The Shoah Visual History Archive contains over 54,000 eye witness accounts of major acts of genocide in the twentieth century, with over 115,000 hours of compelling testimony from victims and rescuers. The Archive also contains a robust set of tools, assessment instruments, and ready to use modules. A built-in video-editor is also included to help students create their own presentations. In this presentation, Dr. Mehler will explore the workings of the Archive and present some examples of how it has been used in courses from Math to Nursing and Sociology.
