### FERRIS STATE RETURNS HOME TO BEGIN FOUR-GAME HOMESTEAD

**THIS WEEK:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team returns to Big Rapids, Mich., this weekend (Jan. 28-29) to begin a four-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) homestand starting with a two-game league set against the Miami (Ohio) University RedHawks.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Ewigleben Ice Arena (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493). **FSU TICKET INFORMATION:** Tickets for all 2004-05 FSU home games are available by contacting the Ewigleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (ET) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (ET).

**THE RECORDS: Ferris State** is 9-14-3 overall and 4-11-3 in the CCHA after suffering a league road series sweep by Alaska Fairbanks last weekend (Jan. 21-22) at the Carlson Center in Fairbanks, Alaska. The Bulldogs are 1-3-1 in their last five appearances after producing a 4-1-1 in the previous six contests. FSU is 4-6-1 at home this campaign.

☛ A season ago, FSU was 15-20-3 overall with a 10th-place 10-17-1 mark in the CCHA. The Bulldogs were 10-6-2 at home, 4-14-1 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites in 2003-04.

**Miami** is 9-13-4 overall and 5-10-3 in the CCHA after splitting a league series with Nebraska-Omaha last weekend (Jan. 21-22) at MU's Goggin Ice Arena in Oxford, Ohio. The RedHawks dropped a 5-2 decision to UNO last Friday (Jan. 21), but then claimed a 4-2 victory over the Mavericks last Saturday (Jan. 22). Miami, which is 2-5-3 in its last 10 outings, sports a 0-7-2 road ledger this campaign. ☛ Miami posted a 23-14-4 overall record with a second-place 17-8-3 CCHA mark last season. MU, which finished with its third 20-win season in the last four years, made its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1996-97 as the RedHawks suffered a 3-2 overtime first-round loss to 2003-04 NCAA National Champion Denver at the NCAA West Regional in Colorado Springs, Colo.

**BOB DANIELS:** The Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the 2002-03 American Hockey Coaches Association's (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored in 2002-03 as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)*. Daniels, who ranked 20th among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering 2004-05, is FSU's all-time winningest coach. Daniels is also tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA victories with a 146-182-34 (.450) bench mark. He

claimed his school-record 120th career victory at Western Michigan with a 7-0 triumph in the 1999-00 regular-season finale (3/4) and picked up his 200th career win this campaign with a 6-2 home victory over Western Michigan (12/4).

**THE COACHES: Ferris State – Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 13th season, 204-241-39 (.462) – (13-19-6 vs. Miami – Home 7-7-3, Away 6-11-3, Neutral 0-1-0). **Miami (Ohio) – Enrico Blasi** (Miami, 1994), 6th season, 98-102-18 (.491) – (7-5-2 vs. Ferris State).

**ABOUT MIAMI (OHIO):** Junior defenseman Andy Greene (4-18-22), a 2003-04 All-CCHA First-Team pick, and sophomore forward Matt Christie (8-13-21) lead nine RedHawks' skaters in double-digit points this season. Senior forward Todd Grant (9-11-20) and sophomore forward Marty Guerin (9-9-18), who attained CCHA All-Rookie Team laurels a season ago, are also among MU's top points leaders. Sophomore Brandon Crawford-West (8-11-4, 2.39 GAA, .919sv%) is Miami's top goaltender and was a CCHA All-Rookie Honorable Mention selection a season ago. The RedHawks are tied for fifth place nationally in penalty-killing percentage (.872). Assistant coach Jeff Blashill, who's midst his third season at Miami, was a four-year letterwinner (1994-98) at Ferris State as a goaltender.

### GAMES THIS WEEK

**BULLDOG BITES:** Sophomore left wing **Matt Verdone** (Sumnerstown, Ontario) recorded his second career multi-point game with a two-goal effort at Alaska Fairbanks last Friday. Verdone went 1-1-2 in the Bulldogs' season opener against Colgate (10/8) . . . Freshman center **Adam Miller** (Livonia) snapped a 19-game goal-scoring drought with a marker at UAF last Saturday. Miller tallied his first collegiate goal versus Ohio State (10/15) . . . Senior center **Jeff Legue** (5-4-9) and sophomore center **Mark Bomersback** (4-5-9) are Ferris' top points leaders at home this season while senior left wing **Derek Nesbitt** (4-4-8) ranks third on the team . . . Six of FSU's last seven outings have been

decided by two goals or less as the Bulldogs sport a 2-4-1 record . . . **Jeff Legue's** 136 career points (59-77-136) in 139 games ranks 14th among Ferris' all-time points leaders and is four shy of tying Tim Christian (1991-95; 140 career pts.) for 13th place . . . FSU's top forward line of **Derek Nesbitt** (8-13-21), **Jeff Legue** (16-7-23) and sophomore right wing **Zac Pearson** (5-7-12) have generated 30.8% (56-182) of the squad's total points output this campaign . . . **Derek Nesbitt's** two-assist performance at Alaska Fairbanks (1/22) marked the 10th of his career. The last time Nesbitt picked up a pair of helpers was versus Findlay last season (1/23) . . . Senior defenseman **Matt York** (Woodhaven) will be the subject of an upcoming Fox Sports Net (FSN) NCAA On Campus feature and will have a camera follow him this Saturday (Jan. 28). York is a certified police officer as is his father and brother. The FSU team captain is one goal away from moving into a four-way tie for 12th place among the school's all-time goal-scoring defensemen and is one assist shy of tying Troy Milam's (1999-03) ninth-place 58 career assists total. York has currently registered 72 career points (15-57-72) in 122 contests . . . **Mark Bomersback** picked up personal career-high 19th point of this campaign with an assist at Alaska Fairbanks (1/21), bettering his 18 points (8-10-18) in 37 outings a season ago. The forward has 19 points (6-13-19) in 26 games this season to date.

**TWO BULLDOGS ON HOBEY BAKER LIST:** **Jeff Legue** and **Derek Nesbitt** are among 32 Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) representatives to make the 2004-05 Hobey Baker Memorial Award's preliminary voting phase. A total of 142 players representing 38 schools received nominations from at least 25 fans during Vote for Hobey's Nominating Phrase. Preliminary Voting will run through Sunday, March 6, giving fans the opportunity to help determine the 10 finalists for the Hobey Baker Award as the nation's top collegiate player in NCAA Division I. Former 2002-03 All-American and CCHA Player of the Year Chris Kunitz was among three Hobey Baker Hat Trick finalists in 2002-03.
