## **Kendall College of Art and Design Accreditation**

The National Association of Schools of Art and Design recently concluded its review of our Kendall College of Art and Design and voted for full ten-year accreditation of Kendall's status of good standing. The next review for KCAD is not scheduled until the 2020-21 academic year. Included in this vote of confidence from NASAD is acceptance of new degrees being offered by Kendall in Collaborative Design and Medical Illustration.

We will share with NASAD the need for increased academic space for Kendall, which will be available once the renovation of the former Grand Rapids Federal Building is completed. This is much needed to support the continued expansion of enrollment and programming at Kendall.

Program accreditation is an important external measure of quality. It requires significant effort in preparation for the visit. Please join me in congratulating the faculty and staff at Kendall College together with President Oliver Evans, Vice President Sandy Davidson-Wilson, and Dean Max Shangle.

### **Construction Management Success**

Three student teams excelled at the recent Region 3 competition of the Associated Schools of Construction Region 3 competition. Two teams won their respective divisions while the third placed fourth. Construction Technology Management students Charlie Alm, Jake Aranki, Mike Kozakiewicz, Brett Lesiewicz, Greg Lowe and Brandon Rhodes and faculty coach Lee Templin took first place in the Commercial Division. In just 16 hours the team had to estimate cost, do scheduling, develop safety and logistic plans, and evaluate the overall design for a Veterans Affairs outpatient clinic.

In the Design-Build division, Construction Management students Michael Baldwin, Dave Bourgeois, Kevin Clark and Jake Herron, along with Architecture students Will Hinkley and Courtney Parks, assisted by HVACR faculty member Joseph Pacella also took first place. The team had to design, estimate and schedule a LEED Silver-quality dormitory for 300-plus students, again within just 16 hours.

Ferris' Heavy-Civil Team of Construction Management students Devin Dowling, Adam Gohs, Max Hilton, Doug Miller, Mike Reilly, and Andy Schilling, coached by faculty member Dan Pratt just missed a third-place finish. They were tasked with the "outside-the-box" challenge of planning how to build a half-mile-long portion of Texas/Mexico border fence.

Congratulations to all of our students and faculty members who made such a strong showing at this competition.

### **Athletics**

In the past weeks four Ferris athletes earned All-America honors in cross country and volleyball. Following the NCAA Division II National Championships held in Spokane, Wash., on Nov. 19, cross country senior Tina Muir earned her fourth consecutive All-American honor, while junior Anna Rudd was named to the honor for the first time. The two helped the cross country team to a national eighth-place finish. Last week, seniors Ashley Huntley and Lisa Tobiczuk earned positions on the All-America teams announced by the American Volleyball Coaches Association. The volleyball team ended in first place in regular season conference play with a record of 18-1. Overall, the squad was 27-4 on the season. Congratulations to these student-athletes on this national recognition of their success!
