The 1998 team went on to place third at the NCAA National Championships, the highest finish ever for a FSU women's athletics program at the time.



The Ferris State softball program has experienced noteworthy success on the diamond over the last decade and attained national recognition as a result of their accomplishments.

Since current head coach Keri Becker stepped onto campus in 1997, the Bulldogs have won or shared two GLIAC titles (2000 and 2005), two NCAA Regional Championships (1998-99) and qualified for the NCAA National Championship Tournament twice (1998-99). Under Becker, Ferris turned in a third-place showing at the 1998 NCAA Championship Tournament in its first-ever national tourney appearance. FSU then followed with a sixth-place effort at the 1999 NCAA Championships.

Ferris State has compiled a 12-9 record in NCAA Tourney history, which includes a 3-3 mark at the NCAA Championships.
