### ***Role of Parent Engagement in Reducing the Achievement Gap (2008-2010)***

***Fritz Erickson, Alan McEvoy, Robert Billby, Tara Ebey, John Vonk***

Parent involvement has often cited as central to the achievement of children. Yet, for all of the efforts to increase achievement among disaggregated populations, little attention has been paid to the systematic engagement of parents. The bulk of the efforts in reducing group achievement differences have been directed at process reforms in schools to the exclusion of parents and families. The goals of this research are to test and evaluate a program for parents that will reduce the achievement gap of adolescents who are failing or nearly failing academic classes yet exhibit average or higher intelligence.

### ***A Parent's Guide to Youth Suicide (2008-2009)***

When an adolescent attempts suicide, the impact on the family is pronounced. Parents are often at a loss, siblings don't know how to respond, and the very structure of the family is challenged. Unfortunately, treatment programs for suicide attempters often exclude parents and other family members. Most treatment protocols for those that have attempted suicide are range from drug therapy to psychotherapy. Unfortunately, there appears to be a pattern of

***Forecasting Athletic and Academic Performance: An Examination of Parent Child Interactions (2008)***

Using junior golf as the vehicle for examining the effects of parent child interactions, we are working with several national junior golf associations on gathering parent and child data on the perception of children's athletic and academic performance. We are attempting to identify and predict patterns of behavior and interactions which lead to positive success and which interactions are detrimental to a child's success. Initial indications suggest that parents may inadvertently provide inappropriate feedback to their children and produce the opposite of intended effects.

### **Journey to Jordan (2006- Ongoing)**

This project is examining the role of the school counselor in providing access to the full range of services to students and if LEP students have comparable access to these services. A training model is being developed to determine how to improve learning climate for LEP students.

***Assessing Foreign Trained Math and Science Teachers for Teaching in U.S. Schools (1998-1999)***

A funded project to consider if there are variables that may be used to predict teacher success for teachers trained in non-U.S. teacher training institutions. Collaborators include faculty from U.S., England, and Scotland with projected expansion to Mexico, China, and other far east universities.
