### FSU FACES MICHIGAN STATE IN A CCHA HOME-AND-HOME SERIES

**THIS WEEK:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will face off against the Michigan State University Spartans this weekend (Nov. 5-6) in a Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) home-and-home series. This Friday's (Nov. 5) contest will be held at East Lansing, Mich., with Saturday's (Nov. 6) rematch taking place in Big Rapids, Mich. The series marks the only regular-season meetings between the teams for the 2004-05 campaign.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday – 8:05 p.m. (EST)/Munn Ice Arena (6,470); Saturday – 7:05 p.m.

(EST)/R.L. Ewigleben (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493). **TELEVISION COVERAGE:** This Friday's game will be televised live by FSN Detroit as part of the CCHA's Game of the Week TV package for the 2004-05 season. Ken Daniels and Fred Pletsch will be handling the play-by-play and color commentary duties, respectively.

**FSU TICKET INFORMATION:** Tickets for all 2004-05 FSU home games are available by contacting the Ewigleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (ET) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (ET).

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State is 2-6-0 overall and 1-3-0 in the CCHA to date following a league home-and-home series split with nationally-ranked Michigan last weekend (Oct. 29-30).

☛ A season ago, FSU was 15-20-3 overall with a 10th-place 10-17-1 mark in the CCHA. The Bulldogs were 10-6-2 at home, 4-14-1 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites in 2003-04.

**Michigan State** is presently 2-4-0 overall and 1-3-0 in the CCHA after gaining a split in a home league series against Nebraska-Omaha last weekend (Oct. 29-30) at MSU's Munn Ice Arena in East Lansing, Mich. The Spartans claimed a 5-2 decision over the Mavericks in last Friday's opener (Oct. 29) before dropping a 5-2 decision in Saturday's (Oct. 30) series finale.

☛ Last season, MSU registered a 23-17-2 overall mark, which included a third-place 17-9-2 CCHA ledger. The Spartans made their 23rd NCAA Tournament appearance a season ago.

**BOB DANIELS:** The Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the 2002-03 American Hockey Coaches Association's (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored in 2002-03 as the Coach of the Year by

the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)*. Daniels, who ranked 20th among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering the 2004-05 season, is FSU's all-time winningest coach. Daniels is also tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA victories with a 143-174-31 (.455) bench mark.

**THE COACHES:** Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 13th season, 197-233-36 (.461) – (8-27-5 vs. Michigan State – Away 6-16-0, Home 1-10-4, Neutral 1-1-1). **Michigan State** – **Rick Comley** (Lake Superior State, 1972), 3rd season, 48-35-4 (.575); Career: 32nd season, 645-510-75 (.555) – (40-14-2 vs. Ferris State).

**ABOUT MICHIGAN STATE:** The Spartans are paced in scoring by senior forward and two-time (2002-03 & 2003-04) All-CCHA First-Teamer Jim Slater (2-4-6) along with junior forward Colton Fretter (4-2-6). Sophomore forward Tommy Goebel (1-4-5) and sophomore defenseman A.J. Thelen (0-5-5), a 2003-04 first-team CCHA pick, are other leading point getters. Sophomore Dominic Vicari (1-3-0, 2.76 GAA, .912sv%) and senior Matt Migliaccio (1-1-0, 2.59 GAA, .901sv%) have both received action in net this season.

### GAMES THIS WEEK

Thursday, November 4

**BULLDOG BITES:** Junior right wing **Matt Rutkowski's (Sterling Heights)** first shot on net this season resulted in the game-winning goal in Saturday's 1-0 overtime home victory over Michigan.

Rutkowski's lamplighter represented the second of his career and the first gamewinner . . . With the 1-0 extra-session triumph over UM, the last five series contests in Big Rapids have been decided by one goal. FSU, which is 4-1 in that five-game period, skated to a 6-5 overtime triumph over the Wolverines last season (11/7) on Brett Smith's game-winning overtime marker . . . FSU's penalty-kill unit was a perfect 13-for-13 against Michigan last weekend and has snuffed 24-of-25 opposition

chances (95.8%) over the past three games . . . Senior center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ontario)** needs five more points to move ahead of Dean Cowling (1985-89) into 21st place on FSU's all-time points leaders list. Legue has 116 career points (44-72-116) in 121 career outings while Cowling amassed a 120-points total (51-69-120) in 154 games. Legue is also two assists shy of tying Tom Rudrud (1979-83; 74 assists) for 17th place among Ferris' career assists leaders . . . The Bulldogs' top forward line of senior left wing **Derek Nesbitt (3-2-5)**, **Legue (1-2-3)** and freshman right wing **Matt Stefanishion (3-3-6)** have accounted for 26.9% (14-52) of the team's points production and 33.3% (7-21) of the squad's goal-scoring output this season . . . Senior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alberta)**, the school's all-time winningest netminder with a 57-47-4 career record, is 135 saves away from tying Rob Hughston (1981-85; 3,044 career saves) top all-time school honors. Brown, who has 2,909 career saves to date, is averaging 26.4 saves per game in 110 career appearances . . . Head coach **Bob Daniels**, a 1982 Michigan State graduate, is three wins shy of posting his 200th career victory. He notched his 100th career win (2-1) at Michigan State in the 1998-99 regular-season finale (3/6) . . . Senior defenseman **Matt York (Woodhaven)** is 12 penalty minutes shy of tying Tim Corkery (1986-90) as the all-time penalty-minutes leader in Ferris' history. York has accumulated 333 career minutes on 129 penalties in 105 contests while Corkery totaled 345 career minutes on 156 penalties in 135 career games . . . FSU has received 28 more power plays this season in its first eight contests compared to a season ago. The Bulldogs have converted 14.3% (9-63) of their power plays this year compared to 8.6% (3-35) last season.

**BROWN PICKS UP WEEKLY LEAGUE HONOR:** **Mike Brown** has been named this week's CCHA Goaltender of the Week for his performance in last weekend's series against Michigan. Brown stopped 67-of-70 shots on net for a .957 save percentage while posting a 1.48 goals against average in 121:52 minutes of action during the two-game set. He recorded 33 saves and his school-record ninth career shutout in Saturday's 1-0 overtime win after gar-
