President's Post



When the World Stops and Everyone Pays Attention

By the time you read this column, the 2020 presidential election will (finally!) be in the recent past, and our attention will be focused elsewhere. But the campaign itself has been so protracted, and so many people have voted, that millions of Americans closely followed the contest down to and beyond election night, until its calling on the Saturday following – four days later. Elections news took all the oxygen out of the room, and we constantly sought updates. Most of us will be able to tell our grandchildren how and when we voted, and where we were when we heard the news that Joe Biden had won.

Even with today's electronic communication resources, it's very rare in America that an event will be so stupendous

that it will have this world - stopping quality. A good indicator of one is how many people remember where they were when it happened.

Additionally, two prerequisites of world - stoppers are rapid communication and a high degree of literacy. So, it is no surprise that the first such event in America was the assassination of Abraham Lincoln on April 14, 1865, five days after Lee's surrender at Appomattox. All over the North, people sought news constantly, and it was provided by the Victorian internet, the telegraph. Church services and public gatherings were organized to mourn the fallen president. And when Lincoln's body, after being viewed in state by over a million people in the Capitol, was transported by rail from Washington to his gravesite in Springfield, Illinois, the route was publicized and seven million mourners gathered along the way to pay their last respects to the fallen president.

From the first half of the twentieth century, I would add to this list only the sinking of the Titanic in 1912, the bombing of Pearl Harbor in 1941, and the death of President Roosevelt

EMERITI ASSOCIATION GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES October 14, 2020

President Doug Haneline called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

Treasurer's report: We currently have approximately \$3,903.24 in our account. The scholarship fund currently has \$119,167.00 book value and \$129,513.52 market value.

Doug Haneline discussed the state of the Emeriti Association:

We have about 748 members. Most (almost 80%) live, at least part time, in Michigan, about half in Mecosta County and 10% I Kent County. About 7% live in Florida.

We have activities in Big Rapids, Arizona, and Florida in a normal year. However; all events in 2020 are cancelled, and none have yet been scheduled for 2021.

We have a Facebook page and web page and we take care of Helen's Garden.

Our Board members are volunteers elected at this meeting.

Bob Carter reported that we have two scholarship recipients this year - Rebecca Morris, a senior in the graphic design program at KCAD and Jacob Schlaud, a senior in the welding engineering technology program in the College of Engineering Technology. Each will receive \$1,000 this year. Our goal was to increase our endowment total to \$125,000 so that we can give one scholarship to each college each year.

MaryKay Maclver reported for Chair, Alice Bandstra, for the Helen's Garden volunteers. Although we were challenged by COVID-19, we were able to gain access to the garden in June and planted annuals provided by the grounds crew at Ferris. A project to revamp the rose bed is delayed until next spring. MaryKay recognized meeting attendees Bob Krueger and Mary Murnik for their volunteer time.

in 1945. From my lifetime (b. 1948), in addition to the 2020 election, I would add just a few other world - stopping events: the assassinations in 1963 and 1968 of John F. Kennedy, Martin Luther King, and Robert Kennedy, the moon landing in 1969, the explosion of the space shuttle Challenger in 1986, and the terrorist hijacking attacks on 9/11 in 2001.

The details of each of these events remain clear in memory. I was in eighth period study hall in high school when JFK was killed. I was visiting my sister in Washington DC when King was killed, and from a hill overlooking the Capitol, I watched rioters burn Washington. I saw the moon landing on television in a bar on my night off in July 1969, and I was teaching MLA documentation to two classes of English 250 students when the towers were hit by hijacked airliners in 2001.

In a world of billions of people and over 200 countries, so much competes for our notice that most of it becomes background noise, but at unpredictable intervals something happens that commands the attention of all. What world - stopping events do you remember, fellow emeriti, and where were you when they happened?
