The Office of Scholarships & Financial Aid hosted Get Real! On October 2 in University Five-hundred, Center. seventeen students from Ferris State and the local MOISD Career participated in this annual financial awareness event. Event coordinator, Melanie Mulder, indicated that one of her favorite parts of the event is reading student responses to the survey question, "What did you learn from this event?" One student stated "I will say this event was awesome it really gives students a real outlook on life and all of the bills and spending you will have as you "grow up" all of the responsibilities that you will take on in life. M2B4

Enrollment Services is partnering with Morley Stanwood High School in an initiative, referred to as M2B4 (Mohawks to Bulldogs in 4 years). The goal of this initiative is to help improve MSHS student success rates at FSU. Michigan College Access Network indicates that 30% of MSHS students enroll at FSU; however, 40.2% fail to complete. M2B4 committee members Kristen Salomonson, Kathy Lake, Melanie Mulder (chair), Jeff Stewart, Jason Daday, Angela Garrey along with Cheryl Berry, Jamey Nelson and Abby Bush of MSHS are working to identify issues attributing to the low completion rates and take steps to help alleviate the barriers. Initial plans include providing a "College 101" informational night in lieu of parent teacher conferences, a special freshman campus visit and taking the Get Real! financial awareness event to the high school campus. We are hoping that educating parents and students about the importance of continuing education will assist in providing at-risk students with a more supportive foundation for success.

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BULLDOG CONNECT

"There's a Tag for that!"

A popular new event feature in Bulldog Connect is "Tags." This feature entices people to attend an event based on the tag the event planner chooses. Some examples include Free Admission, Free Food, Music, Family Friendly, Giveaways, Five Star, and Bulldog Beginnings.

Tags are easy to use and manipulate! In the <u>Bulldog Connect event calendar</u>, a viewer can click on "Tags," choose the ones they are interested in seeing, and the events quickly populate by the tags that have been chosen. For event planners, choosing a tag is available in the <u>Event Registration Form</u>, and multiple tags can be added to any event.

Tags also provide informational data to event planners and the CLACS staff

when using card swipe or entering attendance into Bulldog Connect. Examples of data points are: attendance by tag, most popular and least popular tag, most popular tag by residence hall, ethnicity, or student type.

- Most popular tag since the platform launch in August has been "Free Admission" with 125 events. For events that captured attendance by card swipe, 4188 students attended an event that used the "free admission" tag.
- Freshman enjoyed Free Admission (36 events attended) and attended a Bulldog Beginnings event (18 events attended).
- There were 2711 unique attendees at the 20 events tagged Bulldog Beginnings where attendance was taken.
- There were 210 unique attendees at the 3 Five Star tagged events this Fall 2019.

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Fall 2019 Career & Internship Fair



The Fall 2019 Career & Internship Fair was held on October 19, 2019 at the Ewigleben Sports Complex. The following are new initiatives and/or highlights from the fair.

- **Innovative Marketing** CLACS contracted with a local painter to paint windows on different buildings, including specific targeting at the Business building to increase attendance from students who are majoring in The Ferris Marketing Business. Team created an event on the Ferris State Facebook page in an effort to reach more people. CLACS also decorated the office into the Career Fair hub where students, faculty, staff, employers could reach out or stop in to ask questions. This new intentionality of marketing was successful in drawing a broader range of students at the Career and Internship fair.
- Increased Engagement at Fair During the Career & Internship Fair, multiple media stands were located throughout the venue that highlighted

- employer information, helpful tips and tricks for students, and upcoming dates for the Spring Career and Internship Fair.
- Increased Alumni Engagement-In the employer's registration, they noted whether or not any of the representatives attending were alumni. Using this data, a team of staff and student employees connected with the alumni present to participate in an alumni photo shoot.
