3. AD Report: Perk W.: (Via Sara) - GLIAC BB OCR Complaint Review- Currently in the OCR review (info gathering stage). Subcommittees will be meeting very soon to review information gathered this past year. Report due to OCR by March 2018. Report will be submitted to FSU Admin in January. We have contracted with a sport lawyer to assist. FSU will have one year to address any concerns that are received from the OCR following feedback on the report. FSU has decided to have men's bb play the first time slot this year and alternate each following year.

We just submitted our report on equity in sport. Our past numbers have trended in the right direction and we believe this will provide evidence for the OCR report as well.

We are still working out the process for training for players, coaches and AD's for the sexual awareness program. This is due by March 15th.

There was discussion as to who additionally need to participate in the training. Will the AAC committee need to participate as well?

Time study update- Nick S., Sara, Jean, and Perk have met numerous times and have decided to move forward with the NCAA instrument (~90 questions). This will be paired down. Sara would like to move the study to the committee for approval by our next scheduled meeting. We want to provide this to all student athletes and we may try to conduct this either at a common gathering time or perhaps electronically. Additionally, there is interest in investigating missed class time due to league game travel, etc. Sarah will be sending something to this group in the next week with opportunity for feedback. Following the January meeting of the AAC liaisons will more than likely need to begin to make our teams aware that this will be coming in the near future.

MBB/WBB: Jean is open to having another member who would be willing to assist her with the teams. Andrew W. volunteered to switch his assignment from football to MBB.

The basketball season is just beginning. The men's team is picked as #9 in the national pre-season poll. The team is in Evansville the first weekend of November for the Hall of Fame Classic. The women's team has been picked to be #4 in GLIAC poll. The team started the season with a Tip-Off Dinner that was very successful with over 100 people attending. The women won their first

exhibition game 81 to 44. We are looking forward to a great season for both the men and women's teams.

Cross Country: Ferris had four All-GLIAC honorees (two men and two women) at the GLIAC Conference Championships on October 21st. For the men, Trevor Holowaty came in 9th overall and Damien Halverson was 15th. For the women, Kathryn Etelamaki took 10th place and Natalie Perry was 20th overall. Ferris men had 5 runners finish in the top 50 and the women had 7 in the top 50. The team is headed to the NCAA Midwest Regional in Cedarville, Ohio this weekend

Hockey: Hockey has started off slower than they like, but knowing that getting back to home ice for a while will help. The team has already had many road trips and are welcoming some time back in front of the FSU fans. The coaches and team are also discussing a potential event with the Area 5 Special Olympics athletes similar to what the basketball team has done in the past. Stay tuned for more details!

Soccer: We're actually still going as we have a small chance of making the national tournament! A lot of things have to happen but if a couple results this weekend (starting tomorrow), we could end up playing next Friday in the NCAA tournament for the 1st time in program history. Aside from that, we won the United Soccer Coaches team academic award for the 6th consecutive season, finished 3rd in the league for the 2nd highest league finish in program history.

We also had an athlete of the week, and we know we have five representatives on the all league teams. Where those five were placed on the all league teams will be officially announced tomorrow at 11am. Should we not make the NCAA tournament, we will be volunteering at the Riverview Elementary's Science Sharing night next Thursday!

Volleyball: Women's volleyball is currently in first place in the GLIAC with a conference record of 10-2 and an overall record of 17-6. Of their six losses, two losses to #4 ranked Lewis University in Illinois and one loss to #2 ranked Southwest Minnesota State. The Bulldog spikers currently ranked #18 in the nation, the highest ranking of any GLIAC school. The Lady Bulldogs are also #6 in the Midwest Regional Rankings. Additional comment is that 2016 FSU Alumnae Megan Vander Meer has started her pro volleyball career in the Czech Republic.

Softball: Nothing but positives from the women about their new coach Kristin Janes. My concern is that she asked them to block 1-5 daily for practices in spring, which is virtually impossible to do and have them take the courses required for their programs. Of course, game schedules are something we faculty try to work around. Softball is especially tricky because of Michigan weather and the desire to get as many games in as possible before regionals in May.

Perhaps a gentle hint to coaches about the challenges of scheduling courses and practices here at Ferris would be in order? Reminder: they are students first.

Tennis: Men's Tennis- off season. Women's Tennis- GLIAC Tournament went in ranked 7^{th} , finished 7^{th} place. Finished season 4-6. Since the start of the semester, I haven't heard anything from the coach or players as far as support they are missing that I can provide.

ATHLETIC ADVISORY COMMITTEE

MISSION STATEMENT: The mission of Ferris State University's Athletic Advisory Committee (AAC) is "to

promote an environment for Ferris State University student-athletes, coaches, faculty, and staff that maximizes student-athlete success in academics and athletics and strengthens their contributions to campus and community life."

ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

The Athletic Advisory Committee is a joint University-wide committee that will meet regularly and provide advice to the Academic Senate, Director of Athletics, Vice President(s) and President. The Athletic Advisory Committee can play a significant role in documenting institutional control over athletics. It should receive and review copies of the Athletics Compliance Manual and Operating Procedures Manual once they are developed. It should also review a Student-Athlete Handbook, once it is developed, and review financial audits annually.

The Athletic Advisory Committee can also play a role by reviewing the athletics budget, sports configuration, gender equity Title IX reports, the annual financial audit, Equity in Athletics Disclosure Act (EADA) submissions, graduation, academic progress and persistence rate reports, injury surveillance reports, medical hardship waiver requests, a summary of rules violations reported and a summary of any student-athlete reinstatement requests, summary statements from student-athlete exit interviews, personal conduct reports of student-athletes, and other matters pertaining to athletic programs and personnel. As an outcome the Athletic Advisory Committee can provide comment regarding observations they discern from an objective review of the information.

The Athletic Advisory Committee will also facilitate communication and cooperation between the athletics program and the general Ferris State University community (students, staff, faculty, administration). The committee will be informed of schedules for athletics events, team practice schedules, study table schedules, and contact information for study table coordinators; approve a system of academic honors and awards for intercollegiate athletes; and oversee the FSU intercollegiate athletic program and FSU academic programs in following rules related to academics and academic faculty as set forth by Ferris State University committees, college athletic conferences to which FSU belongs, and the NCAA, Divisions I and II.

In addition, the committee will assign a faculty member to act as faculty liaison to each coach and intercollegiate athletic team. The liaison will: 1) Assist with communication between coach and faculty; 2) Assist students with issues related to academics, and to the excused absence policy; 3) Attend games and practices, when possible, to develop relationships between faculty and athletics. To this end, faculty members of the Athletic Advisory Committee will receive a Division II pass upon request.
