What started out as an ordinary semester turned into a semester very different than all the others. During this unprecedented time, each department in the Student Affairs division was challenged to develop innovative ways to serve and engage both our current students as well as our prospective students. This newsletter illustrates a few of those successes.

Admissions Virtual Events

The **Online Orientation** system is being utilized by all incoming students this summer. To date, 862 freshman and transfer students have completed the online orientation system for main campus. Students looking to complete online orientation should be directed to ferris.edu/orientation. After reviewing the information, there is a link to start the online orientation process and sign-in with their MyFSU/password. Information presented is specific to the student's campus location and student type. The final module of the online orientation contains pertinent information to next steps including when they will be notified to sign up for courses with their college in a one-on-one course advising session and how to sign their housing contract. Within 2 business days, their colleges will be notified of their completion and reach out to set up an appointment for the class registration process. Students are encouraged to continue checking their email as they prepare to be a Bulldog. They'll also continue receiving emails inviting them to participate in upcoming Explore Ferris Live, Admitted Student Live, and New Student Social Hour events!

The **Explore Ferris Live** event, similar to Dawg Days, was held for prospective students to learn about our University including the colleges as well as the Center for Leadership, Activities, and Career Services (CLACS), University Recreation, Office of Multicultural Student Services and the Center for Latino Studies. A total of 50 individuals participated in this lively event.

Admitted Student Alive! events, similar to the Admitted Student Open Houses, have been successful with over 150 students who are admitted for Fall 2020 participating. The following have been featured during these events: Online Orientation, MyFSU, Housing, Dining, Financial Aid and Student ID Cards.

A **Virtual Open House** in collaboration with Extended and International Operations was held in April with 168 prospective students. A total of 31 staff members were available to assist students. This provided a tremendous opportunity for students to drop in and learn about the next steps in the process and explore Ferris further. Students had the opportunity to speak with advising staff from our statewide sites, financial aid and recruitment staff, while also having the ability for an admissions decision on the spot. Many staff members stayed nearly an hour past the originally designated time to assist students.

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New Student Social Hour will debut on June 3. This event will allow incoming students to meet their Fall 2020 Bulldog Classmates. Every social hour will feature different themes and may include: Stay at Home Show and Tell, Let's See Your Pets, Lunch/Dinner with Bulldogs (show us your culinary talents), Create Something, and You're All Bulldogs Now. The use of gallery view and chat will be encouraged so participants can communicate with each other. Students will be given an opportunity to win prizes by answering Ferris trivia questions.

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CareerFestival Professional Development Opportunity for students and alumni

The university's Alumni Association and Ferris' Center for Leadership, Activities and Career Services (CLACS) are collaborating to make the seventh annual Grad CareerFestival program available to all Ferris students and alumni, free of charge, on June 23-26. A specific track presented each day from 11 a.m. to 8 p.m. will feature 72 career authors and coaches.

The daily categories include career management, job skills, advice on what to expect after graduation, and developing soft skills. More than 70 presenters contribute over the course of this conference, in Facebook Live events, TED talks, and webinars that can help participants land a job more quickly, or to develop a career plan.
