V. Event Narrative


- a. Tres Vidas would be brought to Ferris as part of the Hispanic Heritage Month, which is celebrated annually, between September 15th and October 15th.

 This musical / theater event portraits the lives of significant Latin American women, and their influence on Latin culture, as well as showcases traditional and folk Latin music by known Hispanic composers.
- **b.** By bringing Tres Vidas to Ferris, we hope to educate the campus/Big Rapids community about Latin history, music, culture, and the lives and accomplishments of Latin America's biggest icons.
- c. This event is related to most Social Awareness and Cultural Enrichment disciplines, including Cultural Spanish, Sociology, History, Music, Theater, Humanities, and Anthropology. After speaking with the Williams Auditorium staff, we also came up with the idea of inviting theater students from Ferris and surrounding schools to watch their rehearsals and participate in a theater workshop with the group, prior to their evening performance.
- d. Tres Vidas would be the closing event for the Hispanic Heritage Month. The tentative date is Wednesday, September 30th 2009, followed by an event discussion and HSO student panel on Thursday, October 1st at 11:00am. (Students from the Hispanic Students Organization and / or Bulldogs unmuzzled will coordinate the event discussion and moderate the student panel).
- e. Targeted audience would be Ferris students, faculty / staff, and the community, since it is an educational event that is appropriate for any audience that is willing to learn about Latin culture and its leaders.
- f. Tres Vidas is a new and different educational event, and few events of this nature and historic significance have been brought to campus before.

 It will be an accomplishment to be able to bring a presentation that showcases the lives of three brilliant Latin American women in a manner that combines, music, theater and educational content as well as this one.
- g. We plan on having evaluations available at the event. Also, we will try to make this a five-star event, and students would be able to fill out five-star evaluations to assess the event.

VI. Budget:

- **b.** Other funds will include a grant from the Finance Division of Student government, donations from the Office of Multicultural Students Services, Enrollment Services, and the Hispanic Students Organization.
- **c.** We are requesting the performance fee amount (\$ 4,000) from the Faculty and Staff Diversity Mini Grant.

"Tres Vidas" (Three Lives) is a live music theatre work for singing actress and trio (cello, piano and percussion), based on the lives of three legendary Latin American women: Mexican painter Frida Kahlo, Argentine poet Alfonsina Storni and Salvadoran peasant-activist Rufina Amaya. The text was written by Chilean scholar and award-winning writer Marjorie Agosin. The music ranges from traditional Mexican folk and Argentine tango songs sung in Spanish to instrumental works by composers such as Astor Piazzolla. The show will tour in September and October, Hispanic Cultural Awareness Month 2009 and in March, Women's History Month, 2010. On (date, time) the Core Ensemble: Tahirah Whittington, cello, Hugh Hinton, piano and Michael Parola, percussion along with featured actress Georgina Corbo, will perform the new chamber music theatre work *Tres Vidas* at (venue).

Tres Vidas celebrates the life, times and work of three significant Latin and South American Women: painter Frida Kahlo of Mexico, peasant activist Rufina Amaya of El Salvador and poet Alfonsina Storni of Argentina. With storylines including Frida Kahlo's dramatic and passionate relationship with painter Diego Rivera, Rufina Amaya's astounding singular survival of the massacre at El Mozote and Alfonsina Storni' life long challenges as Argentina's first great feminist poet, Tres Vidas presents dramatic situations timeless in their emotional appeal and connection to audiences across all gender and ethnic spectrums.

From a script written by Chilean poet/writer Marjorie Agosin, actress **Georgina**Corbo offers powerful portrayals of each woman and includes the singing of traditional Mexican folk songs as well as Argentinean popular and tango songs made famous by Mercedes Sosa and Carlos Gardel. Additional music by Astor Piazzolla, Orlando Garcia, Pablo Ortiz, Alice Gomez, Carlos Sanchez-Gutierrez, Michael DeMurga and Osvaldo Golijov round out the musical score.

Since its inception in 1993, **the Core Ensemble** has toured nationally to every region of the United States and internationally to England, Russia, the Ukraine, Australia and the British Virgin Islands. The Ensemble was the recipient of the 2000 Eugene McDermott Award for Excellence in the Arts awarded by the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and has received support from the State of Florida Department of Cultural Affairs, New England Foundation for the Arts, Palm Beach County Cultural Council, the Aaron Copland Fund for Music and the Virgil Thomson Foundation.

A native of Cuba, actress **Georgina Corbo** is a graduate of the acting program at SUNY Purchase. Her television appearances include: Law & Order and New York Undercover. Her film work includes: It's Always Something. She has appeared onstage in several on/off Broadway productions as well as at the Kennedy Center in Washington D.C and at the Russian International Theatre Festival in St. Petersburg.
