4. Gen Ed assessment (Katie Kalata)

The new system is taking time as IT is working with Helio to implement and import documents (Banner is particularly challenging). They are finding bugs and need to do some coding to fix it.

We are in the second phase of integration; it should be a matter of weeks before we are ready to do some training with a live system.

We will use a train-the-trainer model. We need to find who will do the earlier training and can go back to their colleges to perform training.

Second: we need a process in place for GE and want to have something in our 4-year HLC report. Suggestion: have a mapping of GE outcomes in terms of statements with courses in our system. But we don't have the FLOs. So maybe just get mapping to the outcomes into Helio system so that the link is available. We can do this without faculty. In order to get FLO's to connect to classroom activities, we need faculty.

Once connected, we will have to inform faculty that this is coming and that they will be trained on what to do with it. They won't do anything with it until they are trained. Announcement should go out well before end of term.
