Meeting the United Way goal is yet another sign of the generosity of the Ferris community and the good relations our University has with the wider community.

Also, you still have time to support the Student Government's second annual Holiday Food Drive, which ends today. There are drop-off boxes for canned goods in the SG office and in residence hall lobbies. Thirty-six student organizations are taking part in the drive whose goal is to

collect more than 3,500 pounds of canned food. Between 2,500 and 3,000 pounds of food was collected last year in the drive founded by Business Administration and Pre-Law senior Robbie Rankey. This is just one of the ways in which Ferris students logged more than 30,000 hours volunteering during the 2007-08 academic year.

The cans goods will be distributed to West Michigan food banks as close to Big Rapids as possible.
