Lead by assessment experts George Kuh, Stan Ikenberry, Peter Ewell, Pat Hutchings and others, the NILOA project provides *free* online access to a plethora of assessment resources, including:

- Assessment Briefs: informative guides for the practical use of assessment evidence to targeted audiences (e.g. faculty, student affairs professionals, university leadership) AND a list of the top 20 assessment scholarly journals with a succinct description of the focus of each
- Examples of Good Assessment Practice: case studies from U.S. institutions recognized for their "good work" in assessment practices and data-driven improvements
- Measuring Quality: an online inventory of 250 assessment instruments, benchmarking tools, software platforms and projects, compiled by NILOA, the American Council on Education (ACE), and the Association for Institutional Research (AIR)
- NILOA Reports: research projects and national surveys to examine student learning outcomes across U.S. institutions
- Occasional Papers: publications to address contemporary issues and emerging assessment practices
- Resource Library: a searchable database of assessment related articles, presentations, reports, books and websites
