FERRIS FACES WESTERN MICHIGAN IN REGULAR-SEASON FINALE

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will close out the regular-season portion of its 2004-05 schedule this weekend (March 4-5) as the Bulldogs skate against the Western Michigan University Broncos in a Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) home-and-home series. Ferris hosts WMU this Friday (March 4) in Big Rapids, Mich., before traveling to Kalamazoo this Saturday (March 5) to take on the Broncos in the series finale.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST)/R.L. Ewigleben (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493); Saturday – 7:35 p.m. (EST)/Harry W. Lawson Ice Arena (3,667).

TICKET INFORMATION: Tickets for all 2004-05 FSU home games are available by contacting the Ewigleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (ET) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (ET).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 11-19-4 overall and 6-16-4 in the CCHA following a home league series by nationally-ranked Northern Michigan last weekend (Feb. 25-26) in Big Rapids. The Bulldogs, who are 2-7-1 in their last 10 outings, are 4-11-2 at home and 6-8-2 on the road this season.

☛ A season ago, FSU was 15-20-3 overall with a 10th-place 10-17-1 mark in the CCHA. The Bulldogs were 10-6-2 at home, 4-14-1 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites in 2003-04.

Western Michigan is 12-18-2 overall and 7-17-2 in the CCHA after splitting a home league series with Lake Superior State last weekend (Feb. 25-26) at WMU's Lawson Arena in Kalamazoo. The Broncos suffered a 3-2 setback in last Friday's (Feb. 25) series opener and then snapped a four-game losing streak with a 3-2 overtime triumph in Saturday's (Feb. 26) rematch. Western, which is 2-5-1 in its last eight appearances, is 2-12-1 on the road and 10-6-1 at home this campaign.

☛ A season ago, Western Michigan posted a 17-18-4 overall mark with an eighth-place 12-13-3 CCHA record.

BOB DANIELS: The Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the 2002-03 American Hockey Coaches Association's (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored in 2002-03 as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)*. Daniels, who ranked 20th among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering 2004-05, is FSU's all-time winningest coach. Daniels is also tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA victories

with a 148-187-35 (.447) bench mark. He claimed his school-record 120th career victory at Western Michigan with a 7-0 triumph in the 1999-00 regular-season finale (3/4) and picked up his 200th career win this campaign with a 6-2 home victory over Western Michigan (12/4).

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 13th season, 206-246-40 (.459) – (16-21-2 vs. Western Michigan – Home 10-7-1, Away 5-13-1; Neutral 1-1-0). Western Michigan – **Jim Culhane** (Western Michigan, 1987), 6th season, 98-110-23 (.474) – (11-9-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT WESTERN MICHIGAN: Junior left wing Brent Walton (19-27-46) is the Broncos' top points leader among nine WMU skaters with double-figure point totals. Walton currently ranks seventh nationally in points (1.44 avg.), eighth in assists (0.84 avg.), and is tied for 13th in goals (0.59 avg.). He also is tied for top honors among the CCHA's overall points leaders. Junior center Vince Bellissimo (15-17-32) and sophomore center Paul Szczechura (5-22-27) are Western's other top scorers. Freshman goaltender Daniel Bellissimo (12-16-2, 3.46 GAA, .900sv%) has been the regular in net for the WMU, which is listed 14th nationally in power-play pct. (.203).

BULLDOG BITES: Ferris State is 20-27-3 (.430) all-time in its final two regular-season contests and is 5-7-0 in such encounters since the 1998-99 campaign . . . Senior left wing **Derek Nesbitt (Egmondville, Ontario)** has compiled 12 points (5-7-12) in his last eight outings, which includes four multi-point games . . . Sophomore defenseman **Joe Van Culin's (Monticello, Minn.)** goal last Friday against Northern Michigan was his first in 17 games, since last scoring at Western Michigan (12/3). Van Culin has produced a career-high 10 points (3-7-10) in 34 contests this season compared to three points (1-2-3) in 20 outings the previous campaign . . . The Bulldogs' top two points leaders this season, senior center **Jeff Legue (20-14-34)** and **Derek Nesbitt (13-18-31)** have combined for 26.5% (65-245) of the squad's total points production . . . Freshman center **Adam Miller (Livonia)** has registered five points (0-5-5) in his last four encounters after posting six

points (2-4-6) in his previous 27 contests this season . . . **Jeff Legue**, who has 147 career points (63-84-147) in as many games, is within three points of moving into a three-way tie for 11th place on Ferris' all-time scoring leaders list with Steve Banonis (1977-81) and Jim File (1980-84). Legue's 63 career goals is tied with Brian McCullough (1996-00) for 11th place on the Bulldogs' all-time goal-scoring chart . . . Junior right wing **Greg Rallo (Gurnee, Ill.)** has tallied a point in seven of his last eight contests while totaling seven points (4-3-7) during that span . . . **Jeff Legue** has accumulated 12 points (5-7-12) in his past nine games and has at least a point in 23 of his 32 appearances this season . . . **Jeff Legue (2-1-3)**, **Greg Rallo (2-1-3)** and **Derek Nesbitt (0-3-3)** are Ferris' top returning point getters last season in March encounters . . . Head coach **Bob Daniels** is eight games away from coaching his 500th contest behind the Bulldogs' bench. Daniels is the program's all-time winningest coach with 206 career victories . . . Sophomore center **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alberta)** tallied a team-leading four points (1-3-4) in this season's previous series against Western Michigan . . . Ferris State is midst a school-record tying eight-game home non-winning string and hasn't registered a triumph in Big Rapids since a 6-2 decision over Western Michigan (12/4). The last time FSU went winless in eight straight home contests was during the 1989-90 season (1/5-2/10) which was snapped following a 3-0 home triumph against Western Michigan (2/23) . . . **Jeff Legue's 20** goals this season represents a tie for eighth place among Ferris' all-time single-season goal scorers by a senior. Randy Merrifield (1983-84) and Doug Smith (1993-94) both racked up 20 lamplighters apiece. Legue is two shy of tying Darin Fridgen's (1987-88) seventh-place 22 markers.
