# Fiscal Scorecards 2021-2022 School Year

At November or December board meetings, field representatives will be presenting each academy board with a fiscal scorecard based on audited financial information. The scorecard reports on six Key Performance Indicators (KPIs):

- Current Ratio. Answering the question: Can the school pay its short-term obligations?
- Change in Fund Balance. Answering the question: Is the school operating within its means?
- Days Cash on Hand. Answering the question: Does the school have the cash available to pay bills?
- Enrolment Change. (Over 3 Years). Answering the question: Is the school's main revenue source stable over time?
- *Debt to Asset Ratio*. Answering the question: Does the school own more in assets than it owes in liabilities?
- *Current Year Enrollment Change*. Answering the question: Is the school's current year enrollment stable?


A school will either meet each KPI or not based on a formula. Using scores on each KPI, schools are placed into one of three tiers depending on the outcome of the KPIs:

- Fiscally Stable.
- Identified for Review.
- Fiscal Concern.
