**FSU SOFTBALL FIELD – HOME OF THE BULLDOGS**

The Ferris State University softball program plays all of its home games at the FSU Softball Field.

The field was completed in the fall of 1993 in preparation for the 1994 season.

The ever-improving facility features bleacher seating for up to 250 fans along with a newly-constructed multi-level press box, which is surrounded by landscape. The press box features restrooms and a storage area. Both the home

and visitor dugouts were painted in the fall of 2001. The facility is located on the northwest end of campus and adjacent to the Frank Karas Intramural Fields.

The construction of a batting cage and pitching areas in the rightfield area in the spring will make the softball-only facility one of the best in NCAA Division II.
