- Draft External Advisory Board Bylaws

RSS does not have alumni nor employers. However, integrative studies may be moving into RSS/University College and that may impact representation.

Should UGEC be the authorizer of an advisory board? Do we need an authorizer?

Maybe we can make this less formal. Do we need full bylaws? This feels bigger and more formal than it needs to be. Instead we might consider something more like a purpose statement.

Concern – we set something up that might promote academic affairs. This is supposed to be a shared governance body.

The board is more like a focus group than a committee.

The purpose statement could include guidelines for how this body operates, such as membership and appointments.

Purposes can include ways to solicit support gen ed – make members aware of what we do in gen ed, and could participate in those courses. This also could make alumni and employers aware of other facets of the student body. What is happening in industry that will allow us to make our gen eds more robust for our graduates.

They can also provide perspectives about questions we have had in the past, such as what constitutes communication, what constitutes writing in the discipline, etc.

Next step: revise into a less formal purpose statement and bring back to UGFC for further discussion
