NURS 621 Advanced Physical Assessment,
Pathophysiology, & Pharmacotherapies

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is designed for master's level nursing students to expand their knowledge and skills in health and physical assessment, pathophysiology, and pharmacotherapeutics, which will provide an advanced foundation for clinical assessment, decision-making, and patient management. The intent is to develop a thorough understanding of the patient's condition in order to guide novice nursing students in their learning and advance nursing practice.

3 credits = 45 hours / semester

Pre-requisite: NURS 501 Introduction to Advanced Nursing

COURSE OUTCOMES:

- Appraise factors that influence the disease process, utilize advanced critical thinking skills that correlate the abnormal functions body systems with disease process and the clinical manifestations associated with the disease, and integrate current evidence-based knowledge into care of patients within selected disease states. (Theoretical Base for Practice; Specialty Leadership Role Practice; Scholarship for Practice)
 Assessment Method: Case Study, Discussions
- Demonstrate application of pharmacology, pharmacotherapeutic, assessment, and pathophysiologic principles. (Specialty Leadership Role Practice)
 Assessment Method: Concept Paper and Presentation
- 3. Refine health and physical assessment skills through differentiation, interpretation, and documentation of normal and abnormal findings. (Specialty Leadership Role Practice)
