



LEE ANDERSON Assistant Coach ♦ Second Season Ottawa, 1998

Lee Anderson begins his second season as the assistant women's volleyball coach at Ferris State.

A native of Renfrew (Ontario), Canada, Anderson previously served as head coach

for three seasons (2000-03) at Lakehead University in Thunder Bay, Ontario. The 29-year old Anderson assists in all phases of the program including on-floor coaching responsibilities, recruiting duties and administrative functions.

Anderson guided Lakehead to a 13-38 (.342) overall record in the Ontario University Athletics East Division during his three seasons at the helm, including a fifth-place finish in 2002-03. He also directed volleyball sport development camps and organized department media conferences during his tenure. In addition to his coaching duties, Anderson served as a practical instructor in the school's kinesiology department.

From June-July 2000, Anderson worked as a personal mental trainer for Finland's 800-meter run national

champion Wilson Kirwa. A National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP) Level III Accredited Volleyball Coach, Anderson was an assistant women's volleyball coach and professor's assistant at the University of Calgary (Alberta) in 1998-99.

Besides his collegiate coaching experience, Anderson has also coached various midget, youth and high school teams since earning a bachelor of science degree in human kinetics from the University of Ottawa (Ontario) in 1998. His previous head coaching positions included Henry Wisewood High School (1999) in Calgary, Ottawa's Immaculata High School (1995-98) along with both the Northwestern Ontario Under-18 (2002) and Under-17 (2001-02) development teams.

As a prepster, Anderson earned Most Valuable Player Award accolades three times (1990, 93-94) in volleyball at Renfrew Collegiate Institute School. The four-time (1989-94) team captain also competed in basketball, soccer, golf, tennis along with track and field. He was active in the school's choir, concert and jazz bands.

A 1994 graduate of Renfrew Collegiate Institute, Anderson attained a masters of kinesiology degree in the art and science of coaching from Calgary in 2000 and is currently working towards a masters of sport psychology degree at Lakehead.

DALE WILHELM Volunteer Assistant Coach ♦ First Season Ferris State, 1988

Dale Wilhelm is in his first season as a volunteer assistant coach at FSU.

Wilhelm, who's married to current FSU head coach Tia Brandel-Wilhelm, teaches math at Reed

City (Mich.) High School. He also presently coaches prep volleyball at Chippewa Hills (Mich.) High School.

A Minneapolis, Minn., native, Wilhelm served as Reed City's head varsity volleyball coach from 1989-2003. He guided the Coyotes to eight district and league championships during his 14 seasons at the

helm besides a Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA) Class B State Runner-up finish in 2000. His 493 victories at RCHS rank among the top 10 on the MHSAA's all-time list. In addition, Wilhelm also directed the Coyotes' junior varsity football program from 1991-94 and was the school's athletics director for two years. He has extensive camp coaching experience and has worked FSU's summer camps since 1992.

A 1988 graduate of Ferris State, Wilhelm served in the armed forces aboard a nuclear submarine for five years. He also was commissioned as an infantry officer in the U.S. Army. During his military days, Wilhelm competed for the U.S. Navy as a racquetball player and runner in interservices competition.

Wilhelm graduated from Minneapolis Southwest High School in 1974 where he participated in hockey.
