

Articulation Agreement

Ferris State University
AND

All State-Approved Career and Technical Education Programs in Michigan

The purpose of this agreement is to facilitate the transition of students from high school and/or Career and Technical Education (CTE) program to **Ferris State University**. Program is offered at all State-Approved Career and Technical Education Programs in Michigan.

General Conditions & Requirements

1. Application for Articulated Credit must be received within two years of the student's high school graduation.
2. The [FerrisNow Secondary Articulated Credit Application](#) will be completed and submitted by the high school/tech center representative. All supporting documentation will be submitted to FerrisNow@ferris.edu. Exceptions to this condition must be approved by the Office of Transfer and Secondary School Partnership.
3. Student must earn a "B" or higher in the applicable CTE program to be eligible for articulated credit and appropriate certification(s).
4. To earn credit for AUTO 112, student must present current ASE entry-level certification test with a minimum score of 32 of ASE Professional Certification in Brakes.
5. To earn credit for AUTO 113, student must present current ASE entry-level certification test with a minimum score of 32 or ASE Professional Certification in Electrical.
6. To earn credit for AUTO 114, student must present current ASE entry-level certification test with a minimum score of 32 or ASE Professional Certification in Engine Repair.
7. To earn credit for AUTO 115, student must present current ASE entry-level certification test with a score of 32 of ASE Professional Certification in Steering and Suspension.
8. Automotive program must be NATEF certified and be teaching to the NATEF MAST level in each area that is articulated.
9. School must submit documentation that certification area is being taught at MAST level.
