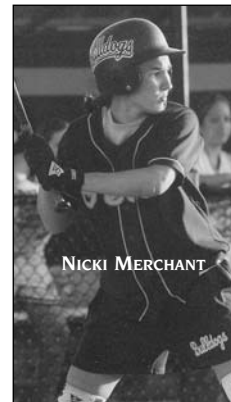

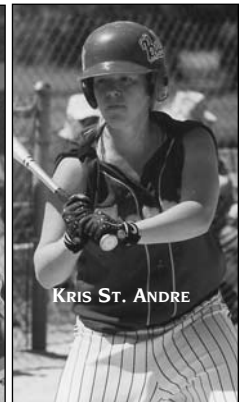

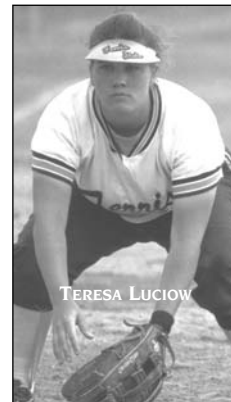

FSU SOFTBALL FIELD – HOME OF THE BULLDOGS

The Ferris State University softball team plays all of its home games at the FSU Varsity Softball Field.

The field, which is located on the northwest side of the Ferris State campus next to the Frank Karas Intramural Fields, was completed in the fall of 1993 in preparation for the 1994 season.

The facility also features bleacher seating for a capacity of 250 fans along with a newly-constructed multi-level press box, which is surrounded by landscape. The press box features restrooms and a storage area. Both the home and visitor dugouts were painted in the fall of 2001.

Construction of a batting cage and pitching areas located next to the field area in 2003 have made the softball-only facility one of the finest at the NCAA Division II level.

The field dimensions are 220 down both the left and right field lines and 240 in center field.



ACADEMICS – PRIORITY ONE!

- ◆ Ferris State has been recognized several times for its outstanding academic performance by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA), including placing fourth nationally in 2002 following a 10th-place finish the previous season. FSU placed 28th in the 2005 NFCA Division II academic team rankings.
- ◆ Nine student-athletes on the 2005 squad received Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference All-Academic Team accolades. Nominees must have at least a 3.00 GPA or above to receive the honor.
- ◆ Thirteen members on the 2005 team have posted a cumulative grade point average of 3.00 or better, including six with a 3.40 or better. The 2005 Bulldogs have a combined cumulative 3.14 GPA.
- ◆ Twenty-two percent of FSU's student-athletes carry a cumulative GPA above 3.50 and 28 percent have over a 3.00 GPA.
- ◆ Former All-American **Anne Bentley** was the Great Lakes Region female representative winner of the inaugural NCAA Division II Conference Commissioners Association Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award in 2000, which recognizes both outstanding academic and athletics success.
