FERRIS STATE PUTS ITS WINNING STREAK UP AGAINST OHIO STATE

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team returns to Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) play this weekend (Jan. 7-8) as the Bulldogs put their three-game winning streak on the line against the nationally-ranked Ohio State University Buckeyes in a two-game set at Columbus, Ohio. The series represents the second and last between the two teams for the 2004-05 regular season.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday - 8:05 p.m. (EST) & Saturday - 7:35 p.m. (EST)/Value City Arena (17,500). **TELEVISION COVERAGE:** This Friday's game will be televised live by College Sports Television (CSTV). Dave Starman will call the play-by-play with Billy Jaffe serving as a color analyst.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State, which has a five-game unbeaten streak (4-0-1), is currently 8-10-2 overall with a 3-7-2 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs became the first visiting team to win the Badger Hockey Showdown title in back-to-back years after besting Wisconsin (3-1) last year and (5-3) last Saturday (Jan. 1) at UW's Kohl Center in Madison, Wis.

➤ A season ago, FSU was 15-20-3 overall with a 10th-place 10-17-1 mark in the CCHA. The Bulldogs were 10-6-2 at home, 4-14-1 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites in 2003-04.

Ohio State is 12-5-3 overall and 9-2-1 in the CCHA to date. The Buckeyes finished runner-up in the inaugural Ohio Hockey Classic last week (Dec. 29-30) at Nationwide Arena in Columbus, Ohio. OSU posted a 5-1 win over Minnesota State-Mankato in the opening game (Dec. 29) and then skated to a 2-2 tie with second-ranked Colorado College (Dec. 30) but lost in a shootout. The Buckeyes, who have a 12-game home winning streak at Value City Arena dating back to Jan. 24, 2004, are 7-2-3 in their last 12 outings. OSU is ranked in all three national polls this week, including ninth in the *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* Poll. The Buckeyes are 7-0-0 at home this campaign.

➤ Ohio State was 26-16-0 overall in the 2003-04 campaign, which included a fourth-place 16-12-0 CCHA mark. The Buckeyes were CCHA's Mason Cup champions last season for the first time since 1972 which is awarded to the champion of the CCHA's Super Six Tournament. OSU made its second straight and fourth overall NCAA Tourney appearance a season ago.

BOB DANIELS: The Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the 2002-03 American Hockey Coaches Association's (AHCA) Division I National Coach

of the Year, Daniels was also honored in 2002-03 as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)*. Daniels, who ranked 20th among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering 2004-05, is FSU's all-time winningest coach. Daniels is also tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA victories with a 144-178-32 (.452) bench mark. He claimed his school-record 120th career victory at Western Michigan with a 7-0 triumph in the 1999-00 regular-season finale (3/4) and picked up his 200th career win this campaign with a 6-2 home victory over Western Michigan (12/4).

THE COACHES: Ferris State - **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 13th season, 203-237-38 (.464) - (14-22-2 vs. Ohio State - Away 3-12-0, Home 11-9-2, Neutral 0-1-0). Ohio State - **John Markell** (Bowling Green State, 1979), 10th season, 185-167-31 (.523) - (19-11-1 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT OHIO STATE: Freshman forward Tom Fritsche (3-18-21) leads seven skaters with double-digit points totals. Junior forward Rod Pelley (11-9-20) and frosh forward Domenic Maiani (8-12-20) are also among the Buckeyes' top points leaders. Junior Dave Caruso (10-3-3, 2.27 GAA, .916sv%) and frosh Ian Keserich (2-2-0, 2.52 GAA, .902sv%) are OSU's goal-tenders. The Buckeyes rank among the nation's leaders in six statistical categories this week.

BULLDOG BITES: Ferris State placed four players on the Badger Hockey Showdown All-Tournament Team – senior center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ontario)**, senior right wing **Derek Nesbitt (Egmondville, Ontario)**, senior defenseman **Matt York (Woodhaven)** and senior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alberta)**, who

was a repeat all-tourney team pick and the Most Outstanding Player at last year's Badger Hockey Showdown . . . **Derek Nesbitt** has compiled multiple points in four of his last five contests, including a pair of two-point games at the Badger Hockey Showdown with 1-1-2 versus both Clarkson and Wisconsin. He has recorded 5-8-13 with at least a point in eight of his last 10 appearances . . . Jeff Legue has earned a point in 11 of his last 12 encounters while totaling 13-4-17 during that span. Legue also has six multi-game performances in the 12-game period . . . Junior defenseman **Andrew Winnik (Mississauga, Ontario)** tallied his initial goal of the 2004-05 season and first since his rookie year in 2002-03 with a lamplighter against Clarkson in the semifinal-round game. Winnik's first collegiate goal occurred at Niagara (1/3/03) . . . The Bulldogs' 63 goals (63-85-148) in their first 20 games this campaign equals last season's goal-scoring output (63-94-157) in the same time frame . . . Ferris State has outshot its opponents in nine of its last 10 contests and is averaging 38.5 shots on net per game (385 total) to the opposition's 25.4 (254 total). FSU's 23 shots at Miami (12/10) was equal to the RedHawks' game total . . . Sophomore right wing **Zac Pearson's (White Lake)** 11 points (5-6-11) in 20 outings this season exceeds his output of last season (2-7-9) in 31 games . . . Junior right wing **Nick Scheible (Big Rapids)** has six points (4-2-6) in 18 contests this campaign, matching his career season best total (4-2-6) of last season in 25 outings.

LEGUE RECEIVES WEEKLY AWARDS: **Jeff Legue** has selected both this week's (Jan. 3) CCHA Offensive Player of the Week and *Inside College Hockey.com* (INCH) Player of the Week for his efforts in Ferris State capturing the Badger Hockey Showdown Championship title for the second consecutive year. Legue, who totaled three points (3-0-3) in the two tourney contests, was honored as the tournament's Most Valuable Player. He scored two goals, including the game winner against host Wisconsin, and had a +3 efficiency rating in the championship game.
