### WHO WE ARE...

- Founded in 1986 as the Office of Minority Student Affairs, and renamed in 2008 as the Office of Multicultural Student Services (OMSS).
- The OMSS aims to create a welcoming and supportive environment for students of underrepresented backgrounds.
- The OMSS sponsors opportunities that promote the intellectual understanding and appreciation of diversity, inclusion and social justice.

#### 2018-2019 POINTS OF PRIDE

- **2800**<sup>+</sup> Attendees at the 34 events coordinated and/or sponsored by the OMSS this year.
- 2000+ Students visited the OMSS for support and engagement opportunities.
  - 400<sup>+</sup> Students received support from the OMSS i.e. printing, school supplies, and meals.
  - 200+ Students on campus are trained as College Positive Volunteers to act as ambassadors of higher education, exposing youth to college options, resources and materials.
    - Students were recognized for their active participation in the Teaching Others What Establishes Real Success (TOWERS)
      Leadership Development Program, and in the Black Male Empowerment Network (BMEN).
