This process occurs every six years and is another formative time of reflection and review through the academic senate at Ferris. The faculty were pleased to again receive a recommendation of: "continue, with enhancement" for the TDMP program.

Speaking of curriculum, and in response to valuable feedback received from alumni working in the engineering field, TDMP faculty worked with the Michigan Association of Broadcasters, and several programs across Ferris State, to develop a new Broadcast Engineering Minor. The new Center for Virtual Learning building is amazing, and our pending move this summer is eagerly anticipated! PRODUCING MYSTIC MICHIGAN

As most of our readers will know, hands-on learning is a core component of our program. This fall students got that, and much more when they collaborated with Mark Jager, the author of the Mystic Michigan book series to produce a new episode of his show. The previous episodes were produced by Mark Boardman, a creator in Cadillac who has previously worked with TDMP interns. When he was unable to produce the next episode, Jager approached our team to see if we were willing to take on the challenge. After our group of students agreed, the production of the episode called "The Rocks Cry Out" began. The episode aptly features the story of geological formations throughout Mackinac Island, Ishpeming (Jasper Knob), and Pictured Rocks.

Over four weeks, the 14 students in TDMP 466 – Instructional Design collaborated with Jager to plan two major trips to both Mackinac Island and the Upper Peninsula. Then starting in October, a team of six students trekked eight miles across Mackinac Island to capture footage across the island including permitted drone footage of Arch Rock. Then, at the end of October, just four days



after a major snowstorm dropped a foot of snow on Ishpeming, a group of 9 students made their way to Jasper Knob, Marquette, and Pictured Rocks. One team captured footage of the rocks via boat, another made their way to Miner's Castle, and the final team hiked a total of 11.2 miles to Grand Portal Pointe and back.

After editing nearly two terabytes of footage (all shot in 4K), and many late nights/mornings in the lab, students screened their film on December 8 to a packed auditorium and much applause. The film is a testament to the creativity, initiative, and dedication of our students:
