We were heavily imbedded with this class of 21 for four full academic years. We got to know each other very well, and I feel that I am a part of this class. We went though a lot together in those first few years: a governor's veto of our funds, a fight for national accreditation, and academic and clinical facility issues. 

# **Emeriti Endowment News**

As of May 31, 2022, our endowment had a book value of \$157,857.00, and as of December 31, 2021, the market value was \$214,734.81. This past year, we were able to give a \$1,000 award to a student in each of the five undergraduate programs at FSU (including KCAD). A big "thank you" to all the people who have donated to our endowment. In the coming years, we will have to decide to give out more awards or increase the amount of each award. It will be a good problem to have. To be eligible for an award from our endowment, a student must be a returning undergraduate Ferris student (in any college or department, including KCAD) who demonstrates financial need (as determined by the Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid) and who has a minimum GPA of 3.25. The Ferris Futures matching program has been extended to December, 2024 so any money donated to our endowment will be doubled by the match up until this date. Our primary fund raising effort is our annual holiday "bucket" campaign conducted in early December, but any donations given to this fund anytime during the year will be matched by the University. If you have to take a required minimum distribution (RMD) from any retirement account that you own, you can transfer money from that account to this endowment without any tax implications. If you are so inclined, please write a check to the Ferris Foundation with the words Ferris Emeriti Scholarship Endowment in the memo line, and mail it to the address below.
