Who's Calling?

For six seasons during the late '70s, James Garner played private investigator Jim Rockford in "The Rockford Files." Each week, driving all over Los Angeles, he tackled a different crime or mystery, and through ingenuity and persistence solved it. Rockford was quick - witted and handsome, and one of the instruments of his glamour was his car phone. Up and down busy streets and highways he drove, chasing crooks and leads, and he maintained his mobility with his constantly-used phone.

Back then, how cool we thought it would be to have a mobile phone! No more looking for a phone booth or being tied to a landline; wherever we went, our phone would enable us to make and receive calls and, chasing crooks or carrying kids to soccer, we could multi task and make the most of our time.

Well, in the way that technology does, reality caught up to fantasy, though not

in quite the way we imagined. Starting in the early 1980s, mobile phone networks were created, phone makers innovated, features multiplied, so that by 2014 there were seven billion mobile phone subscriptions, enough for every person on earth. Service got better, phone features and quality improved, and by the time I moved to Grand Rapids from Big Rapids in 2014, I enthusiastically joined millions who had abandoned landlines altogether and could be contacted only by cell phone.

Of course, the cell is not just a phone. It's a computer, a camera, a document storage device, and a means of getting to the web. It makes our lives easier in countless ways, and when we doubt that, all we have to do is to lose connectivity for a few hours. Suddenly our lives are crippled, and we are limited to what is in our immediate vicinity.

But the cell has one feature we have learned to be careful about - the telephone. As robocalls, phishing, and fraud have proliferated, and criminals have pioneered ingenious new ways to take advantage of us, we have got into the habit of answering the phone only if we recognize the number. In fact, while I was finishing this column (on my computer!), my phone rang and a number appeared on the screen. I didn't recognize it and declined the call, figuring that if it was really important, the caller

would leave a message. (They didn't. Probably wanted to sell me an extended warranty on my car.) Otherwise, why buy trouble?


Something else most of us have noticed is that, along with the ability to reach out to someone no matter where they are, we can also be reached by someone anywhere we are –unless we're on an aircraft. Constantly being in touch is very wearing and has eroded the barrier between work and the rest of our lives. Like Greta Garbo, sometimes we just want to be alone. It's great to have Jim Rockford's glamorous bit of fiction come to life, but, as is usually the case, the real thing has turned out to have some features we hadn't anticipated and have had to learn to live with.

FSUEA Scholarship Endowment Update

Thanks to the generosity of our fellow emeriti, as of September 26, 2019, the FSUEA Scholarship fund contained \$96,883 in donations and accrued interest. We awarded our third annual \$1,000 scholarship to Mollie Kidner, a student in the College of Education and Human Services. To be eligible for an award from our endowment, a student must be a returning undergraduate Ferris student (in any college or department, including Kendall College of Art and Design) who demonstrates financial need (as determined by the Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid) and who has a minimum GPA of 3.25. We are awarding scholarships to students in the undergraduate colleges in alphabetical order. Next year, we will award a scholarship to a student in the College of Engineering Technology. Earlier this year, the Emeriti Board voted unanimously to add Kendall College of Art and Design to our list of undergraduate colleges, bringing the number to six. Our stretch goal is to get enough money in the fund (\$150,000) to grant a \$1,000 award to a student in each of the six undergraduate colleges every year. The matching program goes through June 30, 2023 so we are in sight of our goal. In pursuit of this goal, we are once again conducting our annual "bucket campaign" the first two weeks in December. The donations we get will be bundled to meet the \$1,000 minimum necessary to get a match from the Ferris Futures Challenge fund. Dickinson Family Donates Needlework To FLITE

Emeriti Association member Ray Dickinson's career spanned 38 years at the FSU library. While at Ferris, Ray served on the Academic Senate, worked with the Honors Program, served on numerous university-wide committees and advised the Alpha Phi Omega social fraternity as well as the national leadership honors society Omicron Delta Kappa. He loved working with students as a research librarian, but his passion was serving as a patent librarian, working with over 2,500 patent seekers in the region. Ray retired in 2006 and passed away in March of 2019.

Many members of the Ferris community were aware of Ray's talent for needlework. Over the years, Ray created a prolific array of cross stitch and needlepoint pieces, including a replica of Jean Honoré Fragonard's "Young Girl Reading" painting. In August of 2019, Ray's family donated this piece to FLITE in his memory.
