dec. 3) series opener and then notched a 3-0 decision in Saturday's (Dec. 4) rematch.

● Miami compiled a 23-14-4 overall record with a second-place 17-8-3 mark in the CCHA last season. The RedHawks registered a 14-2-2 home ledger in the 2003-04 campaign. MU, which finished with its third 20-win season in the last four years, made its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1996-97 as the RedHawks suffered a 3-2 overtime first-round loss to 2003-04 NCAA National Champion Denver at the NCAA West Regional in Colorado Springs, Colo.

BOB DANIELS: The Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the 2002-03 American Hockey Coaches Association's (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored in 2002-03 as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)*. Daniels, who ranked 20th among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering the 2004-05 season, is FSU's all-time winningest coach. Daniels is also tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA victories with a 144-178-32 (.452) bench mark. He claimed his school-record 120th career victory at Western Michigan with a 7-0 triumph in the 1999-00 regular-season finale (3/4). Daniels served as a graduate assistant coach at Miami in the 1986-87 season while associate head coach Drew Famulak served two seasons (1990-92) as

an assistant coach at Miami.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 13th season, 200-237-37 (.461) – (12-19-5 vs. Miami – Away 5-11-2, Home 7-7-3, Neutral 0-1-0). **Miami (Ohio) – Enrico Blasi** (Miami, 1994), 6th season, 96-97-15 (.498) – (7-4-1 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT MIAMI (OHIO): Sophomore forward Matt Christie (6-11-17) leads seven skaters in double-figure scoring. Senior forward Todd Grant (7-9-16), junior defenseman Andy Greene (3-12-15), a 2003-04 All-CCHA First-Team pick, and sophomore forward Marty Guerin (7-6-13), who earned CCHA All-Rookie Team laurels last season, are among MU's top points leaders. Sophomore Brandon Crawford-West (7-7-1, 2.29 GAA, .921sv%) is the RedHawks' top goaltender and was a CCHA All-Rookie Honorable Mention selection a season ago. Assistant coach Jeff Blashill, who's midst his third season at Miami and is the older brother of FSU volunteer assistant coach Tim Blashill, was a four-year letterwinner (1994-98) at Ferris State as a goaltender.

GAMES THIS WEEK

BULLDOG BITES: Head coach **Bob Daniels**, the Bulldogs' all-time winningest coach, earned his 200th career coaching victory with Saturday's 6-2 home win over Western Michigan . . . Senior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alberta)**, who's already Ferris' all-time leader in victories (59-50-5), became the career leader in saves with a 28-save effort in Saturday's game versus Western Michigan. Brown has amassed 3,064 career saves in 117 appearances and surpassed Rob Hughston (1981-85; 3,044 career saves) for top honors . . . Senior center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ont.)** is midst an eight-game point streak with 9-3-12 during that period. Legue is one point shy of tying 1996-97 Second-Team

All-American Andy Roach (1993-97) for 15th place among FSU's all-time points leaders. Legue has 128 career points (53-75-128) in 129 contests while Roach produced 129 points (42-87-129) in 138 games . . . Ferris State has outshot its opponent in the last six games (248-152) and is averaging 41.3 shots on goal per outing to the opposition's 25.3 average . . . Sophomore left wing **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alberta)** has five points (1-4-5) in his last three outings and is four points shy of equalling his career-high of 18 points (8-10-18) set a season ago. Bomersback has 14 points (4-10-14) in 16 games this campaign . . . Senior defenseman **Matt York (Woodhaven)** has a point (assist) in six of his last seven contests played in which includes a current three-point (0-3-3) game string . . . **Jeff Legue** and freshman right wing **Matt Stefanishion (Daysland, Alberta)** each tallied two goals in Saturday's game against Western Michigan. Previously, the last time FSU had a pair of skaters score twice in a game was last season versus Alaska Fairbanks (1/2) with junior right wing **Nick Scheible (Big Rapids)** and **Bomersback** each finding the back of the net twice . . . Senior right wing **Derek Nesbitt (Egmondville, Ontario)**, who has seven points (2-5-7) in his last six contests, is tied for 19th place among Ferris' all-time assists leaders with 69 helpers in 132 contests. Dean Cowling (1985-89) and Val Passarelli (1992-96) each posted 69 career assists in 154 and 142 games, respectively . . . Junior center **Greg Rallo (Gurnee, Ill.)** totaled his 50th career point with his first goal of this season in Friday's game. Rallo has 52 career points (23-29-52) in 89 contests . . . Sophomore left wing **Matt Verdone (Summerstown, Ontario)** has a career season-best seven points (2-5-7) in 16 outings after picking up an assist Saturday, which exceeds his six points (1-5-6) in 27 games last season . . . FSU's top three scorers this season in **Legue** (10-5-15), **Bomersback** (4-10-14) and **Nesbitt** (5-7-12) have produced 35.7% (41-115) of the team's points production and 38.8% (19-49) of its goal-scoring output.
