

## Qualification Policy for Nuclear Medicine

2026-2027

Each of our academic programs has specific classes, grades, and GPA requirements which a student must meet to apply for the clinical phase of the program.

- All qualifying Math & Science courses must be met in two attempts. Any transfer courses equivalent to the FSU requirement is counted as an attempt.
- Unsuccessful attempts include not meeting the grade requirement listed below, receiving a “W” (withdrawal), or a grade of “I” (incomplete) not converted to the required grade or higher by the end of the next semester.
- Prerequisite courses like CHEM 103, ENGL 074, MATH 010 or MATH 110 are not tied to the grade or attempt requirement.
  - *Example: A student needs to take MATH 110 prior to taking MATH 115 and earns a C-. The grade for MATH 110 does not count as an unsuccessful attempt to qualify for the nuclear medicine program.*
- Qualified students must apply each February during the designated 15-day application window. Students not accepted must reapply in future cycles.
- Placement into the clinical portion of the program is based on the following:
  1. Qualification semester (when required courses are completed).
  2. Number of earned Ferris credits
  3. Overall (GPA)
- **\*\*Students who complete qualifying requirements earlier receive priority for placement.\*\***
- Up to 25% of available seats may be reserved for transfer students who qualify during the spring semester before the program begins.
- A student’s program of study must be declared prior to or during your qualifying semester.

\*\*Qualification semester may not be earlier than the first-time students declared nuclear medicine as their major\*\*

### **NUCLEAR MEDICINE ADMISSION POLICY:**

- The following qualifiers must be met for the student to apply to the program:
  - MATH 115 -Intermediate Algebra, equivalency must be complete with a C grade or higher or proficiency (Math SAT of 580 or higher)
  - ENGL 150 – English 1, must be completed with a C- or higher
  - COMM 105 (Interpersonal Communication) or COMM 221 (Small Group Decision Making), or COMM 121 (Public Speaking), must be completed with a C or higher
  - COHP 100 – Medical Vocabulary, must be completed with a C or higher
  - PHYS 130- Concepts in Physics, must be completed with a C or higher
  - BIOL 251 - Human Anatomy, must be completed with a C or higher
  - BIOL 252 - Human Physiology, must be completed with a C or higher
  - CHEM 114 - Introduction to General Chemistry, must be completed with a C or higher
  - Cultural Enrichment Elective (3 credits) must be completed with a C or higher
  - Overall 2.5 GPA required to start the program

The clinical application opens only once a year for the upcoming academic year. The application window begins the first Monday in February and remains open for exactly 15 days. To keep your qualification for the semester, you must maintain the required GPA. Please note that we do not maintain a waitlist; if you are not accepted, you must reapply to both FSU and your specific program the following year for future consideration.

Once a student is accepted in the clinical program, they will have a new set of standards set for the clinical classes.
